



This February, Fingal Libraries is organising workshops for children and teens on the issue of internet safety and cyberbullying in partnership with some local schools in Blanchardstown, Swords, and Malahide.

CyberSafeKids is an Irish charity that works to empower children, parents, and educators to navigate the online world in a safe and responsible manner. Blanchardstown, Swords, and Malahide Libraries have invited some classes from local primary and secondary schools to workshops facilitated by CyberSafeKids.

The session for primary school students helps children navigate the online world in a stronger, safer, and smarter way and will cover a broad range of topics including privacy and personal info, social media and gaming and cyberbullying.



The session for secondary school students focuses on how to behave appropriately online, including creating a positive digital footprint, the problem of cyberbullying and the importance of applying critical thinking skills in an environment where image and information is easily manipulated.


