How to report an Abandoned Car

To report an abandoned vehicle please contact <u>Environment@Fingal.ie</u> providing the following details:

Vehicle Registration Colour / Make / Model Exact Location Period of time that vehicle has not been moved* Name and Contact Number

The Council will arrange to investigate the matter.

If the vehicle is deemed to be abandoned the Council will then follow a procedure of issuing notifications to the registered owner.

The process from initial inspection to removal can take up to **3 months**. *Please note that a vehicle must not have moved for a significant period of time for consideration under this policy. **(up to 6 weeks)**



Vehicles which are NOT deemed to be Abandoned

- Vehicles poorly parked
- Vehicles involved in residential parking disputes
- Broken down vehicles
- Vehicles on public roads which are causing obstruction or road safety hazard should be reported to the Gardai.
- While a vehicle with no tax or insurance may be an indicator that a vehicle is abandoned, the issue of no tax or insurance on a vehicle on a public road does not automatically deem a vehicle abandoned. Having no Tax or Insurance on a public road is a matter for <u>the Gardai</u> and does not fall under the remit of Fingal County Council.
- Vehicles in estates which are owned by persons resident in the estate will not be deemed abandoned.
- Vehicles on Private Lands or Private Estates will not be deemed abandoned.
- Any vehicles registered outside of the Rep of Ireland should be referred to <u>the</u> <u>Gardai</u>.



Process

- Litter warden will call out and take photo of vehicle/tax/insurance
- Seek information on the Last Registered Owner from the Motor Tax office
- Email vehicle registration(s) to Gardai to see if it is of "interest to them"
- First letter is then sent by normal post and registered post to the LRO requesting car to be removed with 14 days and details of Authorised Treatment Facilities are also given
- If no response received within 2 weeks a reminder letter is sent by normal and registered post to the LRO. This is followed up 14 days later with a final notice whereby the LRO is notified that failure to remove the vehicle within 14 days the vehicle will then become the property of Fingal County Council.
- After this period the vehicle registration is posted on Fingal County Council's website of our attention to remove vehicle from the location.
- Vehicle is removed to our Authorised Treatment Facilty for disposal 10 days after being collected and treated in an Environmentally friendly manner (removal of battery, liquefied gas tank, potential explosive parts inc. air bags, removing/collecting and storing fuel, oils and other fluids, removing any parts containing mercury) All other parts of the car should where possible be recycled

Parked less than 6 weeks	Not deemed abandoned
Registered outside Republic of Ireland	Not investigated
Reported cars located in Dublin City Council jurisdiction	Not investigated
Estate not taken in charge by Fingal County Council	Not investigated
Valid tax and owner lives in estate	Not deemed abandoned
Vehicle in different location when litter warden carries out final inspection	Not deemed abandoned



There were a total of 383 vehicles reported to the Environment Department in 2022.

33 of the reported vehicles were deemed to be abandoned following our investigations and correspondence to the Last Registered Owners. Final inspections by our Litter Wardens were carried out before the vehicles were removed, 20 of which were not in-situ and no longer deemed abandoned therefore leaving 13 still abandoned and subsequently removed.

Youth Initiatives:

- Fingal Comhairle na nÓg development of Service Level Agreement for the coordination over 3 years of a youth council representing the voice of 12 18 year-olds living in Fingal
- SAMH: Donabate, Balbriggan, Malahide & Swords meet quarterly. Students participating in Planet Youth have presented the findings of their research on addiction among their peers. Research on the prevalence of alcohol abuse and vaping among youth and self- harm among young people
- Swords Youth Advisory Committee meet quarterly with key stakeholders as a vehicle for sharing two-way communication between young people and agencies
- **Cricket4All** An intergenerational project bringing older and younger people together for mutually beneficially activities and build relationships between older and younger people.

Community Development – Pathways to Particpation



- Support to 35 Community centres across Fingal providing facilities for all ages Footfall in 2022 = 5 million

Community Development – Pathways to Particpation


The Community Development Office has established a pilot project of three "**Welcome Rooms**" in community centres across Fingal, two in Dublin 15 and one in Swords. They are located at Parslickstown House, Corduff Resource Centre and Rivervalley Community Club.

The rooms are designed to provide a Living Room space within the community centre and are equipped with armchairs, board games, books, a kids play area, TV's, a radio and charging points for devices.

There is also the facility for people to help themselves to tea and coffee and light refreshments. The space is freely available to all. The rooms are available broadly in line with the opening hours of the centres.

FCC is currently scoping out the extension of the pilot beyond March 2023 to include a series of pop-up events to encourage participation
