Chief Executive's Foreword

As we get back to business after the festive period may I wish you a very Happy New Year - I hope you had a very enjoyable Christmas break and took the opportunity to recharge and reflect after a very busy year. To usher in the New Year, a spectacular fireworks display took place in Howth Harbour to co-ordinate with another showcase at Dún Laoghaire Harbour. The free, family friendly event was held in collaboration with New Year's Festival Dublin as part of the wider 'Winter in Dublin Programme' which aims to boost tourism and create economic opportunities in the county in the winter season. Last year saw the first New Years Eve fireworks show take place and I am very pleased that this year's extravaganza was also incredibly successful with many thousands of spectators gathering for the Fingal display in Howth. I have no doubt that this festival of celebration will go from strength to strength each year and will be a much-anticipated annual event in Fingal.

A variation to the Fingal Development Plan 2023-2029 was published on December 23, 2025, and will be on public display until January 29, 2026. The proposal seeks to unlock additional residential zoning to provide for an extra 5,000 homes in response to the recently published National Housing Guidelines. This proposed variation was prompted by the publication of the new guidelines in July, following which, the Minister for Housing, James Browne TD, asked all 31 local authorities to review their Development Plans and incorporate the new annual housing delivery targets. The Council's planning team immediately commenced the process of reviewing residential zoned lands across the county whereby lands both within and outside existing settlements and urban areas were examined in the context of identifying potential sites for development. The current Development Plan, when adopted in 2023 by the Elected Members, outlined the plan to deliver 35,000 new homes – 7,000 of these homes have already been provided and the variation seeks to increase the delivery of new homes by an additional 5,000. This increase demonstrates Fingal's commitment to providing high quality, compact and energy efficient homes while simultaneously forging new communities which are centred around transport links thus reducing the need for car-dependant growth. The variation will be on public display until January 29, 2026, and supporting documents can be viewed at <https://consult.fingal.ie> where submissions and observations on the proposal can also be made.

I am pleased that Fingal County Council's Gaeltacht Scholarship Scheme is open for applications for this coming year offering Partial Scholarships of €500 to Fingal Second Level students who are attending residential Gaeltacht Irish Language Courses in 2026. The scheme, which commenced in 2024, has attracted huge interest from families of students who will be heading to Gaeltacht areas during the year to focus on honing their Irish language skills. These trips not only give students the opportunity to improve their Irish but also

provide a valuable social and cultural focus which instils a love for the Irish language and heritage.

This year, 15 lucky students will receive scholarships and will be invited to the Seachtain na Gaeilge event in County Hall Swords to meet Mayor of Fingal Cllr Tom O'Leary and to take part in a photocall. Interested parties can find out more about this initiative here: <https://www.fingal.ie/gaeltacht> - Go n-éirí libh! As always, Seachtain na Gaeilge will be taking place from March 1 – 17 and Fingal County Council's programme of events promises a true celebration of the language and culture. Our library branches have fantastic events on offer including Family Yoga, Magic and Puppet Shows and Bilingual Story Telling to name but a few offerings. One of the highlights each year is the Ceol, Craic agus Gaeilge event at County Hall where you can be sure of a wonderfully entertaining evening with live music, chats and a great atmosphere. Full details on the event are here <https://www.fingal.ie/ga/ga/SeachtainnaGaeilge2025> whether you use the Irish language every day or simply wish to improve your cúpla focal, you are more than welcome to join us on Wednesday March 11, 2026, at 7pm.

This month will see a number of changes introduced to the organisation as a response to the challenges posed by the continuing growth of population within the county. Fingal County Council is committed to the delivery of housing, key infrastructure projects and excellent standards of efficiency and co-ordination in our work – these objectives will be greatly assisted by the appointment of a new Director of Service and the creation of standalone Housing, Planning, and Infrastructure directorates. I am pleased that Senior Planner Róisín Burke has been appointed as Director of Planning and Development and will head up a directorate that will lead on planning policy, development management, and the identification of land activation priorities and infrastructure obstacles. Róisín brings to the position a wealth of experience and knowledge accumulated through her work with other local authorities and Fingal County Council which she joined in 2008. I know you will join me in wishing Róisín the very best as she embarks on her new role. The current Director of Planning and Strategic Infrastructure, Matthew McAleese, will lead a dedicated Infrastructure and Transport Directorate and Paul Carroll, who is Director of Housing and Community Development at present, will oversee a dedicated Housing Department. The Economic, Enterprise, Tourism and Cultural Development Department will now assume responsibility for the Community Development Department aligning it more closely with the Local Economic and Community Development Committee. Through these important changes, I look forward to building on Fingal County Council's solid record of service delivery for the future.

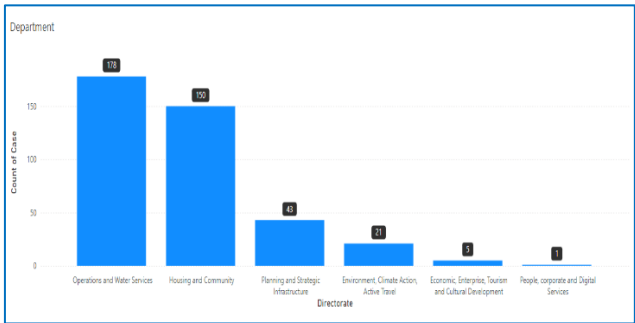

CRM

Staff continue to work on the Customer Relationship Management System (CRM) and issue responses to representations from Elected Members (Councillors, TDs and Senators) and complaints submitted by the public. The total number of representations for December was 398. See below breakdown by each department.



Communications

Digital Statistics

The fingal.ie website had 126,461 visitors during December, a decrease of 20,224 from the previous period. The number of page views decreased by 69,220 to 255,409. The average time spent on the website rose to 2min 9secs.

The most popular page during December was the Howth Fireworks page. Our Planning Applications page also had over 12,939 page views.

Overall, in 2025 there were 1,752,637 visitors and 3,846,634 page views, with visitors spending an average of 1 minute and 59 seconds on the site. The Facebook account rose to 44,500 followers (+1%) while the number of views dropped by 40% to 2,058,765 from the previous month. There were 7,102 (-39%) interactions. The most popular post was Talking Heads, a look at how everyday conversations can make a difference.

Instagram rose to 17,092 followers. Total views down by 10.5% to 750,827 (from 706,414) from the previous month, with a reach of 100,576 (up from 46,510 +126.5%). There were 6,151 (-8.4%) interactions. The most read post was the New Year Fireworks in Howth.

The number of followers on X fell by 22 to 23,325; there was an engagement rate of 3.4% from 115,018 impressions.

The WhatsApp channel now has 3,511 followers while the numbers currently following our other corporate channels are Threads (1,621), TikTok (1,178) and Bluesky (475).

For our YouTube Channel the number of subscribers rose by 13 to 1,939 in December. Total views were 4,191. We now have 842 videos, our most popular video during December was Storm Bram. With our latest including Swords Cultural Quarter Virtual Reality Model, Affordable Housing Scheme - Online Application Tutorial. We continue to webcast the monthly Council Meeting which is proving popular on YouTube.

Press Releases

There were 11 press releases issued during December covering topics such as the Gaeltacht Scholarship Scheme, proposed additional residential zoning for extra 5,000 homes, the awarding of €1.2m in funding to five towns and villages in Fingal, the awarding of CPD accreditation, and the opening of nominations for the Fingal Sports Awards.

Media coverage included RTE, Irish Times, Irish Independent, along with other national outlets covering the case of coastal erosion in Portrane. There was also substantial national interest in the withdrawal of the judicial review into plans for MetroLink.

The Irish Sun, Irish Times, Independent and The Journal all reported on the awarding of planning permission for three data centres in Dublin 15. The GP Referral programme in Blakestown was also featured in the Irish Independent, while the Talking Heads project also received coverage on Newstalk.

TOURISM DEVELOPMENT

New Destination Brand for Tourism

The upcoming launch of Fingal's new destination brand on 23rd February represents a key milestone in the implementation of the Fingal Tourism Strategy. It will include a brand identity, website, and social media rollout as well as a comprehensive Marketing & PR Programme.

This event which will be held in the Grand Hotel, Malahide brings together tourism, hospitality, and wider industry partners to align, collaborate, and activate the next phase of Fingal's destination growth. It strongly reinforces the Council's commitment to developing a competitive, high-performing tourism offering centred around the new brand. The launch will be a starting point for engaging media, stakeholders and the wider community.

Winter in Dublin

Fingal is once again participating in the Winter in Dublin (WID) programme which is designed to support the capital's tourism sector by encouraging domestic and international visitors outside the traditional peak seasons.

Such strategic initiatives are central to Fáilte Ireland's work in driving seasonal and regional spread and in building a more resilient, year-round visitor economy. Winter in Dublin is run by Visit Dublin and is a collaborative event between Fáilte Ireland and Dublin stakeholders including local authorities, public bodies, representative organisations, and industry partners.

WID in Fingal includes Wonderlights at Malahide Castle and the fireworks at Howth Harbour which will be a centrepiece of the celebrations on New Years Eve.



TradFest 2026



Over 30 concerts will take place across Fingal as part of TradFest 2026 running from 21-25 January 2026. TradFest is a joyful celebration of Irish music and culture all over Dublin City and County.

