<p>Official Minutes of the Event: Work Package 2: DIVERSITY FOR A MORE INCLUSIVE EUROPE</p> <p>Event Number: 2 Event Name: DIVERSITY FOR A MORE INCLUSIVE EUROPE Type: Cine-Forum, Creative LAB, and Conference Location: Budapest, Hungary Date(s): 18/05/2023 - 20/05/2023</p> <p>INTRODUCTION:</p> <p>The second event of the InlusEU project, titled "Work Package 6: European Values, the Main Base of Volunteerism," took place in Budapest, Hungary, from May 18th to 20th, 2023. This event aimed to highlight the fundamental European values that underpin the spirit of volunteerism across the continent. The event was organized by Szubjektív Értékek Alapítvány (SVF) and featured a variety of activities designed to foster discussion and collaboration among the project partners. These activities included a cine-forum, creative lab sessions, and a series of conferences that provided a platform for sharing best practices and innovative ideas in the field of</p>			

volunteerism.

The event began with an opening gala that included welcome speeches from key representatives and performances showcasing traditional Hungarian culture. Over the following days, participants engaged in thematic discussions on the current state of the voluntary sector, creative workshops aimed at community building, and coordination sessions to plan future project activities. The event concluded with cultural activities and a guided tour of Budapest, allowing participants to immerse themselves in the local heritage and strengthen their network connections.

This document provides a detailed account of the activities conducted, discussions held, and decisions made during the event, serving as a formal record for presentation to the European Commission.

Implementation of Gender Perspective:

The second event has followed the statements agreed in the first meeting in Rafelbunyol (Spain):

The promotion and empowering underrepresented groups, particularly women and gender minorities, a total of **64,70%** of the participants were women. By including diverse voices in decision-making processes, we ensured that the interventions were inclusive and responsive to the varied experiences of all participants. This was accomplished by the number of women experts overrepresented during the event, specially in the diversification of speakers and audience regarding: gender, age or background.

Implementing gender-sensitive data collection methods, ensuring that the perspectives of both men and women were equally represented in the project's findings. This allowed us to track and assess the impacts of the actions from a gendered lens, and adjust strategies when necessary to avoid reinforcing existing inequalities. The outcome of these efforts resulted in a more equitable distribution of resources, opportunities, and support for all gender groups involved in the project.

All the presentations, and speakers have to have a gender balance, this helps us allow more public space for Associations, actions and projects lead by women.

Ethical Considerations in Implementation:

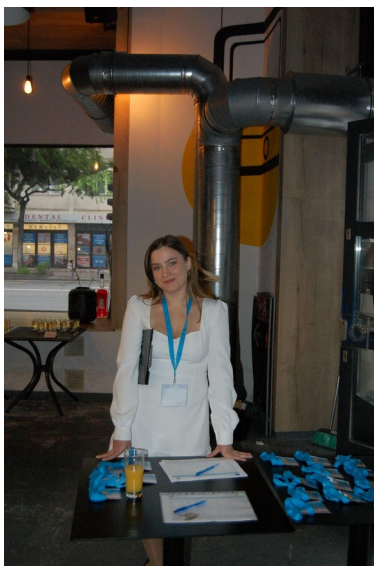
Established a robust framework for ethical decision-making, ensuring that all actions taken aligned with the highest standards of integrity, respect, and transparency. We provided clear communication about the project's goals to all the participants, methods, and expected outcomes to foster trust and promote informed consent at all stages.

In addition, we took proactive measures to ensure that the project did not inadvertently perpetuate discrimination or harm any of the stakeholders, particularly those from vulnerable or groups that suffer more discrimination. We conducted regular ethical reviews and risk assessments to identify potential areas of concern, which allowed us to adjust our approach when necessary. Furthermore, safeguarding mechanisms were put in place to protect participants' privacy and confidentiality, and all data was handled responsibly in accordance with ethical standards.

MAY 18 - THURSDAY - OPENING GALA

18:30 - 19:00 - Registration, Welcome session.

Participants were warmly welcomed as they registered for the event. The registration process was complemented by an introduction to the following days given by the main coordinators of the NGO, providing an opportunity for attendees to socialize and network.



19:00 - 19:30 - Welcome Speeches:
The opening ceremony featured a series of welcome speeches from key representatives:

- Péter Kovács, Head of Project Department, SVF
- Dr. Tibor Kispál, Vice-Mayor, Municipality of Erzsébetváros
- Vivien Rózsa, President of the Student Council, WSUF

These speeches emphasized the importance of European values in volunteerism and set the stage for the event's objectives.

