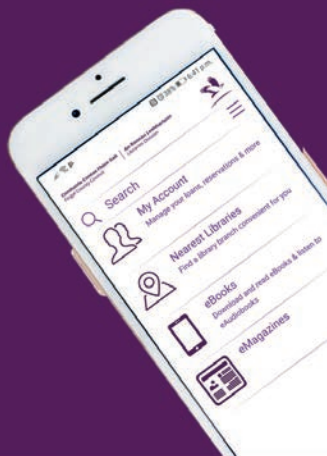

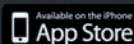

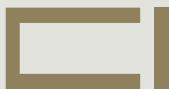

Workshop Four: Decorating your Wigwam - Kids will learn how to decorate their wigwam using wool, string, paint and upcycling techniques.

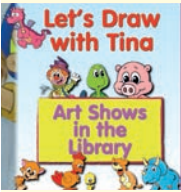
