In order to legally operate, you must hold local authority. To obtain this you must first arrange to have an Approved Assessor Inspection to verify compliance







YOU MUST USE COMPLIANT PRODUCTS

Only products which comply with the VOC exceed the VOC content limit is a direct containers should be free from leaks and

YOU MUST USE COMPLIANT **EQUIPMENT**

Sprayguns must have a transfer efficiency of 65% or higher, you must be able to demonstrate this. Spray gun cleaning should only take place in a dedicated spray gunwash unit. The spray gunwash unit must be enclosed.





YOU MUST MAINTAIN RECORDS

YOU MUST STORE VOC CONTAINING WASTE PROPERLY

VOC containing waste is hazardous and poses a threat to human health and the environment. Liquid waste must be stored in suitable sealed, labelled containers on a spill tray/bund. Solid waste must be stored in a closed, labelled container.





REMOVED FROM SITE BY AN AUTHORISED WASTE COLLECTOR

You must ensure that the waste collector holds a valid hazardous waste collection permit. You should obtain a copy of this permit and a copy of the EPA licence for the facility to which the waste is being taken.

VOC CONTAINING PRODUCTS ARE REGULATED TO PROTECT HUMAN HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT

If you are using VOC containing products in vehicle refinishing, you must comply with the law. Information relating to your requirements can be found be logging on to the websites listed below or by contacting the environment section in your local authority. Failure to comply with the Regulations may result in you being issued with a fixed payment notice which is a spot fine of €1000 or if convicted in court, liability on summary conviction to fines of up to €5000.
