Christy looks after over 90 kids weekly in the boxing club and impacts the lives of these kids in many different ways. As a boxing coach Christy has impacted the lives of 1000s of kids from all different backgrounds; a lot dealing with their own issues outside the club. He has done all this on a purely voluntary basis, often with personal sacrifice.



#### **Liam Connor**

Liam is a dedicated community worker and promoter of all things associated with GAA and the Irish language. A member of Fingallians since he moved to Swords more than 50 years ago, Liam held many positions including Chairperson of the club for 6 years. He introduced and built the hurling and ladies football codes in the club and regularly holds conversation groups as gaeilge in the club where everyone is encouraged to speak the language. Liam embraces all things cultural and generations of young people have benefited from his work.



## Ini Usanga

Ini has been volunteering in the community for over 20 years, organsing integration activities, bringing migrants and locals together to understand each other, create friendships, and support understanding of different cultures. Ini supports youths in confidence building programmes, summer camps, and interview skills. She also supports young migrants of the LGBT community and encourages youths of migrant origins to join extracurricular activities and stay in school and keep away from gang membership and anti-social behaviours.



### **Barney Greene**

Barney, a north County Fingal legend at 91, is the organiser of the Annual Barney Greene Tractor run that, over 15 events, has raised over €138,000 for St. Francis Hospice. This year's event had 168 tractors, the largest ever number and raised €10,300. Every year, the event shows the incredible organisation skills and energy that Barney has; an event that everyone looks forward to every January for such a great cause.



### Ger Kenny

Ger never stops working to provide for the autistic community. She set up PLAN; they provide workshops and talks for parents to help empower them to help their autistic children. Little Seeds is a social club for autistic children and teens. There are occupational therapy sessions, art sessions and loads more. It's just so amazing and we'd be lost without PLAN and Little Seeds.



## **Michael O'Driscoll**

Michael is the definition of a community minded person. He single handedly maintains the gardens in our entire estate, which are kept immaculate at all times. The pride he takes is really something to admire. In addition to that he makes sure to check in on all elderly neighbours for shopping etc and recently had to stay with one lady who had had a stroke for 30 minutes while waiting on paramedics to arrive. Helen has been teaching English Classes voluntary in the Donabate Portrane Community Centre; she spends extra hours there planning new lessons for life skills through cooking, making jewellery, and informing participants of events they can go to. Countless hours given every week with such kindness to help the non-English speaking community to integrate and be included in social events held in the community; to help them bond and make friendships through inclusion.

### Jenny Brady Byrne

Jenny works with kids with autism and other additional needs. Outside of her working hours, she calls to their houses, babysits, makes visuals, and makes appointments for the parents. She volunteers with Skerries Autism Friendly Town at all their events. She is a huge part of 130 families around the Fingal area. And she never looks for any thanks; she just loves being able to help.



## Samantha O'Flanagan

Samantha has become the cornerstone of our community, including organising regular litter picks followed by a community coffee, which ultimately led to the set up of our Residents Association and Neighbourhood Watch. It also led to neighbours, who moved in during Covid having the opportunity to meet their neighbours, and has massively improved the sense of community, and instilled a sense of pride in the area. She does a massive amount of behind the scene work that she never looks for credit for.



#### Levi Omokaro

Levi works for the community through volunteering and dedicating himself to community work, especially the new Ukrainian members of the community. He teaches them English, helps them to organise classes, fill out their forms and giving them direction. The event has grown from around 30 participants in its first year to hundreds taking part each year since, raising over €100k down through the years for the Irish Cancer Society.

Larry works tirelessly in Dublin 15 leading Porterstown Panthers in jogging/running, cycling, hiking, and swimming. The Porterstown Panthers is a community voluntary group of likeminded people and Larry ensures the group actively live happier, healthlier lives through exercise and engagement with each other. Larry organises jogging training sessions for all levels of fitness and ensuring everyone is involved and no one is on their own. Larry will always go beyond for anybody, and we are so truly grateful to him and to know him.
