

Who is Eligible?

- Not-for Profit organisations operating in Fingal
- Tidy Towns, Community Groups, Residents Organisations
- Youth Clubs, Active Age, Mens/ Women's Sheds
- Sports Clubs, GAA, Soccer, Sailing, Scouts, Tennis, Cricket, Cycling
- Can have Charitable Status, Articles of Association, Regular minuted meetings/ AGM
- Applicants should be members of the Fingal Public Participation Network (PPN) or The Wheel
- Applicants must demonstrate open access to the community
- This grant covers projects that will <u>reduce emissions</u>

Please note:

*Schools and Educational facilities are not eligible, *This grant is not for 'learning' and does not cover workshops and festivals/ awareness events

*businesses/ commercial entities are not eligible, but projects can include working with businesses to reduce waste/ water/ energy



Small Scale Projects - Up to €20K

Medium Scale Projects - €21K to €50K

Large Scale Projects - €51K to €100K

Projects are 100% funded,

3 scales of grants available in this competitive application process

Climate Action Themes - Project Ideas to Reduce Emissions


- 1. Community Energy: Solar Panels, Building Insulation, Heat Pump on a Community Building, LED Lighting in car park/community area/sports pitch
- 2. Community Travel: Cycle Parking infrastructure in Community area, Group cycling, bike lockers, bikeshare schemes, bike repair stations, electric bike charging
- 3. Community Food & Waste: Community Composting, Leaf Mould Collections, Community Food Bank/ sharing, Working with local businesses to reduce Food Waste, Packaging, Community Gardens
- **4.** Community Local Climate & Environmental Action: Sand Dune/ river/watercourse/ Habitat Restoration, Planting Trees, Planting Biodiversity Area, Community Gardens
- **5. Community Shopping & Recycling:** Working with local businesses to reduce waste, introduce local return/ Repair/ swap schemes, reduce packaging













Projects Round 1

- Building Fabric Upgrades
 - Roof/attic & wall insulation
 - Replacement of windows and doors
- Renewable Energy Solutions
 - Solar PV panels
 - Heat Pumps
- Energy Efficient Lighting
 - Changing to LED lighting floodlighting
 - Sports pitches
 - Car parks

Next Steps

- Assess Your Buildings
 - You may be entitled to a FREE Energy Audit, if your annual energy spend is over €10k, from SEAI (€2k Voucher Support System)
 - **Baseline Energy Consumption**
 - Schedule of Improvements
 - Cost vs Impact Assessment

Obtain minimum 3 Quotes for recommended works as per your energy audit

SHOPPING & RECYCLING

- Contact the Community Climate Action Officer (CCAO) to discuss application proposals
- Complete an Energy Audit if you are applying for a technology upgrade such as solar panels/ heat pump
- Obtain 3 quotes for each of the projects not required to go with the cheapest quote but you must get 3 quotes if possible
- Gather whatever paperwork is required (6yr lease/ renting agreements from property owner)
- Applications scored as according to Department Guidelines
- All items must be submitted into the portal in advance of the deadline
- Deadline for Applications is Monday 22nd December 5pm
- These are long-term projects

Developing Applications

- Each application might have multiple groups involved
- There will be one lead group in the application
- Meetings should be minuted and all agreements recorded
- Following approval, the lead group can receive 25% upfront funding, if necessary.
- More payments can be drawn down as the project is verified/ vouched
- All parties must have a Bank/ Credit Union Account & treasurer

Application Form Guidance







- This is a competitive application process and each application will be scored on it's own merit.
- Save the link to the form as you may return to it several times.
- In general you will need to upload a minimum of 3 quotes for each item.
- There are about 40 questions to be answered.
- Do not apply for more than €100,000.
- You may choose to partner with another organisation for the application, which will score extra marks, but this is not mandatory. Lots of applicants in the 1st round partner with other groups. Sometimes it worked well, and with others it didn't work very well.
- As you progress through the form just save or save and quit, there is no need to submit it until the very end. If you press 'complete' then the form is not editable – let me know if you're having any issues with the form.
- If you need guidance on any of the questions please email me
- If your group does not reclaim VAT then please ensure to enter the figures including VAT.
- If your group/ club reclaims VAT (you need to let me know): In that case you should enter the quote values in the table Ex. VAT. If awarded you will receive an allocation ex-VAT.





Completed Projects Round 1

Remember this is all about reducing emissions, reducing waste and increasing biodiversity

Scoring

Selection criterion		Weighting
Relevance and impact	Clearly demonstrate that the project will reduce emissions – contributing to Ireland's Climate and Energy Targets	30%
Innovation and scalability	Demonstrate if the project has the potential to be scaled up and have a long-lasting impact	20%
Value for money	Costs should be reasonable, applicants to demonstrate that they have sounded the market	20%

Scoring

Remember this is all about reducing emissions, reducing waste and increasing biodiversity


Selection criterion		Weighting
Achievability	The applicant should demonstrate the capacity for delivering the project(s) in a timely manner. The proposal should be clear and achievable	10%
Partnership Approach	Applicants can partner with Fingal-based organisations to deliver projects. All stakeholders should be actively involved in developing the application and set to deliver the projects	10%
Governance Arrangements	Governance and financial management systems/roles should be clearly outlined in the application and be compliant with tax rules.	10%