Fingal venues include Ardgillan Castle, Malahide Castle, Swords Castle Chapel, The Millbank Theatre, Draíocht Theatre, The Abbey Tavern and The Séamus Ennis Arts Centre as well as exciting new locations such as The Little Theatre in Skerries, Saint Macullin Community Centre in Lusk, and the Lusk Cultural Centre.

A key part of TradFest 2026, is Féile Barney celebrating the life and career of the legendary Barney McKenna of The Dubliners, over a three-day festival in Howth, the seaside town he called home. TradFest also will deliver an expanded community programme later this year which will outline a series of new exciting, free community-led events in Fingal.

A spectacular display of fireworks is scheduled for a 7pm start with entertainment and amazing viewing from Howth Pier.



Swords Castle Christmas Market

Swords Castle Christmas Markets welcomed over 18,000 people over two weekends despite inclement weather on the second weekend. We conducted over 260 exit surveys and noted highlights included:
 65% of visitors were from Swords
 56% heard about the market via social media
 80% of people rated it good to excellent
 92% of people are aware it is ran by FCC

Other feedback received included the wish for many more craft trader stalls and the call for more Christmas music next year. We will relook at the site for 2026 taking into account the protected structures to see what is possible.



On the second weekend we partnered with As I Am to host 12 As I Am traders in the Chapel, this proved to be a great success.



Over the festive season we also hosted our annual Tree Lighting Ceremonies in Swords, Blanchardstown & Balbriggan.

Fingal Festival & Events Funding Programme

Following the success of the 2025 programme, which supported over 100 events across the county to the tune of €600,000, applications for the 2026 scheme will close on the 22nd of December. As of 16th December we have received 53 applications.

The programme underlines the Council's commitment to fostering arts, culture, sport, and community engagement, while also delivering economic and tourism benefits in Fingal. Events from local community festivals to large-scale cultural celebrations, this funding ensures that Fingal continues to host a diverse and vibrant calendar of events, providing opportunities for residents and visitors alike to celebrate, participate, and connect.

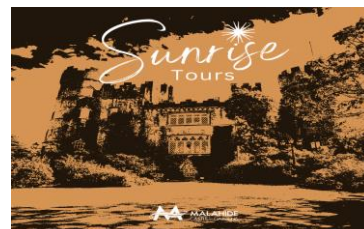
Skerries Mills



Specialist conservation repairs to the 5 Sail Great Windmill at Skerries Mills have been completed with the restoration of one of the damaged sails.

Further conservation work is now required on the 4 Sail windmill following damage caused to one of its sails during recent Storm Bram.

Malahide Castle



Malahide Castle will undergo annual routine cleaning and maintenance in January and will be closed from 12th to 16th inclusive for tours.

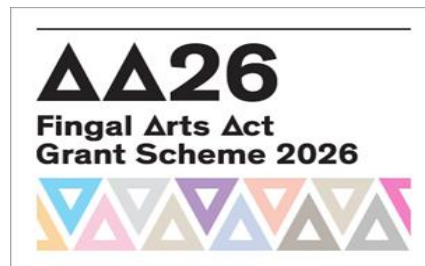
This unique award offers two artists at any stage of their career in any art discipline to explore the print making process.

The residency will provide an ideal environment for the development of a creative project in printmaking and an opportunity to network with other artists.

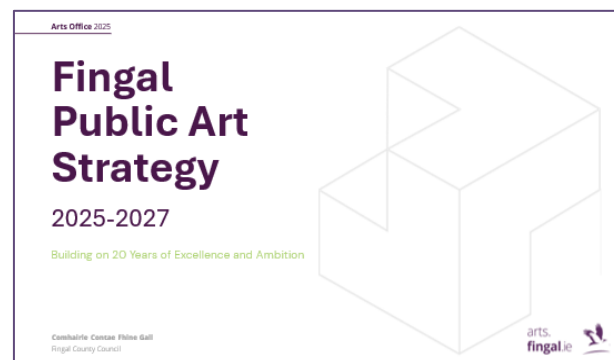
Local Arts Development

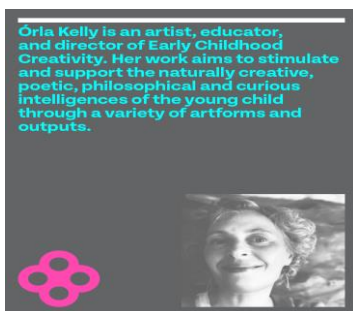
Public Art

This strategy will provide a framework for all requests, sites and themes, including the proposal referenced in this motion, to be considered for inclusion on the schedule of commissioning priorities to be delivered under the Council's capital programme.

Youth & Education



Fingal Arts Office is delighted to announce that artist Órla Kelly has been awarded the Fingal *Exploring & Thinking Bursary Award 2025/2026*.

Exploring and Thinking is a collaborative framework for early childhood arts in the Dublin region, developed by the four Dublin local authorities. It is a significant recognition for artists working in early childhood arts. It provides artists with valuable time, resources, and space to reflect on and deepen their practice. One bursary has been granted per participating local authority involved - artist Órla Kelly (Fingal), David Beattie (Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown), Michelle Henry (South Dublin), and Jane Hackett (Dublin City), highlighting their innovative practices and commitment to creating work with and for marginalised children.

Creative Places Balbriggan



The second artist support clinic from the Creative Places Balbriggan Project was held in December at The Lark Concert Hall.

Emer Ferran from Visual Artist Ireland (VAI) hosted her workshop "Growing My Art Practice – A Practical and Meaningful Guide".

The mainly professional artists from Balbriggan and its surrounds were offered practical career development advice and afterwards there was a focussed group discussion, facilitated by consultant Paul Phelan on socially engaged arts practice and the future possibilities for the artists' support as part of Creative Places Balbriggan project under the Creative Industry pillar of work.

Swords Cultural Quarter

On December 2nd the Arts Office hosted a closed enquiry consultation session with industry leaders which sought to explore what Fingal County Council and the Arts Office need to put in place now to ensure Culture House is ready to support artists and engage audiences successfully. Participants strongly affirmed the potential of SCQ and Culture House as a civic, accessible cultural hub for Swords, stressing the need to clearly define its purpose, identity and values from the outset. Long-term success was seen to depend on an artist-led vision, sustained public investment, early and ongoing community engagement, and a collaborative culture across arts and library teams.

Consultation is ongoing with more sessions planned with arts resource organisations, individual artists and communities in Q1 2026.

Draíocht

Draíocht celebrates its 25th birthday in 2026. We were officially opened in May 2001 by President Mary McAleese. The Arts Centre had opened to the public in February 2001, prior to the official launch date, with a full visual arts and performance programme. Several events are being planned to mark the occasion of our 25th birthday. This includes '25!' An Exhibition of works by recent graduates (past 4 years) and/or early career artists who are from and/or live/work in Fingal. This is an Open call Exhibition with applicants submitting to us by 31st December 2025. The selection panel includes Fingal's County Arts Officer, Sarah O'Neill and Fingal artist, Rich Gilligan. All artists selected to exhibit, will be paid a fee. Given Draíocht's stated commitment to high quality arts provision for children and young people, we are delighted to engage Helen O'Donoghue (previously Head of Education in IMMA) to curate an Exhibition for children in 2026, 2027 and 2028.

After an application process, Lucy Hill has been awarded the 2026 commission.

Another initiative sees Draíocht commission theatre artists Louise Lewis and Veronica Coburn to deliver a piece called 'Other Kitchens' which will be performed in kitchens around Dublin 15 in Autumn 2026. This model is based on our landmark 2018 project, Home Theatre (Ireland) and the subsequent project, 'NEST' in 2024.

Our January/February programme is being distributed. The programme will begin with Coolmine Panto's production of Cinderella and includes 2 sold out performances as part of Fingal's TradFest programme.

We are liaising closely with Fingal's Accessibility Officer on several issues that have arisen recently in relation to queries from people who use wheelchairs. These are in relation to complaints around the wheelchair accessible bathroom facilities in Draíocht being not fit for purpose, wheelchair storage and transfer from a wheelchair into a theatre seat.

2026 is now fully booked and we are actively programming 2027.

Music

Our last gig of the year was Mary Dillon, Neil Martin and Donal O'Connor on December 12 (45 attendees), who created a spellbinding tapestry of traditional and contemporary sounds. Their collaborative efforts breath new life into Ulster songs and tunes, combining Mary's evocative vocals with the expressive interplay of fiddle, cello, harmonium and uilleann pipes. Also within our traditional music programme, we had the Céilí Beag with 14 parents and toddlers on December 12, and we have 35 people booked in to join us for the last Slow Session of the year on Sunday December 21 (13 in person, 22 online as of 15 Dec).

A wonderful way to round out the year, with a warm session in our theatre.

Cinema

Our last cinema event of the year was the heartwarming The Ballad of Wallis Island on December 11, a comedy about an eccentric lottery winner who lives on a remote island and the drama that ensues when he brings his favourite singer to play an exclusive gig on the island (27 attendees). This was combined with our yearly Members Evening, where we invited our members to join us for mulled wine, mince pies and some beautiful guitar music by John Walsh, before the cinema event of the night (40 members, board and staff).

Visual Arts

Our exhibition of paintings by Kate Walsh continues until 30th January 2026. This captivating exhibition showcases Walsh's latest works, bold, expressive paintings that explore memory, identity, and the Irish landscape through a contemporary lens.

