NOTES

- A 'segregated cycle route' is route with a designated section of a road or path physically separated from other traffic (like cars, pedestrians, or other vehicles) specifically for cyclists.
- A 'mixed traffic cycle route' is one where cyclists share the carriageway with vehicular traffic i.e. there is not a separate cycle lane
- Exact location, extent and configuration of traffic calming measures to be determined through further design development
- Exact location and type of pedestrian crossings to be determined through further design development.
- Specification and ultimate design of streetscape upgraded (e.g. paving type, materials etc.) to be determined via optioneering process in future project stages.
- Proposed pedestrian footpath on Inch Road is subject to resolving land ownership / road right-of-way constraints. Viability and alignment of route subject to further studies.
- Future proposed cycle routes delivered as part of Greater Dublin Area Cycle Network Plan.
- Off-road route routes to Ardgillan Demesne is supported by the Active Travel Plan but should be delivered by others.
