Can I fly a Drone in a Park?

You must have permission to fly a drone in a park or open space and you must follow the requirements of the Irish Aviation Authority. www.jaa.je.

'No Drone Zone'

Certain parts of Fingal are in a 'No Drone Zone' as drones can be dangerous and an intrusion for other park users.





Can I Barbecue in a Park?

Yes but only in certain parks and in special areas provided for this purpose. Visit www.fingal.ie to find out which parks provide this amenity.

Do I need permission to organise an activity or an event in a park or open space?

We are proud to support and facilitate many varied activities in our parks. In order to protect the parks and the interests of all users, the following activities require written permission:

- · Trading or other commercial activity
- Events (if you would like to organise an event in one of our parks or open spaces you should refer to the Councils Events Guidelines which may be viewed online www.fingal.ie)
- · Advertising of goods or services
- · Public Meetings
- · Foraging e.g. picking fruit, mushrooms, flowers etc.

The following activities are prohibited in our parks and open spaces







Throwing litter







Drinking alcohol

Where Can I Cycle My Bicycle?

Wide paths (2.5 metres and wider) are generally suitable for shared use by pedestrians and cyclists unless otherwise indicated.

Please cycle responsibly, give way to pedestrians and observe local signage.





The following maps show the 'Dog off leash areas' in Fingal's Regional Parks. These are currently being developed and will be signposted locally.








