
Fingal County Council

What you will see throughout this calendar...

Key observances have been included in the calendar from the five most popular world religions.

In addition, the calendar highlights some of the key dates commemorated and celebrated internationally under the United Nations. The four seasonal festivals of the Gaelic Calendar (marking the changing of the seasons in Ireland since pagan times) are also included, as are the public holidays.

Christianity

Founded on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ 2,000 years ago, Christianity is the world's largest religion with over 2 billion followers. It is comprised of diverse traditions including Roman Catholic, Orthodox and Protestant, but there are many more. The dignity of the human person is at the centre of Christian social teaching, which highlights the importance of the common good. Christmas and Easter are the two most widely celebrated Christian holidays. Christian traditions include saints, sacraments, and liturgical seasons like Advent and Lent. The Bible is the most translated and distributed book in the world.

Islam

The word Islam means both peace and submission. It is the second largest religion in the world with over 1 billion followers. Founded in the 7th century CE by the Prophet Muhammad, Islam teaches submission to one God (Allah) and values compassion, justice, and community. There are five basic pillars of Islam, which are: Shahada (the declaration of Faith), Salah (daily Prayers), Zakat (Charity), Sawm (Fasting) and Hajj (Pilgrimage). The Qur'an is considered the literal word of God in Islam.

Buddhism

Originating in India around the 6th century BCE, Buddhism is based on the teachings of Siddhartha Gautama (the Buddha). Buddhism teaches that all life is interconnected and emphasises

mindfulness and compassion. Buddhists don't worship a God but seek enlightenment through ethical living, meditation, and wisdom. The two main Buddhist sects are Theravada Buddhism and Mahayana Buddhism, but there are many more. The Dalai Lama is a prominent spiritual leader in Tibetan Buddhism.

Hinduism

One of the oldest religions, Hinduism is a diverse tradition over 3,000 years old. Rooted in India, it embraces a wide variety of beliefs and practices like Karma (action), Dharma (duty), and Moksha (liberation). It has over 900 million followers worldwide. It is not a single doctrine, and there is no single founder or teacher. Hindus believe in a universal eternal soul called Brahman, who created and is present in everything but also honor many gods and goddesses with major festivals including Diwali and Holi. The sacred syllable 'Om' represents the essence of the universe. Hindu temples serve as cultural hubs.

Judaism

An ancient monotheistic faith, Judaism is based on the covenant between God and the Jewish people. It values justice, learning, and traditions, including the Torah, which guide daily life and spiritual practice. Jewish holidays often involve symbolic foods, like matzah at Passover and apples with honey at Rosh Hashanah. Shabbat (Sabbath) is a weekly day of rest and spiritual renewal. Hebrew is both a liturgical and modern spoken language in Jewish communities.

United Nations

Throughout its history, the United Nations (UN) has designated specific dates as international occasions to mark key themes or events, with the aim of promoting Peace, Dignity and Equality. The existence of international days predates the establishment of the United Nations, but the UN has embraced them as a powerful tool for change. The key UN dates that you will see throughout this calendar are selected for their relevance to inclusion and integration.
