Blanchardstown: Significant Issues.

- Operation Saul / Operation Twin Tracks commenced at the start of the year and involves High Visibility Patrols of Train Stations and Trains with a view to tackling Anti Social Behaviour.
- Operation Tombola 2022 tackled Anti Social Behaviour / public disorder issues in public spaces during the month of October.
- Anti Social Behaviour/ Road Safety issues Maxol M3 / Ballycoolin continues to be monitored by Community Policing, Road Policing Unit and Taskforce.
- <u>Domestic Violence</u> our DAC (Domestic Abuse Coordinator) program is up and running with over 50 case managers trained to support victims within the K District.

Blanchardstown: Significant Crime and Detections

- 29/8/2022 Burglaries Number of Burglaries occurred in the Charnwood area. A male was subsequently apprehended and arrested.
 The made was later charged and is now serving and sentence.
- 20/10/2022 Possession of Drugs for Sale / Supply premises searched by the K District Drugs Unit under warrant. During the course of this search the following was seized - €33,900 Cannabis Herb, €1080 Cocaine, €7000 Cannabis Oil & €2800 Cash. Male at address was arrested, detained, and charged. The matter is currently before the courts.
- 23/10/2022 Burglary A male was arrested, detained and charged with burglary in the Castlecurragh area. The matter is before the courts.

Community Engagement

- Blanchardstown Gardaí continue to support the organisation Little Blue Heroes. H/Garda Caleb Toner dressed up in Uniform for Halloween.
- Community Policing Blanchardstown are continuing to support Sonas Women's Refuge, RCCG, AANI, Coolmine Therapeutic Centre and BLDATF Just to name a few D15 organisations.
- Foróige World Cup / Sports Day Community
 Policing Blanchardstown were delighted to attend
 both events and assist where necessary. A number
 of TAG Programs have also been completed in D15
 with young people attending Foróige.
- Community Policing Blanchardstown are also engaging with Schools and Crèches on request developing relationships with young people in D15.







Ubuntu Initiative

- On 8th and 9th September 2022, <u>Dr. lan Marder</u>, (Maynooth University <u>School of Law and Criminology</u>) co-facilitated a dialogue process in Dublin West, in collaboration with community members and Gardaí. Their goal was to explore the extent to which restorative practices could be used to facilitate dialogue and build understanding between young Black adults who live, and Gardaí who work, in D15.
- Six young Black adults and six Gardaí participated in the dialogue process. Over two days, participants engaged in a variety of discussions and other activities.
- The UBUNTU Project is funded by the Irish Research Council New Foundations scheme, and has obtained ethical approval from the Maynooth University Social Research Ethics Subcommittee.
