





Picker Pals is an environmental programme that inspires primary school children to care for their local environment by going on litter-picking adventures, motivated by the Picker Pals song and story world. Picker Pals supports children and their families with a fun, year-round programme of interaction and activities. By motivating real, practical action we are bringing about much needed behavioural change and creating a new generation of young environmentalists.



Following a successful launch in 175 schools and 200 classrooms that brought the programme to nearly five thousand children, Picker Pals is ready to go to the next level as we move towards our goal of running the programme in every primary school in Ireland and around the world. We are seeking funding from public, private and corporate sources to facilitate the development of the Picker Pals programme during the 2021-22 school year.



OUR MISSION

We aim to equip every one of the 3240 primary schools in the country with litter-picking tools, educational content and an active community of litterpickers, until litter and littering become things of the past.



OUR VISION

To facilitate action and bring about behavioural and attitudinal change in children and their families while ridding our outdoor spaces of litter. To create a generation of young environmentalists.

HOW PICKER PALS WORKS

- Picker Pals provides each participating classroom with fun story and activity books, songs and teacher support materials in either Irish or English.
- The Picker Pack contains adult and child litter-picking equipment and safety clothing.
- Each child takes home the Picker Pack and goes on a litter-picking adventure in their local area with their family, reporting back to their classmates.
- All programme material is delivered in upcycled and fully reusable packaging.

• The programme is supported by the popular Picker Pals TV interactive sessions, a variety of competitions and other class and family engagements.

THE PICKER PACK

The Heart of the Picker Pals Programme

- Made from durable, waterproof fabric upcycled from old dinghy sails. These are donated to us by local sailing clubs.
- Manufactured in the Rediscovery Centre in Ballymun, providing employment and training to local people. This fabric, which we are only too happy to divert from landfill, is perfect for our needs.
- Every unique Picker Pack is an important part of the Picker Pals story as we tackle waste head on.

PROGRAMME FEATURES

Rediscovery Centre Upcycled Sails Project

Over 250 Picker Packs for the programme have been made at the Rediscovery Centre fashion workshop contributing to skills training and the circular economy.



Anti-Litter Game

Working with a team at Technical University Dublin (TUD), we have developed an anti-litter and recycling game to help children interact with the issues in a fun and interactive way.





The Picker Pod

The packaging of materials delivered to schools is completely waste free as the colourful Picker Pod transforms into a classroom wall display.



Social Media

During the year we have achieved a 500% increase in social media engagement across Instagram, Facebook, Twitter and YouTube

Competitions and Contests

Fun competitions including environmental quizzes, a pea growing project and a poem and picture competition.

Anti-Litter Talks

Picker Pals has delivered bespoke 40-minute anti-litter talks to schools, teaching children about all aspects of the littering issue and introducing steps the children themselves can take to reuse more, and reduce their level of waste.



Picker Pals TV

Delivered directly to schools via Zoom, Picker Pals TV provides learning and fun, hosting environmental expert guests, puppets, eco tips and educational content. Each show has been viewed by an average of 1200 children.



In order to minimise the risk of infection from Coronavirus COVID-19, Picker Pals need to take the following measures as well as the normal safe litter-picking measures as described in the Picker Pals Safety Information. Government regulations and school policy should always be followed.

At times, it may be necessary to delay litter-picking activity and Picker Pack sharing in accordance with Government and school policy.

Before Picking



The Picker Pack and litter-pickers should be cleaned with disinfectant spray before they leave the school.



Families should use their own gloves where possible. If the gloves and hi-vis vest from the Picker Pack are used, they should be washed before returning them to the school.

While Picking



Picker Pals should maintain social distancing (a 2-metre distance) from people outside their family at all times.



Wear gloves and do not pick up any items of PPE.



Always use the litter-pickers and don't touch anything you pick up.



Dispose of all bags of litter immediately.

After Picking



Parents are asked to use a disinfectant spray on the picker-uppers and Picker Pack after use and before returning it to the school.



Families should wash the gloves and hi-vis vests, if they have been used, before returning them to the school.



There should be a 4-day delay between the return of the Picker Pack to the school and its reissue to another family.