In the lead up to Christmas, we held two Christmas Wreath making workshops on December 10 (35 attendees – sold out), combining a festive activity with mulled wine and the famous mince pies from the Cottage Café.



Christmas Craft Fair

We kicked off the month with a wonderful Christmas Craft Fair, with over 60 stalls and 1300 visitors braving the winter weather. It was a hugely successful day, with music from Naul Choir, Blanchardstown Brass Band and Skerries Ukelele Band, with visitors and stall holders alike full of praise for the variety of high-quality products on sale and the efficient management by the Centre. As one stallholder said, 'Thank you for organizing such a wonderful Christmas market. Your hard work, creativity, and dedication made the event truly special.'

With its new, light-filled three-story extension, its lecture and meeting rooms, Creative Zone, public PCs and printing facilities, 3D printer, ample study space and diverse range of stock, the library is equipped to serve the Skerries community into the future. A programme of classes, workshops and talks for all ages has been scheduled throughout the spring to celebrate the reopening of the library. In addition, there will be an extensive programme of events for local schools and a series of workshops for Prosper Fingal. The re-opening of Skerries Library marks a new chapter in the history of this much-loved Carnegie Library.

Donabate Library Moves to Ballisk House



This January, Donabate Library will move from its former location in the community and leisure centre to its new premises in Ballisk House on the Portrane Road. The Mayor of Fingal Cllr. Tom O'Leary will officially launch the new library on 22nd January. The launch will feature the Fanzini street performers, Bohemian Strings string quartet, and a magic show from Reuben the Entertainer for local schoolchildren to enjoy. The new library has a meeting room which will facilitate events, classes and workshops for all ages. Fingal Libraries looks forward to welcoming the community to this space for learning, creativity, and connection.

Spring Programme of Events at Fingal Libraries

The brochure outlining the spring 2026 programme of events in libraries will be available in library branches and on the Fingal Libraries website in January.

The programme runs from January to April and features a wide range of events, workshops and courses for people of all ages supporting literacy, health, culture and creativity, the Irish language, heritage, STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Maths), skills for life, and environmental awareness. Age-friendly and sensory-friendly events are featured in the programme as well as a series of workshops for schools.

St. Brigid's Festival

Fingal Libraries will celebrate the beginning of spring with St. Brigid's Festival events. Jennifer Murphy will explore St. Brigid's Day and the ancient Gaelic season of Imbolc in Balbriggan Library. In Swords Library, Denise Dunne from the Herb School will facilitate a workshop on Irish herbs and wild plants linked with Brigid and early spring. She will also demonstrate how to make a variety of traditional St. Brigid's crosses using rushes. The legend of St. Brigid's magical cloak is the inspiration for children's craft workshops in Malahide and Donabate libraries. There will also be a St. Brigid's themed craft workshop for children in Baldoyle Library.

Healthy Ireland at Your Library



Healthy Ireland at Your Library is a national programme promoting the health, wellbeing, and quality of life of at all life stages. Fingal Libraries 2026 Healthy Ireland Programme will take place across libraries this spring. To promote active living, libraries will host gentle exercise classes, including chair yoga, Tai Chi, and mindful movement.

The Irish Health Foundation's Mobile Health Unit will visit libraries to offer free health checks. The Migraine Association of Ireland will deliver a seminar on migraines in Blanchardstown Library. Also in Blanchardstown Library, scientist and author Dr. David Robert Grimes will investigate the growing threat of health misinformation and ask how we can identify and protect ourselves from bogus health claims.

Age Friendly Events

Sage Advocacy, the National Advocacy Service for Older People, will host a series of talks in Fingal Libraries throughout the spring beginning in Rush Library on 26th January. At this talk, people can find out about Sage Advocacy's work to ensure older people have access to information, support and independent advocacy. A series of information talks on the Healthy Age Friendly Homes Programme will take place throughout the spring, beginning in Baldoyle Library on 20th January. This service is run by Age Friendly Ireland and available to anyone aged 65+ years living at home. It provides a range of supports to enable older people to continue living independently.

Home Energy Savings Clinic



On 13th January, Baldoyle Library will host a demonstration of Codema's Home Energy Saving Kit, available on loan across all libraries in Fingal. Dublin's Energy Agency, Codema, will demonstrate how to use the kit's five easy tools to check for heat loss, insulation issues and appliance energy use. This is a great opportunity to learn low-cost ways of cutting energy bills and boosting home efficiency.

Exhibition for 15th Anniversary of Rush Library



Rush Library will celebrate 15 years of serving the community with an exhibition which runs from 26th January to 21st February. This exhibition will bring together the story of the library and its remarkable past as St. Maur's Church. Discover photographs, historic artefacts, and memories that trace the building's transformation from a place of worship to a vibrant hub of learning and culture. To tie in with the exhibition, there will be a masterclass on creating wedding bouquets using sustainable, seasonal materials. There will also be a craft workshop for children to create stained-glass effect suncatchers.

Creative Ireland

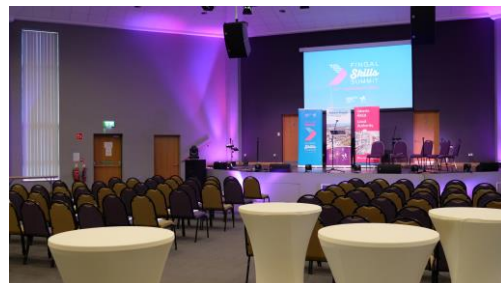

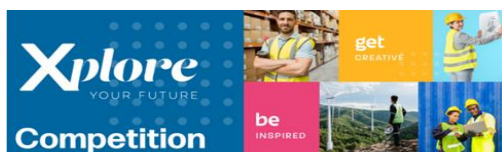
Xplore Your Future Fingal TY Skills Expo - Update - January 2026

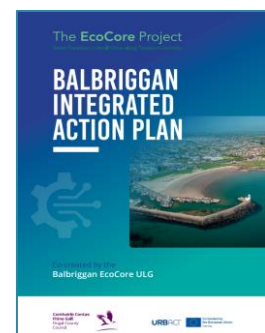

ENTERPRISE CENTRES



Following an agreement by the Boards of Directors of BASE, Beat and Drinan Enterprise Centres to consolidate the management of all three centres, the Council has now formed a new legal entity “Innovate Fingal” to drive innovation and focus on the strategic development of the 3 Enterprise Centres.

The Council approved the lease of BASE and Drinan Enterprise Centres to Innovate Fingal at the April Council Meeting. An official launch event for Innovate Fingal will be scheduled in Q1 2026.

All three Enterprise Centres have space available to start-up businesses and businesses/individuals who wish to avail of remote working options and facilities. Bespoke options or generic office fitouts can be considered. Occupancy rates at the Council's three enterprise centres are all over 90%. The three Enterprise Centres currently support 65 businesses and over 320 direct jobs.

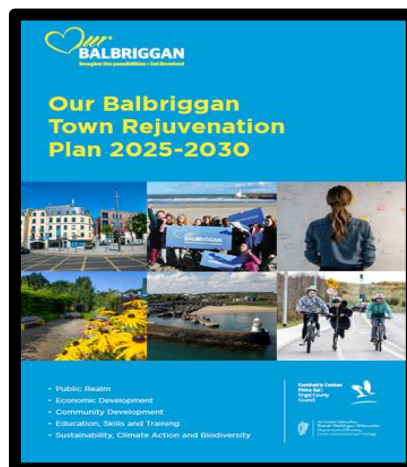
Our Balbriggan 2019 - 2030 Rejuvenation Plan - A Socio-Economic Strategy

The Our Balbriggan Programme Office continues to support the governance of the Balbriggan Leadership Group responsible for the implementation of the Balbriggan Socio-Economic plan 2025 - 2030. Four multi-stakeholder pillar groups meet periodically, to progress opportunities around Economic Development, Education, Skills & Employment, Community Development and Sustainability, Climate Action and Bio-diversity.

The Public Realm Pillar is chaired by the County Architect and reports directly to the Chief Executive, a nominated Pillar Chairperson provides a report to the Leadership Group at each meeting.



The Balbriggan Leadership Group, is independently chaired by Dr. David Begg and provides stewardship and oversight of the implementation of the Balbriggan Socio Economic plan 2025 - 2030. Membership comprises the five Balbriggan locally elected councillors and senior representatives from the Public Sector and Local and Community Development stakeholders.



Members of the Balbriggan Leadership Group and its Pillar Group members met at a special plenary session on December 3rd at the Bracken Court Hotel. The purpose of the session was to mark the successful renewal and adoption of the Our Balbriggan Plan 2025 - 2030. Attendees received updates on Town Rejuvenation Projects and Pillar action workplans progress.

The session, which was very well attended with 60+ participants, provided an opportunity to network, share learnings and opportunities for collaboration.



The Council appointed contractor John Craddock Ltd on the redevelopment of the Quay Street, Harbour & Environs area in Q2 2024. Work is due to be substantially completed in Spring 2026. Work continues to progress well across key elements of the Quay Street & Harbour site.



Phase 5 works are underway with the heritage restoration of the RNLI Boathouse building continuing, the restoration works are due for completion in Q1 2026.

