
Forget-Me-Nots Choir

The Council Chamber will host a site-specific exhibition titled *Chamber Drawing Series* by artist Amanda Dunsmore, commissioned as part of the Decade of Commemorations programme. Responding to the theme of democracy and politics, Dunsmore presents a series of gestural drawings that capture the dynamics and movement of debates that have taken place within the chamber itself.

Also on display in the Atrium will be an exhibition entitled *Politics and Democracy* in Fingal, 1924–39. This exhibition accompanies a book of the same name—the first in a six-part series on politics and local government in North County Dublin, commissioned by Fingal Local Studies & Archives. This unique series by Dr Declan Brady offers a comprehensive political history of Fingal spanning more than 200 years.





At Touch Design Ceramics in Balbriggan, beautiful, functional pottery is crafted entirely by hand by Radek Zemlicka, a second-generation Czech potter who has continued his family's craft in Ireland since 2005.
