Traffic Works Order

Quiet Streets, Drynam - Implementation of a Filtered Permeability Scheme at the junction of Feltrim Road and Drynam Heath/Green, Kinsealy, Co. Dublin

Fingal County Council proposes the implementation of a Filtered Permeability Scheme at the junction of Feltrim Road and Drynam Heath/Green, Kinsealy, Co. Dublin, as part of its Active Travel initiatives. The scheme aims to encourage modal shift promoting cycling and walking in the area and create a safer residential environment by restricting motor vehicle access.

Proposed Measures:

- **Installation of Bollards:** Bollards will be installed at the junction of Drynam Heath and Feltrim Road to prevent motor vehicle access while allowing free movement of cyclists and pedestrians.
- **Traffic Signs:** Install signage to inform all road users of the new restrictions.

Legal Basis:

Under **Section 38 of the Road Traffic Act 1994 (as amended)**, Fingal County Council is authorized to implement traffic management measures on public roads for safety improvements. The proposed scheme aligns with these provisions as:

- It constitutes a traffic management measure.
- The works will occur on public roads within the locality.
- No Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) or Appropriate Assessment (AA) is required.
- The works are exempt from the Part 8 Procedure.

All traffic signs for the works will be installed in accordance with **Section 95 of the Road Traffic Act 1961**


Public Consultation:

A non-statutory public consultation took place from **7th October 2024 to 11th November 2024** via an online portal and **22 submissions** were received. The Active Travel Unit reviewed the feedback and incorporated modifications to the original proposals where appropriate. Local representatives were updated on the scheme in the Howth Malahide area committee meeting on the 3rd April 2025.

Traffic Works Order Implementation:


The traffic works order will be published on Fingal County Council's website, with elected members duly informed.