The new public toilets, harbour pavilion buildings and kiosks are progressing well. Paving works to the Harbour Pavillion buildings have commenced. The kiosk, Harbour Buildings, and Public Toilet are due for completion by February 2026. It is intended the buildings will be operational end Q2 2026.

Works are nearing completion on 2 new pedestrian bridges, and extensive bedded planting is due for completion shortly. Site investigations to determine soil quality, and any remediation works required, continue, on the site of Balbriggan's old gas works, which is part of the new Harbour Square development. Ongoing monitoring will continue to January 2026.

Following the November Swords/Balbriggan ACM a Section 38 Non-Statutory Public Consultation for the Quay Street & Environs Traffic Management Scheme was published on Consult.ie, closing date for submissions is 17th December 2025. Fingal County Council intends to carry out a series of traffic control measures in Georges Hill, Mill Street, Quay Street, Harbour Road and Seapoint Lane in the first half of 2026.



Tender documentation to appoint a contractor for the redevelopment of 2-4 Dublin Street were published on October 24th, with tender submissions due back by December 12th. The property and adjoining commercial unit are set to be transformed into a new Creative Hub with 8 workspaces at 2 Dublin Street and an ancillary connected space at 4 Dublin Street which will support STEAM education, digital learning, training and enterprise activities supported by Fingal Arts Office & local stakeholders. Subject to a successful tender process, substantial completion is expected in 2027.



An Integrated Design Team, McCullough Mulvin Architects, have been appointed for the DeBruns site and are progressing work on design options based on best possible uses and site constraints. Stakeholder engagement sessions with local community, civic and business groups, and neighbouring properties were completed, insights gained have been incorporated into a pre-design report. Options contained in the report have undergone preliminary scrutiny, based on scheme objectives and financial and economic viability on a preferred option is emerging. It is intended to proceed to a Part 8 planning public consultation process in the first half of 2026.

A Feasibility Study for a Swim Platform has been completed by Langan Consulting (Marine) Engineers. The Programme Office are reviewing the proposed options and costs before progressing with next steps.

An Internal Project Team has been established from the Town Regeneration Office, Our Balbriggan Programme Office and FCC Architects to progress the Boathouse and Bathhouse project. Based on the current programme, a public planning process is likely to commence in Q1 2026 with construction commencing in late 2026 allowing completion of the project in Q3 2027.



Our Balbriggan Programme Office continues to work with the Operations Department on a programme of works to enhance spaces for young people. Three locations have been completed in Millpond, Bremore and Charlie Moore Parks.

Following the publication of a Draft Open Spaces Scheme for Balbriggan, Chieftan's Drive / Moylaragh Road on Consult.ie in June, and a presentation to the Balbriggan ACM in September installation will commence Q1 2026 and include a Half MUGA, and other outdoor enhancements including seating.

The Our Balbriggan Office continues to generate regular and unique content across all social media channels, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, LinkedIn with over 14,400+ followers across its 5 social media channels. 1,742 posts were published during the period 1st January – 31st October 2025.

Town Centre First – Lusk

Following the publication of the Lusk for Life Plan, two applications for Project Development Measure funding were submitted to the Department of Rural and Community Development with both projects being approved for funding.

These projects were identified in the Lusk Town Centre First Plan and include measures to develop appropriate facilities in Lusk's Central Parks and the feasibility of a farmers' market for Lusk.

A feasibility study examining possible locations for the creation of a farmers' market has been completed by an appointed consultant, and its recommendations are being examined by the appropriate team for inclusion in their plans for 2026. A consultant was appointed to examine options for the enhancement of four specific parks in the Lusk area to maximise their potential for public amenity usage.

A public consultation took place in the Lusk Community Cultural Centre on 24 October to gather ideas for the use of these locations from the residents of Lusk. This was a very well attended event with many residents turning up to give their views. An online community engagement survey also ran from 24th of October until 07th of November to give as many residents and community groups as possible in Lusk the opportunity to have their say. 199 responses were received. The evaluation of these responses and corresponding coordination of plans for the aforementioned four parks is ongoing.



The first meeting of the new Town Team took place on the 02nd of December, where a new chairperson, Lynne Barker, was selected by those present.

A second meeting of the town team took place on the 17th of December where planning for Town Team projects and a community forum in Lusk were discussed and the Terms of Reference were agreed.



Town Centre First – Balrothery

The new Balrothery Town Team is now established and focused on implementing the new Balrothery Town Centre First Health Check.

The new Town Centre First Health Check was launched by the Deputy Mayor of Fingal, Councillor Grainne Maguire, on 06th of November at the Heritage Centre, Balrothery.

This plan will focus on the actions identified by residents and businesses in Balrothery, and will assist the new town team in accessing government funding for identified projects.

The launch event was a great success and was well attended by local residents, business operators and stakeholders. The Town Regeneration Office thanks all those who participated in the capacity building process in Balrothery over the past number of months and looks forward to working with the new Town Team into the future.



Town Centre First – Ballyboughal

Ballyboughal's new Town team has been established, and the new Town Centre First Health Check for Ballyboughal is also completed.

The health check was launched by the Deputy Mayor of Fingal, Councillor Grainne Maguire, on 11th November. This is a culmination of many months of hard work and dedication from members of the community, and the Town Regeneration Office is very grateful to all who took part.

The Health Check contains actions and objectives which the new town team have identified, and these actions will have a pivotal impact in creating a village which better caters for all of its residents and businesses. The launch event on 11th November was of key importance in creating public awareness for both the plan and the new Town Team. The existence of such a plan will also enable the Town Team to apply for government funding to aid with the completion of identified projects.

The Town Regeneration Office looks forward to working closely with the new town team to help deliver key enhancements to the village for the people of Ballyboughal.



Town Centre First – Donabate

A launch event took place in the Parish Hall, Donabate on the 07th October, where the Mayor of Fingal launched the Donabate Town Centre First Health Check for the town. The event was attended by members of the new Town Team, officials from Fingal County Council, and many locals stakeholders who participated in the capacity building process throughout the year. This plan will benefit the new Town Team in helping them to address actions identified during the capacity building process and provide a mechanism to apply for government funding.

The Town Regeneration Office looks forward to working closely with the new Town Team in Donabate in the months and years ahead and wishes to thank all those who participated in the process.



Town Centre First – Rush

Throughout 2025 the Town Regeneration Office conducted a series of capacity building workshops in Rush with a view to establishing a new Town Team. During these workshops a facilitator assisted stakeholders to identify key actions to improve the functionality and vibrancy of their town. Simultaneously, the Town Regeneration Office appointed a second town planning consultant to devise a new Town Centre First Plan for Rush.

Intensive work has taken place on both of these processes throughout the year, with a new Town Team established for Rush, and a new Town Centre First plan for the town produced. A Launch event for the Rush Town Centre First Plan is being planned in 2026.

The inaugural meeting of the new Town Team took place on the 4th November, at which the new Town Centre First Plan was approved, and local resident Chris Rooney was selected as Chairperson by those present.

A second meeting was held on the 25th of November where progress was made regarding the agreement of operational procedures for the Town Team.



Town & Village Renewal Schemes

The Town Regeneration Office is currently facilitating two approved projects under the Town & Village Renewal Scheme from 2023.

A Phase 4 development of Floraville Park in Skerries (€55,800) and upgrades to the Rush Community Centre (€64,350) have been approved by the Department of Rural and Community Development. Work has recently been completed on Rush Community Centre. Phase one works on the Floraville Park, Skerries project have also been completed, with Phase two works due for completion in quarter one of 2026. A new call for projects in 2025 was announced by the Department of Rural and Community Development and the Gaeltacht in March 2025. The Town Regeneration Office sought and received Expressions of Interests from a wide variety of internal and external stakeholder groups by the closing date of 13 June 2025. Five applications which best met the eligibility requirements of the scheme have been selected and submitted by Fingal County Council to the Department of Rural and Community Development & The Gaeltacht totalling €1,035,450. The Town Regeneration Office expects to receive a response on these applications from the department in the coming months.



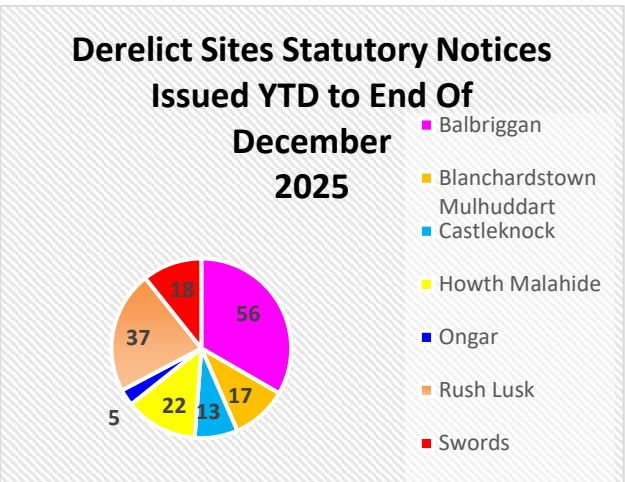
Streetscape Enhancement Scheme 2024

In the most recent Streetscape Enhancement Scheme, nine applications were approved for funding totalling €12,635.28 for a variety of works including painting, green enhancement, and signage improvement. This scheme has now concluded, and options for a new scheme are being explored.

