1. Welcome & Introductions

Mr. K. Halpenny welcomed the new Community members to the meeting and there was a round table introduction.

2. Minutes of meeting held on the 27th October 2016

The minutes of the meeting which were circulated at the meeting were discussed. Mr. K. Halpenny went through the minutes for the benefit of the new members drawing their attention to the Standing Orders & Ground Rules and Terms of Reference which were circulated to the members at the meeting. It was noted that the Standing Orders & Ground Rules and Terms of Reference had been agreed at the first meeting. It was agreed to discuss a more suitable day of the month for future meetings later in the meeting.

The members discussed the Terms of Reference, noting the following:

- Flooding and Coastal Erosion issues for Fingal has not been formally recorded prior to this and there is a need to accurately identify and record the issues.
- There is a need to develop a systematic approach to address, review and research the issues and to also take into account that there will be limitations e.g. legislation and remits, etc.

- The need for comprehensive research and consultation with local communities before preparing plans to address the issues.
- There is significant funding available to address the issues but clear and well researched plans will be required to successfully access funding.

3. Report on National Audit/Overview of Policies/Objectives in relation to Coastal Erosion and Flooding Issues

A Process for Addressing Coastal Erosion Policy Deficiencies document was circulated at the meeting.

Mr. H. Visser told the meeting that the County & City Managers Association (CCMA) are auditing all Coastal Counties (19). This Audit will lead to the formation of a National Policy to address these issues clearly and consistently.

Case Studies will be compiled and used to show where there are inconsistencies, areas of best practice, lessons learnt, etc. which will then inform the development of a national policy.

A proposed outcome from this Audit is to hold a Conference which will look at how other countries address similar issues.

The Members AGREED to make a 10 minute presentation for each of the areas they represent at the next meeting. Maps of Fingal will be provided to so that areas with issues can be identified. Members will detail the issues that affect these areas e.g. flooding risk, erosion, possible damage to/loss of house/s, what weather conditions cause different/more damaging outcomes, etc.

Mr. K. Halpenny thanked the Members for the informative and productive discussion at the meeting.
