Vehicle Registration Colour / Make / Model Exact Location Period of time that vehicle has not been moved* Name and Contact Number


The Council will arrange to investigate the matter.



Events For Older People

Following a series of successful Information Event for over 55s in in 2022 and 2023, a similar event took place recently in Sutton. Information and advice on services and activities for older people in their area was available. This included information on safety from An Garda Siochana and Dublin Fire Brigade, as well as how technology can improve safety in the home.

> **Crime Prevention Talks in Swords.** Sergeant Stephen Kenny provided information on crime prevention to Swords Men's Shed in October and to the Women's Shed in November. Sgt Kenny gave an informative presentation to approx. 30 members of each group, covering internet and phone safety, home protection and personal safety. Practical solutions for home security and burglary prevention were discussed, in an effort to reduce the risk and impact of crime on people and their property.





Intergenerational Projects



Cricket4All comprises of adapted cricket and table cricket suitable for all abilities. This project provides coaching to young people with disabilities and older people in various locations throughout Fingal. The aim is to provide opportunities for these two groups who often experience disadvantage and isolation, to engage in a sporting activity. Participants in Fingal C4A will soon know whether they have been selected to represent Leinster at an international table cricket competition.





A Cross Border Intergenerational Project is taking place in Balbriggan and Mayobridge Newry. The aim is to develop an understanding of younger and older people through engaging in mutually agreed and beneficial projects. The project encourages engagement between young and old, with the potential to tackle anti-social behaviour, reduce fear of crime among older people and enhance relationships between older and newer residents. The Balbriggan Group (BIPs) have identified the lack of safe spaces for people of all ages, particularly those with hidden disabilities, and are looking at possible solutions to this issue.

Intercultural Masterclasses

Three Intercultural Masterclasses; Cultural Awareness, Inclusive Language and Bystander took place to raise awareness on topics discussed. Local residents, groups and organisations participated. We also hosted Cultural Awareness Masterclass for Local Authority Staff.

Fingal Inclusion Week 2023

The fifth Fingal Inclusion Week took place from 13th to 19th of November. 78 events took place across the County. Fingal Inclusion week is an initiative of Fingal County Council Community Development Office who work in partnership with the Fingal Integration Team with the aim to highlight the positive work that communities, agencies, and other organisations carry out to reduce social exclusion and poverty in Fingal.

Activities Funding to Support Community Events



Summer Projects Funding

A total of €57,720 was approved across 34 summer projects to groups within the community and voluntary sector to provide a supervised programme of recreational and educational activities for young people from June to August. Approx 2275 children participated.

Participating projects undertaking to host a fun recreational activity for young people at Halloween <u>are also required to incorporate a stay safe</u> <u>element within their project</u>.

Teen Library Exercise Survey

The Teen Library Exercise Survey was launched in Balbriggan, Blanchardstown and Malahide Libraries. The survey is a brief questionnaire aimed at gathering insights and preferences of teenagers regarding exercise and physical activities available to them in the library.

The aim is to understand how we can better support teenagers and offer some respite during study periods in the library.

The outcome of the survey is to develop a physical activity programme that caters to the needs of teen library users, with the intention of it being introduced in February 2024.