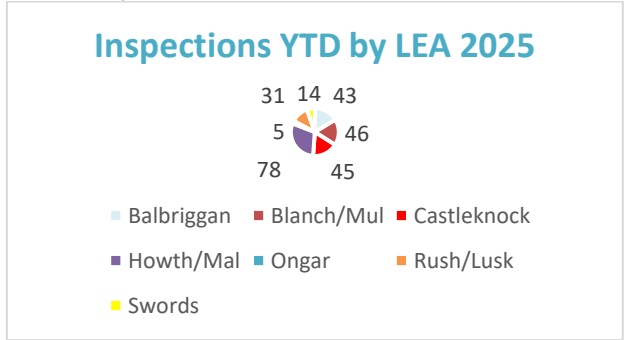


Derelict Sites

168 statutory notices have issued to owners of Derelict properties under the Derelict Sites Act 1990 since the start of 2025. 5 properties have been removed from the Derelict Sites Register since the start of 2025 following compliance with Section 11 Notices. This brings the current number of properties on the Derelict Sites Register to 28.



There have been a total of 262 inspections and re-inspections carried out year to date in 2025 through referrals from members of the public and through the activity of the Derelict Sites team.



The Derelict Sites team continues to focus on engagement with the owners of these derelict sites and will continue identifying further derelict sites across the county.

The Town Regeneration Office actively encourages the reporting of potential derelict sites. Referrals can be made by accessing the Report Form on Fingal County Council's public website and emailing the completed form to derelictsites@fingal.ie

Local Enterprise Week 2026

There will be a host of other events both in person and online covering areas such as food business, digital, productivity, sustainability and exporting. The launch of Local Enterprise week takes place on January 30th in County Hall Swords.

Fingal Business Network



The final Fingal Business Network event of 2025 took place at the Grand Hotel, Malahide on Friday 5th December. Over 150 business leaders, entrepreneurs and SME owners attended the event, which featured an inspiring keynote address by Mark Little on the theme “Innovating in an Age of Chaos”. Mark shared practical insights on resilience and growth in uncertain times, drawing on his experience. Deirdre Carroll, Senior Enterprise Development Officer, welcomed attendees and set the tone for the event before introducing keynote speaker Mark Little and MC Noel Davidson.

The event was officially opened by Mayor of Fingal, Cllr Tom O’Leary, who highlighted the importance of adaptability for businesses in a changing world. AnnMarie Farrelly, Chief Executive of Fingal County Council, reinforced the creativity and resilience of Fingal’s business community and outlined the supports available through the Local Enterprise Office Fingal. Closing remarks were delivered by Oisín Geoghegan, Head of Enterprise, who thanked attendees and encouraged continued engagement in 2026. The afternoon concluded with a festive networking lunch, offering participants a relaxed setting to strengthen relationships, explore collaboration opportunities and share ideas.

Fingal Business Supports Briefing



On December 10th LEO Fingal delivered its monthly *Business Supports Briefing*, drawing 109 online registrants and earning excellent feedback from participants. The session featured an interactive Q&A, giving attendees the chance to connect directly with the LEO team.

December's event was particularly well attended by local entrepreneurs, who gained practical insights into training options, mentorship programmes, and available grant supports. The next briefing will take place online on February 4th.

Demand continues to rise for initiatives such as Business Advice Clinics, Start Your Own Business Courses, and Grant Application Workshops. Fingal Business Supports Briefings are designed to offer instant access to expert guidance on all LEO programmes. As always, the LEO Fingal team are on hand with live Q&A and one-to-one consultations to help business owners plan their next steps.

Food Sectoral Supports



Dublin Food Chain is a food sector networking and business development platform run by the four LEOs in the Dublin region, supported by Bord Bia. The biennial producer showcase being held on 29th January in the Crowne Plaza Blanchardstown for producers to meet buyers from Ireland's large multiples. Over 27 buyers are confirmed to attend this valuable event to meet over 47 food producers paid up to exhibit.

LEO Fingal will also be leading the first Food Starter programme (for start-up food producers) commencing on 13th of January for 4 weeks.

Evaluations and Approvals Committee

The Evaluation and Approvals Committee (EVAC) has approved 63 Financial Supports worth a total of €1,127,085 in 2025 including 51 projects worth €823,623 in grants across the Feasibility, Priming & Expansion grant schemes. The next EVAC meeting is scheduled for February 2026.

Management Development



The Leadership for Business Acceleration programme concluded the lecture and in-person part of the programme on November 20th and participants are now working on finalising their business plans.

Graduation is scheduled for 12th March 2026 along with the launch of the first 2026 programme. The programme has proven invaluable to clients, resulting in tangible growth, increased employment, and greater ambition. Expressions of interest links are open for interested parties for the March session.

Sustainability Supports



The Local Enterprise Office (LEO) provides expertise and incentives to enable small businesses to reduce their carbon footprint and become more sustainable. The Local Enterprise Office has delivered the Green for Business programme to 38 Fingal based businesses Year to date which then allows the businesses to apply for the Energy Efficiency Grant if eligible. The Energy Efficiency Grant provides funding of up to a maximum of €10,000 and 75% of eligible costs, to enable small businesses to acquire energy efficient equipment and processes. To apply, businesses need to be operating from a commercial premises, be solvent and operating within Fingal for at least six months. This year has seen an increase in interest in this scheme with enquiries coming from across several sectors. 18 companies have been approved for grant assistance under this scheme in 2025 with several businesses currently working on applications for 2026

Business Advice Clinics and Mentoring



LEO Fingal provides one to one business support services through Business Advice Clinics and a Mentoring programme, both online and in person. These services are provided free of charge to small businesses and are extremely popular. The Fingal mentor panel features 35 skilled and experienced mentors from a range of business backgrounds. In 2025 some 645 clients availed of one-to-one appointments in Business Advice Clinics and 350 clients signed up for mentoring, with consistently high demand for this service among Fingal businesses.

Business Loan scheme

LEO Fingal provides a loan scheme through its partnership with Microfinance Ireland (MFI), with loans between €5,000 and €50,000 per approved applicant. LEO Fingal actively promotes the availability of finance to businesses that have difficulty raising funding from their bank. Applications are processed and assessed by LEO Fingal and submitted to MFI. Applications are eligible for a 1% reduced interest rate of 5.5% APR if submitted to and processed by the Local Enterprise Office.

In 2025 40 MFI loan applications were processed. Anyone applying for MFI through LEO Fingal will be supported by an expert mentor who guides applicants through the application process to help maximise their prospect of approval.

Training and Events

LEO Fingal continues to provide vital training to owner/managers with 3,036 participants year to date. Thirteen Start Your Own Business courses were organised during 2025, with 154 participants year to date.

Internationalisation and Export Development

The new "Market Explorer Grant" is available to small enterprises in the manufacturing and international trading sectors (with up to 50 employees). The amount of the grant is 50% of eligible costs up to a maximum of €10,000.

The objective is to support the development of export-oriented businesses by incentivising support to research and explore activities in new markets. Eligible businesses can seek to explore either a new geographic market for an existing product/service or an existing geographic market for a new product/service. LEO Fingal has approved seven applications for this grant year to date in the amount of €49,010, with interest in the grant increasing and several businesses currently working on submissions for 2026.

Digital & Innovation Supports



The Grow Digital Voucher offers small and medium businesses with up to 50 employees financial support to embrace digital technology. Prior to applying for the voucher, businesses will receive expert digital consulting service completely free of charge in the LEO's "Digital for Business" scheme.

Funding of up to €5,000 to invest in software and training/IT configuration is available under the Grow Digital Voucher Scheme. LEO Fingal have approved 56 Digital for Business assignments year to date and have also approved 14 Grow Digital Vouchers total funding of €38,557. LEO Fingal organises a regular Digital Boost Webinar to assist business in applying for both Digital for Business and Grow Digital Voucher and to help businesses thrive in this digital age.

Productivity & Competitiveness Supports



Lean into working smarter, not harder!

Lean For Business is designed to encourage clients to adopt Lean business principles in their organisations to increase performance and competitiveness. Lean is for all companies, regardless of sector – not just for manufacturing companies. LEO Fingal supports approved clients with a consultant who use LEAN tools and techniques that help companies across the globe to address competitiveness issues within their businesses by building the capability of their people, to identify problems, improve operations and create a more innovative organisation.

Nineteen clients have been approved and are currently undertaking this programme in 2025. A regular free workshop takes place online, attendees learn from LEO Fingal LEAN consultants about "Lean Thinking, & How Small Changes can have a Big Impact!"

Showcase Ireland 2026



Showcase Ireland 2026 will take place from January 18-20, 2026 at the RDS, Dublin. Showcase is presented by Design & Crafts Council Ireland, Enterprise Ireland and Local Enterprise Offices and supported by the Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment. This four-day trade show is recognised as one of Ireland's largest international trade shows and offers manufacturers, designers and craft makers the opportunity to exhibit their new collections. LEO Fingal has been allocated a number of stands for this event.

Following a selection process, the successful applicants who have been chosen to represent LEO Fingal are: Rablos Art Studio, Snugz Play Limited, Nicola Weldon Art and Design, Irish Whiskey Glass Ltd - (TA Túath Glass), Church Lane ceramics, Vitalorganico and Wineandwhiskeyracks.ie.

These craft & design businesses are all offered full support in terms of training and mentoring by LEO Fingal focussed on sales techniques for craft producers who are displaying & selling their work at exhibitions.

