The BorrowBox app & a valid Fingal Library card and PIN.

- Install the *BorrowBox Library* app on your mobile device.
- Select **Fingal** as your Library.
- In the **ID barcode** field, type in your library membership number.
- For **PIN/Password**, just add your library card's PIN; you don't need a separate BorrowBox PIN.
- Agree to terms & conditions, and Privacy Policy.
- The first time you use BorrowBox, add your email address.
- Click on the **ePress** tab (for newspapers and magazines)..
- Search for *The Irish Independent* and click on **Borrow**.
- Choose between **Confirm Loan + Subscribe** (to ensure future issues are automatically received every day) or **Borrow Issue Only**.
- Select **Read Now**, or **Keep Browsing** (to find other book, audiobook, newspaper or magazine titles).
- We recommend you connect to Wi-Fi before downloading content.
- Once downloading is finished, you'll see the title in your **My Loans** area.
- Click or tap on the title in **My Loan** to start reading.
- Digital magazines and newspapers don't need to be reserved; you can borrow up to 99 of them.

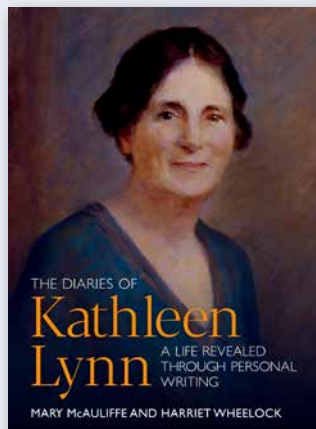




Kathleen Lynn: A Life Revealed Though Personal Writing with Mary McAuliffe

ALL WELCOME

Join Dr. Mary McAuliffe for an exploration of the fascinating life of Irish revolutionary, socialist and feminist Dr. Kathleen Lynn. Mary is the co-editor with Harriet Wheelock of *The Diaries of Kathleen Lynn: A Life Revealed Though Personal Writing*. Kathleen Lynn's diaries record her involvement in the 1916 Rising, the War of Independence, the Civil War, and the formative decades of the Irish Free State, including her vital work in St. Ultan's Hospital for Sick Infants. She also wrote about her family and personal relationships, especially her lifelong relationship with fellow suffragist, revolutionary and social campaigner, Madeline ffrench-Mullen. The diaries give us a valuable insight into the histories of female activists, networks and intimate lives.

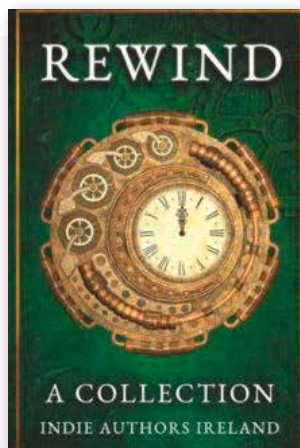


Throughout February and especially on Ireland Reads Day, Saturday, 28th February, people of all ages across Ireland will be encouraged to get lost in a good book.
