Green Public Procurement Strategy

1. Vision

Fingal County Council recognises the critical role of public procurement in promoting environmental, social, and economic progress.

2. What is Green Public Procurement?

Green Public Procurement (GPP) is a process where public authorities seek to source goods, services or works with a reduced environmental impact throughout their life cycle when compared to goods, services and works with the same primary function that would ordinarily be procured.¹

3. Introduction

Fingal County Council is committed to keeping sustainability to the forefront of everything we do and adopting green procurement strategies to achieve a more sustainable future for our community and promote eco-innovation, climate action, and circular economy. Fingal County Council want to ensure that our County continues to be a place to live, work, play and do business in for future generations. Fingal County Council Climate Action Plan 2024-2029.

4. Policy

This green public procurement strategy sets out Fingal County Council's commitment to environmental, economic and socially sustainable procurement. This strategy complements the Corporate Procurement Plan 2024-2026 and builds upon the Council's commitment, principles and actions to which are referenced in the Council's Corporate Plan 2019-2024 and in the Fingal County Council Climate Change Action Plan, a joint initiative by the four Dublin Local Authorities. The Climate Change Action Plan identifies five key areas where Fingal County Council will strive to reduce the impacts of climate change. This Plan also provides a clear mandate for sustainability through procurement.

Fingal County Council is committed to achieving a more sustainable future for our county through the adoption of green public procurement policies and procedures. We believe that sustainable procurement practices can deliver significant environmental, social and economic benefits, while also improving the quality and efficiency of our procurement processes.

By including Green Public Procurement (GPP) criteria in our procurement activities, we can contribute to the protection of our planet and promote sustainable development for the next generations.

Fingal County Council is committed to the following GPP policy principles:

- 1. Prioritising the purchase of eco-friendly, energy-efficient, and low-carbon products and services throughout our procurement activities, while balancing value for money, quality, and performance.
- 2. Including GPP criteria in our procurement processes, such as life-cycle costing, procurement specifications, and technical requirements. All contracts and frameworks will include specific clauses highlighting the commitments made in response to GPP criteria, together with clear requirements for monitoring, reporting, escalation and remedies in case of non-performance.
- 3. GPP commitments are recommended as a standing item on the agenda at all contract review meetings. Contract clauses will also provide for periodic reviews of environmental performance, with the possibility of increasing the level of ambition in line with the contracting authority's commitments in relation to climate change or other environmental policies.
- 4. All contracts and frameworks currently in place which have significant environmental impacts will be reviewed to identify whether these are adequately addressed, and if not, what scope exists for amending them.
- 5. All staff involved in procurement and contract management will receive training in the basic concepts, tools and techniques relevant to applying GPP in their role.
- 6. Engage with suppliers, contractors, and other stakeholders to promote innovative, sustainable solutions and technologies that align with our GPP objectives.
- 7. Require our suppliers and contractors to comply with relevant environmental and social standards, including ISO 14001, ISO 50001, and OHSAS 18001.
- 8. Monitor and evaluate our procurement activities regularly to ensure compliance with our GPP policy, identify opportunities for improvement, and measure our environmental, social, and economic impact.

3. Objectives

Fingal County Council's Green Public Procurement (GPP) strategy aims to achieve the following objectives:

- 1. Reduce the environmental impact of our procurement activities.
- 2. Promote the purchase of environmentally friendly, energy-efficient, and low-carbon products and services.
- 3. Encourage the adoption of socially responsible policies, such as fair labor practices, ethical sourcing, and diverse supplier engagement.
- 4. Raise awareness and educate suppliers, contractors, and internal stakeholders about our GPP objectives and requirements.
- 5. Monitor and evaluate our progress, measure the outcomes of our green procurement activities, and report on our achievements to the public.

4. Actions

1. GPP checkpoints will be introduced in all procurement procedures to ensure that each of the below actions have been carried out.

- 2. Needs assessment and market engagement will be undertaken prior to tendering, to establish the scope for including GPP criteria and the appropriate level of ambition.
- 3. GPP criteria will be included in either the technical specifications, award criteria or both for all contracts and frameworks. Where green award criteria are applied, at least 5% 10% of the marks will be allocated to these².
- 4. The use of life-cycle costing will be considered for all contracts and frameworks in which a significant part of the total cost of ownership arises after the point of purchase. Where a decision is taken not to apply life-cycle costing, this must be justified. Environmental externalities (e.g., CO2e emissions will be monetized and included in LCC where a method is available for this, for example the EU LCC tools)
- 5. All contracts and frameworks will include specific clauses highlighting the commitments made in response to GPP criteria, together with clear requirements for monitoring, reporting, escalation, and remedies in case of non-performance. GPP commitments will be a standing item on the agenda at all contract review meetings. Contract clauses will also provide for periodic reviews of environmental performance, with the possibility of increasing the level of ambition in line with the contracting authority's commitments in relation to climate change or other environmental policies.
- 6. All staff involved in procurement and contract management will receive training in the basic concepts, tools, and techniques relevant to applying GPP in their role.
- 7. All contracts and frameworks currently in place which have significant environmental impacts will be reviewed to identify whether these are adequately addressed, and if not, what scope exists for amending them.