Works Programme

Newbridge

A new landscape scheme has been completed at the Cul de sac of Berwick grove and Abbeyvale Grove. This pollinator landscape scheme was completed as part of the POWs.



Works have recommenced on the removal of Laurel (and other invasive species) from the woodland of Newbridge demesne. These works are part of woodland management plan and started in early October by a specialist contractor and also FCC staff. Where invasive species have been removed, regeneration will be augmented by replanting at appropriate sections.



Swords

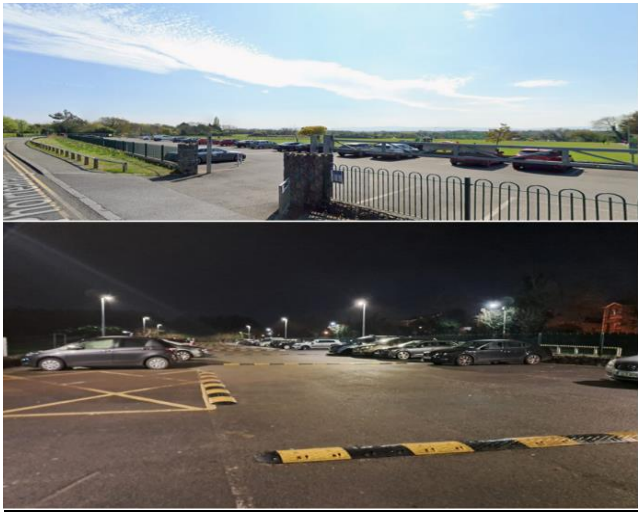

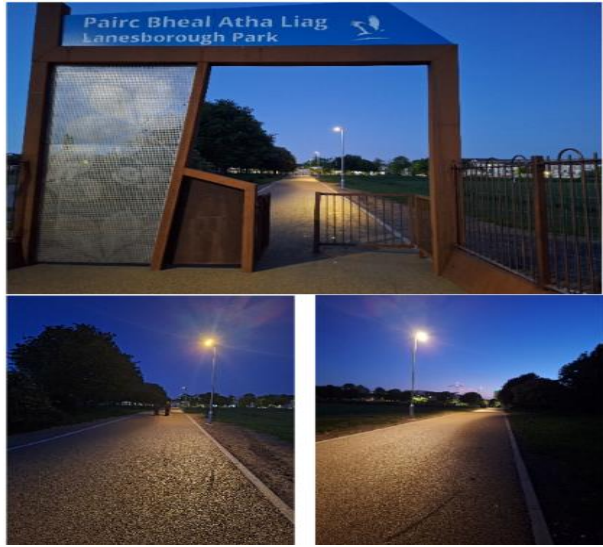

Public Lighting Column Replacement and Cable Upgrade Programme 2025

Works on the public lighting column replacement programme are ongoing.

Under this programme, public lighting columns that are end of life or in very poor condition are being replaced. Legacy cable issues where the ESB Networks supply cable is directly into the public lighting columns are also being addressed under the column replacement programme to bring these cable installations up to current wiring standards.

In 2025, 172 no. public lighting columns were replaced county-wide under this programme. Most of the column replacements undertaken this year focused mainly on replacing the columns that are directly fed from the ESB Networks main supply, and the majority of these works were carried out in the Dublin 15 areas of Mulhuddart and Clonsilla. As part of these column replacement works, extensive cable upgrade works were also undertaken in Thormanby Lawns in Howth, and in Lohunda Estate in Clonsilla.

Public Lighting General Maintenance Carried out in 2025

Fingal County Council maintain 36,000 lights throughout the county. All lights are scouted by the night patroller every 2-3 weeks and he logs any lights out on each patrol route. Faulty lights are also reported via public representatives and members of the public. Almost 4,000 public lighting faults and emergencies were attended to and repaired in 2025.

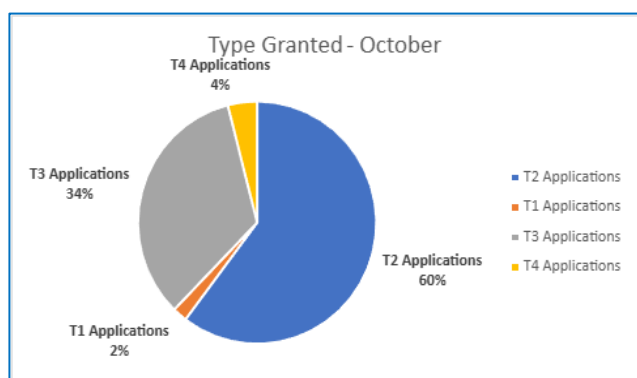
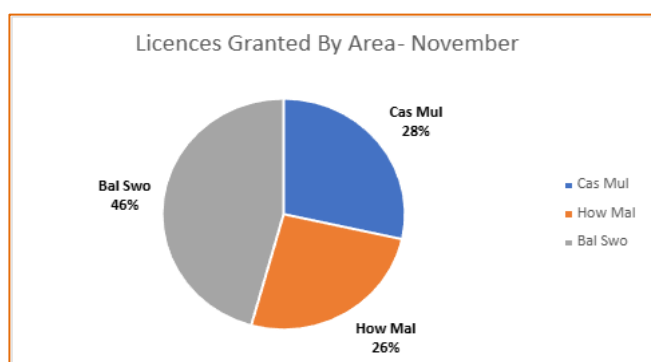
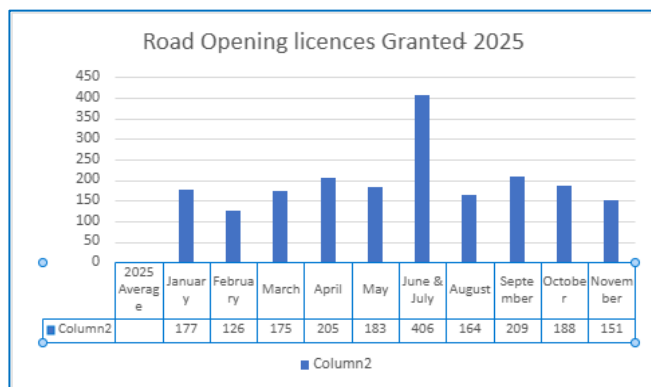


Licenses

- Road Opening Licenses

The Licensing Unit continues to process and manage the licensing system for the County. Applications are allocated by area for examination and conditioning which includes reviews of the existing carriageway, footpaths, cycleways, and grass verges. Applicants submit temporary traffic management plans for review to ensure all works are carried out safely within the public domain.

151 Licences were granted in the month of November, **38% of which were granted by way of automation**. Clerk of Works in each area continue to carry out regular inspections following road opening works by Utilities.



Bus Enhancement Scheme

The Council received a grant of €500,000 for 2026 from the NTA. A list of proposed works at 20 locations were sent to the NTA as pre-approval was required prior to works commencing. In September 2025 the Council received approval totalling €300,000 to proceed with 13 bus stop works. This has been allocated between the 4 operational areas of Howth/Malahide, Dublin 15, Swords and Balbriggan and works are underway.

➤ Howth Malahide Area

There are four existing bus stops approved for bus enhancements. These are in Malahide at James's Terrace and Church Road. The other location is in Howth on Thormanby Road adjacent to the Howth Summit. The locations have been approved by the NTA. There was a successful tender ran which was evaluated and the successful Contractor is currently being appointed. Works are to start very shortly on site.

➤ Balbriggan/Rush-Lusk/Swords Area

There are two bus stops approved for enhancements on the R127 Skerries Road in Balbriggan. The upgrade includes the installation of new seating, and these works will be undertaken by direct labour. Works are due to start in December and completion is anticipated in early January.

➤ Castleknock/Mulhuddart Area

Five bus stop enhancement projects received grant approval by the NTA in the Castleknock/Mulhuddart area. Tenders were issued, received and reviewed and a tender report was issued to the NTA for approval. Three of these projects received approval to be uploaded onto the NTA PRS System for formal approval. These are located on the Ratoath Road (L3080) and two on the R122 close to the National Reception Centre, Baleskin, Dubber. These have been uploaded to the NTA PRS System, and we are awaiting formal approval from the NTA to proceed with the works. It is envisioned that the works will commence in January 2026.

Grass Pitch Applications 2025/26

Fingal County Council have completed the grass pitch allocation process for the 2025/2026 playing season. In total the Council has received a total of 74 applications throughout the administrative area. All 74 clubs have paid in full. We are currently running on close to full capacity for grass pitches throughout the county.

Casual Trading License

Fingal County Council has a total of 44 valid Casual Trading Licences for the 2025/26 trading season covering trading of hot food, tea and coffee, ice cream and flowers.

All 44 traders are fully licenced for the 2025/26 trading season. We are currently processing 2 additional applications. The Operations Department is in regular communication with our traders and area inspections continue to be carried out to ensure compliance and assist in delivery of quality service. Once the 2 additional applications are processed, we will have a total of 46 Casual Traders operating in the Fingal administrative area, the highest number to date.



Pilot Scheme Beach Mobile Saunas

Fingal County Council has extended the Mobile Sauna Pilot Scheme to operate from the 1st of October 2025 to the 31st of March 2026 under the off-peak seasonal license.

We now have a total of 3 mobile sauna trading units operating at different locations throughout the county.

