

The language is simple, and with a constant undercurrent that the reader is a special individual, full of potential to make the world a kind and beautiful place to live. Samel's diversely populated illustrations complement the text by evoking community belonging, the book's overall message is one of profound and heart-warming welcome. (Non-fiction, Age 0–2)

Set in the context of the appropriateness of a mister's choice of clothing, this fun and inclusive story is about unconscious bias versus personal choice. (Age 2-4)

With colourful illustrations, through Molly's eyes we see what is important about family: that they support and love one another, helping each other through good times and bad. (Age 5-8)



Using questions ('What is a person's sex?') and conversational, inclusive language ('Isn' it amazing to be able to see a baby growing inside a person's wombl') as well as a glossary, this is an honest, clear introduction to baby-making and birth. Owen's illustrations are emotive and stylish, depicting same-sex families, single parents and diverse ethnicities, religions and abilities. (Non-fiction, Age 5–8)





Retener doesn't shy away from acknowledging that Marley finds things like fitting into a binary world hard, however joy radiates through both the writing and the illustrations which depict people of all colours, genders and abilities on the pages.