19:30 - 20:00 - Traditional Hungarian Folk Dance:
Attendees enjoyed a captivating performance of traditional Hungarian folk dance. This cultural display highlighted Hungary's rich heritage and provided an engaging start to the evening's festivities.



20:30 - 21:00 - ORSOIA Concert:
The evening continued with a concert by ORSOIA, blending traditional and contemporary musical elements. The performance was well-received, adding a vibrant and dynamic touch to the opening gala.



21:00 - After Party:
The formal program concluded with an after-party, allowing participants to unwind and further engage with one another in a more informal setting. This provided a valuable opportunity for building connections and fostering a sense of community among the attendees.

Participants gathered for the second day's activities, registering and receiving event materials. This provided a chance for attendees to reconnect and prepare for the day's sessions.



Activity: Conference from experts in volunteerism (T.2.1.)

Methodology: Presentation.

During the morning different experts in voluntarism and humanitarian action helped us understand the evolution of solidarity more deeply in HUNgary during the emergency situation with Covid 2019. The morning began with a series of opening talks delivered by prominent figures:

These speeches highlighted the significance of volunteerism in upholding European values, the role of youth in fostering community solidarity, and the importance of the InlusEU project in promoting these ideals.



10:45 - 11:00 - Coffee Break:
A brief coffee break allowed participants to relax, network, and exchange initial

thoughts on the opening speeches. This informal setting facilitated valuable conversations and set a collaborative tone for the upcoming sessions.

11:00 - 12:30 - The Situation of the Domestic Voluntary Sector: The morning session continued with an in-depth discussion on the current state of the voluntary sector in Hungary:

Speakers provided insights into the challenges and opportunities facing domestic volunteer organizations, shared best practices, and discussed strategies for enhancing volunteer engagement and

effectiveness. This session was instrumental in understanding the local context and drawing parallels with broader European trends.

12:30 - 13:00 - Traditional Lunch: Participants enjoyed a traditional Hungarian lunch, providing a moment to relax and network in a casual setting.

13:00 - 14:45 - Creative LAB

Activity: Creative LAB (T.2.3). - Creation and Community Building:

Methodology: arts&crafts, theater, collage and dance. Engaging in various creative activities to foster community spirit and collaboration. This lab allows participants to reflect about the need to spread solidarity in all the channels as a crucial important value, fighting against hate speech, specially in social networks.

12:30 - 15:00 - Lunch Break, Music & Dance
 Show:
 Participants enjoyed a lunch break featuring a music and dance show, showcasing local cultural performances and providing a festive atmosphere for networking and relaxation.

15:00 - 18:00 - Guided Group City Tour in Budapest:
 A guided tour of Budapest allowed participants to explore the city's historical and cultural landmarks. This tour included visits to significant sites, providing an immersive experience of Budapest's rich heritage.

18:00 - 20:00 - Traditional Hungarian Dinner in Szeged Restaurant with Traditional Music,
 Closing Remarks:
 The event concluded with a traditional Hungarian dinner at Szeged Restaurant. Attendees enjoyed authentic Hungarian cuisine accompanied by traditional music. Closing remarks were delivered, summarizing the event's achievements and expressing gratitude to all participants and organizers for their contributions.

 - Ireland: Dedicated dates for their work package were announced:
 - Travel days: 28th September and 1st October

- Project Program Modifications:
 - Portugal and Poland: Requested to switch dates due to logistical reasons. This change was approved by the consortium.
- Technical Standards for Meetings:
 - Emphasis on ensuring high-quality sound and recording for meetings.
 - Zoom meetings should be recorded, with consent documents signed.
- Volunteer Participation:
 - Age range for volunteers should be 18-35.
 - Video interviews of volunteers are required, focusing on their experiences and relevant topics.
- Next Team Conference:
 - Suggested date: 16th June, subject to flexibility.
 - Discussion topics: Post-pandemic feelings, voluntary work experiences, and making future meetings more interactive.
- Future Meetings:
 - Dates for meetings with Poland and Romania will be decided via a doodle poll.
- Report Submissions:
 - Partners should upload videos of previous meetings (including Spain and Hungary).
 - Evaluation forms to be prepared and sent out.
 - Each report must include meeting minutes, agenda points, and participant lists.
- Dissemination Strategy:
 - Request for reports on dissemination tactics and press releases.
 - Preparation of a final video by Spanish partners, requesting additional videos from partners.
 - Project communication platforms to be managed by the lead partner, including WhatsApp group administration.
- Youth pilots groups:
 - Involvement of young groups in the project, specially young people in difficulties, demotivation. Is recommended to be coordinated with Social Services, Council Youth departments and Schools.
 - The partners agreed to involve young people in online workshops and mobilities with internal funds.