Seasonal licences have been issued under the Casual Trading Bye-Laws 2021.

Street Furniture Licences

A total of 32 Street Furniture Licences have been issued in 2025.



Harbours

Skerries Harbour:

The outer pier (constructed in the 1960s) has surpassed its engineering design life. Accordingly, this section of pier was closed and declared off-limits to all during Summer 2025.

Design studies and a preliminary design to encapsulate the existing pier and construct a new, larger pier around it were completed in 2024. Planning Approval for the proposal was granted by An Bord Pleanála on 4th September 2024.

The Council submitted an application for Foreshore Licences (2) to the Department of Agriculture, Food & Marine (DAFM) in December 2024. These licences are currently being progressed by DAFM.

Emergency Works - During 2025 extensive regular inspections and monitoring of the pier have been ongoing and the rate of deterioration has been rapidly accelerating over the course of the year with evidence of increased loss of material from within the pier creating a number of cavities which increases the risk of a sudden collapse of the pier.





Emergency Stabilisation Works are currently out to tender and a contractor is to be appointed in early February to fill the cavities with concrete in an effort to stem the rate of loss of material from within the pier pending the grant of licences from DAFM and the permanent construction of the new pier. It is important to be aware that this work cannot render the pier safe and fit for use. Funding is provided in the Capital Budget for these works.

Balbriggan Harbour:

Operations Department will carry out maintenance dredging of Balbriggan Harbour so as to restore navigation and berthing facilities within. Approximately, on average, 1m+ depth of sediment is to be removed from throughout the harbour basin. Tender documents are nearing completion for the procurement of a suitable contractor.

The Exempted Development Planning Application, to carry out the maintenance dredging was lodged with the Council's Planning Department in accordance with Section 5 of the Planning and Development Act 2000 and the decision is currently under review.

An application is also being prepared for submission to the Maritime Area Regulatory Authority (MARA) for Marine Usage Licence (MUL). This licence is required before maintenance dredging can be carried out. MARA application process can take two years or more.

Loughshinny Harbour:

The Operations Department also proposes to dredge a channel alongside the pier in Loughshinny, to improve navigation and berthing facilities. Ayesa Consulting Engineers were appointed during the summer of 2025 to undertake the necessary surveys, nature assessment, design etc. The process, which is similar to that for the Balbriggan dredging, is still at a very early stage and again a MARA licence will be required. A conservative timeframe for when dredging could take place is 2027/8.



A section of the pier head at Loughshinny Harbour has been temporarily closed due to damage caused by Storm Bram, affecting a portion of the capping beam and the last access ladder. Consultants have been engaged, and a repair proposal is scheduled for submission in early January. The closure is not expected to disrupt fishing operations or vessel access to the pier.

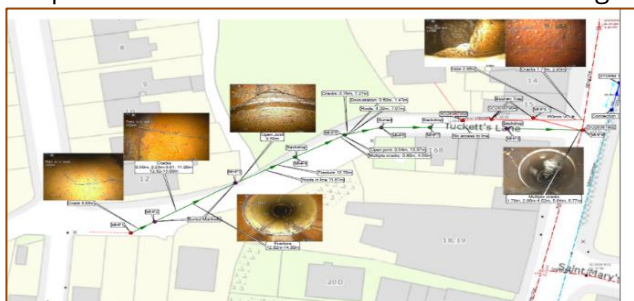
Stormwater Capital Programme 2025-2027

Fingal County Council are continuing to progress projects in the 2025-2027 Stormwater Capital Programme. The 3-year programme includes 16 projects estimated at €1.7 million. Below is a brief update in relation to the status of some of the projects.

Howth Stormwater Culvert:

This project consists of the design and construction of a Stormwater culvert replacement on Howth Main Street (Work Package A) and the separation of a combined sewer on Tuckett's Lane, Howth (Work Package B).

The installation of a new surface water line on Tucketts Lane will commence on January 19th, 2026 to be carried out by FCC Direct Labour crews and a road closure will be in place. On Work package A the preliminary design is complete with the preferred option to lay a new 1200mm SW pipe on Main Street and Harbour Road to replace the existing defective sections of culvert. Further GPR surveys and site investigations Works are planned in order to inform the detailed design.



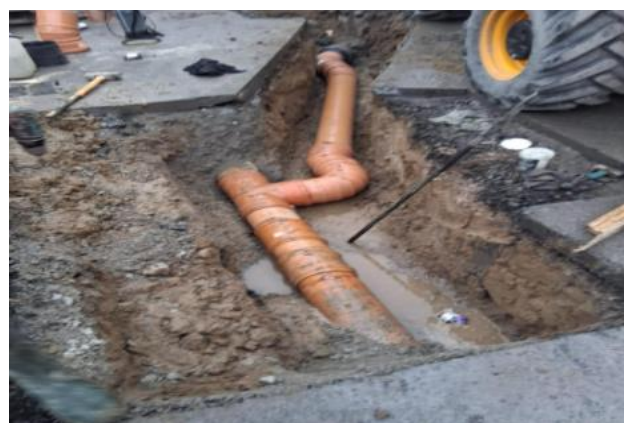

Lusk Network Remedial Works:

A works schedule has been developed to carry out additional pipeline repairs between Post Office Road and Chapel Road to complete Phase 3 of the above project. The site works are scheduled to start in February 2026.

Howth Stormwater Network Repairs

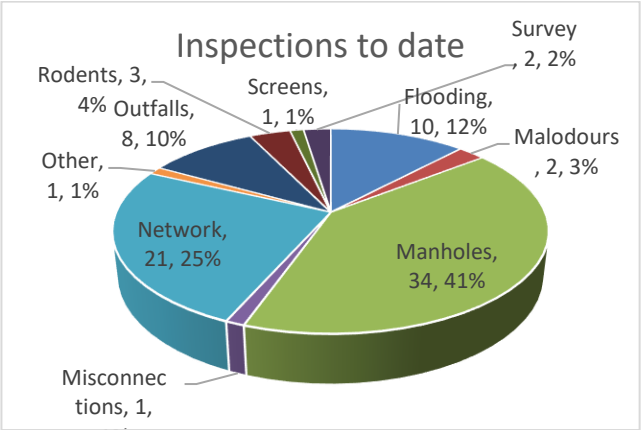
Following investigation works network improvements were identified for the Church Street, Dunbo Hill and R105 areas of Howth. Works commenced on site in November under a road closure. Project completion is estimated to take 6 weeks. To date 100m of pipeline has been installed, 4 gullies and 3 manholes have been repaired and re-benched. Procurement will commence in early January for full width road reinstatement

Survey works in the Hilltown, Forrest Avenue, Rathingle Road, Cherry Garth and Rivervalley Lawns estates were completed in July. The completed reports were broken down into a number of work packages. A contractor will be appointed to start works in February 2026. Minor advanced interventions by a Direct labour crew are ongoing.

Several defects were identified from a survey on the Stormwater line that runs along the R132. This survey report has been separated out into works packages. A tender process will commence in January 2026 to procure specialised Contractors to carry out repair works.

Malahide/Portmarnock

Chalfont Estate invasive repair work was completed in late May. 25 UV CIPP Liners were installed by a specialized contractor in late August. The Project is now complete except for a 3rd party utility intrusion to be removed by them.

Surveys were carried out in Mount Symon, D15. A possible Foul to Storm misconnection has been identified with large volumes of Stone, Silt and roots identified in the lines. Remedial works will require additional dye testing, surveys and the installation of a UV CIPP liner to repair defects if required. The work has been awarded to a specialised contractor and a start date is to be agreed.

Airside Motor Park

Following reports of flooding at Airside Motor Park, investigations determined that a flow control device had become blocked by the presence of general waste and oil in the line. A clean-up and containment programme was conducted to stop this material from polluting downstream watercourses. In total, around 120m³ of oil and waste material was removed from the network. Investigations are ongoing by the FCC Environment Department to locate the source with assistance from the Stormwater Unit.



Ironworks

Stormwater manhole cover and frame replacement is ongoing countywide. Manhole cover and frame replacements were carried along Main St. Howth and in the Chalfont estate in Malahide.

Underground Stormwater storage Assets

Continuing Identification and recording of underground storm water management assets county wide.

Pre-emptive Maintenance Jetting programme

Work has recently begun on a countywide preventative maintenance programme. A specialist Contractor has been procured to carry out maintenance and preemptive jetting on several networks. These networks have been identified as suffering from slow flows and tend to fill with silt and debris. Jetting works were carried out along Yellow Walls Road and in the Mourne View estate in Skerries.

Outfall Upgrades/Maintenance

Following reports of damage to a Stormwater screen along Dublin Road in Baldoyle, a Contractor has been appointed to remove the existing end of life screen and replace it with a new unit. Works are now complete, and the screen has been replaced.



Outfall Cleaning & Maintenance

Ongoing weekly maintenance continues on the major Coastal Outfalls in Skerries, Howth & Sutton. Inland Outfall cleaning was also carried out in December ahead of Storm Bram.

