District Update – Additional information

Operation Irene which commenced on the weekend of 14th of May. This is a targeted Operation to mitigate against anti-social behaviour in open areas, attractions and on all beaches that attract large crowds across the DMR North Division.

The current emphasis will be providing an adequate policing response in the "R" and "J" Districts. The plan will be re-assessed on a weekly basis and additional areas will be added in line with rising crime trends and in line with the needs of the community.

The key objectives are to:-

- Ensure all Covid-19 legislation is complied with;
- Mitigate against anti-social behaviour;
- Combat alcohol consumption in public spaces;
- Combat underage alcohol consumption;
- Reduce public disorder / anti-social behaviour associated with underage alcohol consumption and alcohol consumption in public spaces;
- Reduce alcohol related harm;
- Enhance community safety and confidence;
- Reduce demand for Garda services.
- To establish high visibility in crime hot spots and amenity areas thereby reassuring communities.
- To enhance community safety and confidence.

There is a new Community Policing Program in the J District and it has led to the allocation of 1 Sergeant and 2 Gardaí to Community Policing in Howth and they have Neighbourhood watch schemes in operation in their designated areas, they are all ELO trained and Mountain Bike Operatives. Each member is involved in Community Engagement initiatives throughout the District.



C) On the 10/05 two youths were convicted for an offence of Violent Disorder (Section 15 Public Order Act) following a fully contested hearing at Court 55 during which all witnesses were vigorously cross examined. The incident which occurred at Howth Junction train station on the 1st of April 2021 was widely publicised in the media as shocking CCTV footage made its way into the public domain through an Irish rail source. This footage clearly showed a mob of at least ten youths with bicycles alight from a train and act in an extremely volatile and violent manner towards member of the public in the area. During this incident a young girl who was running for her train was struck by one youth with his bicycle which he was pushing. This assault caused her to lose her balance and fall onto the train track between the stationary Dart and the Platform causing her non-life threatening injuries. During this altercation another young female member of the public was assaulted however uninjured. This case is back in Court for probation reports and sentence.

D) On the 19/05 at Dublin Circuit Court a male pleaded guilty after Members of Clontarf Drugs Unit executed a Section 26 Misuse of Drugs Act Search warrant at Moyclare Close, Baldoyle, Dublin 13 on the 23/06/2021. €46,420 of Cannabis Herb, €1792 worth of Cocaine , €9495 in cash and a Stun gun was seized during the search. The SO was subsequently charged with 2 counts of offences contrary to Sec. 15 MDA , 1 offence contrary to section 7(1)(a)(i), 7(1)(b) & 7(3) of the Criminal Justice (Money Laundering & Terrorist Financing) Act 2010 and Possession of a Firearm(Stun Gun) in relation to this seizure and was sent forward to the Circuit Court where he pleaded guilty to all Charges and received 3 ½ years custodial sentence.