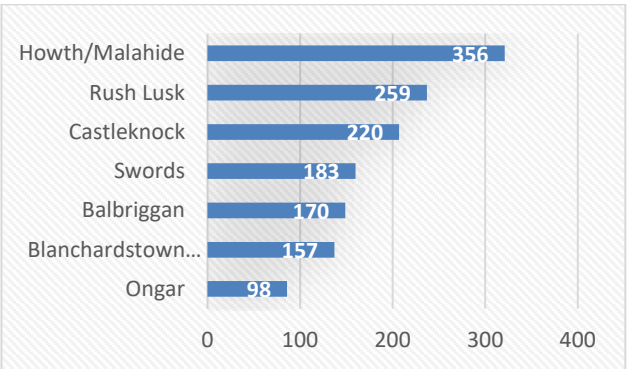

Planning Applications

Between 1st January and 30th November 2025, a total of 1,471 planning applications were received, including 1,132 electronic applications via the national portal. Of these, 338 applications were deemed invalid, resulting in 1,133 valid applications. The accompanying bar chart illustrates the distribution of applications across various areas.



During the same period, 16 Large-scale Residential Development applications were submitted to the Local Authority, with 11 granted decisions issued on LRD applications.

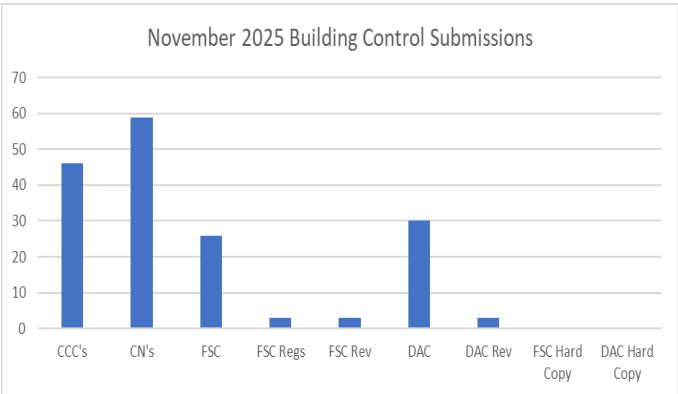
Additionally, An Coimisiún Pleanála has not issued any decisions on Strategic Housing Development applications during this period.

Planning Decisions

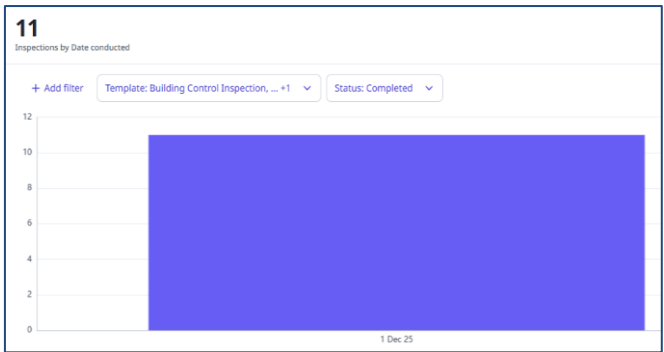
Between 1st January and 30th November 2025, a total of 1,362 planning decisions were issued. This includes 1,008 decisions to grant permission and 274 refusals of permission.

Building Control Admin

In November 2025, there were 171 building control submissions made via BCMS. This was made up of 59 Commencement notices, 46 Compliance of Completion Certificates, 32 Fire Safety related Certificates, 33 Disability Access related Certificates and one dispensation/relaxation. Commencement notices and Compliance on Completion Certificates are submitted through the Projects module on BCMS. Fire Safety, Disability Access, Regularisation and Dispensation/ Relaxation Certificate applications can be submitted online via the Applications module on BCMS, and the Council accepts hard copy applications directly into the office. Most applications are now being submitted via the online system. The Building Control Admin team processed 87 decisions in November 2025 relating to Fire Safety and Disability Access Certificates. This was made up of 47 decisions to grant, 38 extensions of time and 2 invalids.

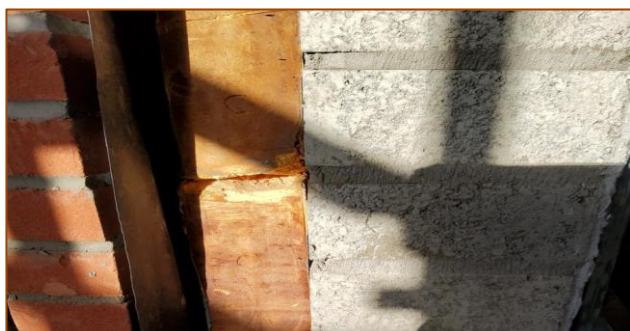

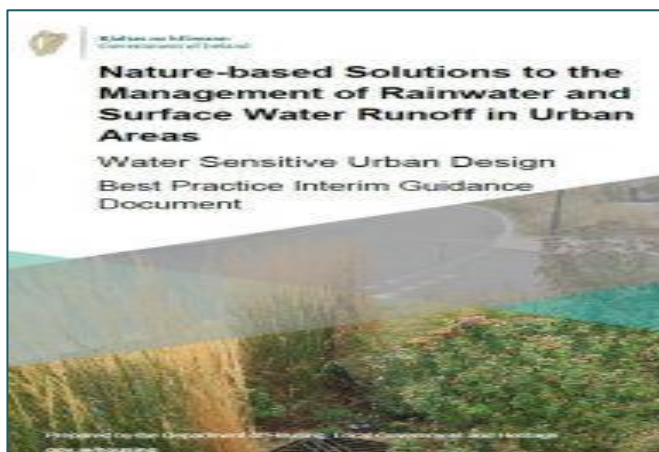

Development Management

- WSFP continue to work on new LRD applications, planning files, additional information files, clarification of additional information files and compliances.
- WSFP continue to support pre-planning consultations with developers to discuss issues related to the provision of water services and to ensure the implementation of flood risk management and sustainable drainage systems on site.
- A new document "Nature-based Solutions to the Management of Rainwater and Surface Water Runoff in Urban Areas - Water Sensitive Urban Design - Best Practice Interim Guidance Document" has been issued by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage. It is intended as a high-level best practice interim guidance document for all those whose work impacts on the urban environment, for urban planners and all built environment professionals involved in the planning process such as engineers, architects and landscape architects and shows how to move towards a more systematic and sustainable approach to urban planning and design that seeks to mimic the natural water balance of rural areas through "water sensitive urban design".

- Sustainable Drainage System (SuDS) – The Fingal SuDS guidance document (Green/Blue Infrastructure for Development) has been reviewed to include changes in technical standards. This document along with the SFRA documents have been incorporated into the new development plan.



Incorporating Sustainable Drainage Systems in Residential Developments



The GDSDS has outlined SuDS as a sustainable way to manage surface water as we prepare to meet the challenges of climate change. This example of Millers Glen in Swords, shows an example of surface water being held onsite, providing treatment via appropriate planting, and then discharging at greenfield runoff rate. This is a move away from the traditional method of collecting all surface water via piped systems which can often no longer manage the intense rainfall's being experienced.

Domestic SuDS Guide

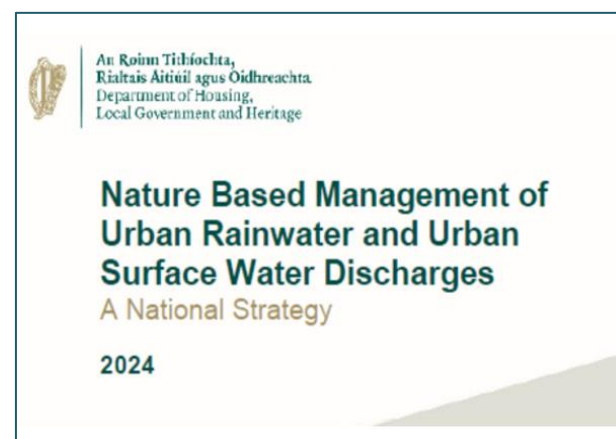
McCloys Consulting Engineers were appointed to produce a Domestic SuDS Guide for FCC. This was completed in Q3 2024, the guide is available on Fingal's website along with a short presentation video.

Green Blue Roofs Guidance Document

McCloys Consulting Engineers have been appointed to produce a Green Blue Roofs Guidance Document for FCC. This was awarded in Q3 2024 and was completed in Q3 2025. A short promotional video is expected in Q4 2025.

National Guidance

The Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage has issued "Nature Based Management of Urban Rainwater and Urban Surface Water Discharges A National Strategy" in May 2024.



Transportation Planning

PSI 001 Snugborough Interchange upgrade

The contractor is continuing to carry out snagging at the interchange.

PSI 002 Ongar Barnhill Road

Bam Civil Ltd. Have constructed most of the new road and active travel facilities between Ongar and the R149. The Road surfacing, road marking and footpaths are being completed at the new junction on the R149 and also at the Eastern tie in on Barberstown Lane South. Some of the connections for new water infrastructure have been made by Uisce Éireann near the R149 and other connection works will continue over the coming weeks. ESB Networks have completed most of its new infrastructure works which has provided power for public lighting and traffic signals. There will be traffic signals at the new junction on the R149 in late Q4. The overall scheme is expected to be completed in 2026. PSI-039 – R132 Connectivity Project



Project summary

The Tender submissions are currently under evaluation process as part of Stage 2 of the tender process for the construction phase of the Project. This evaluation of all the tender submissions will continue during the month of December.

Meetings and Workshops

Ongoing meeting of various projects in the Swords area and discussions, as well as knowledge sharing on it projects timelines and phasing plus also gathering feedback on these projects to assist in managing the mitigation measures is ongoing.

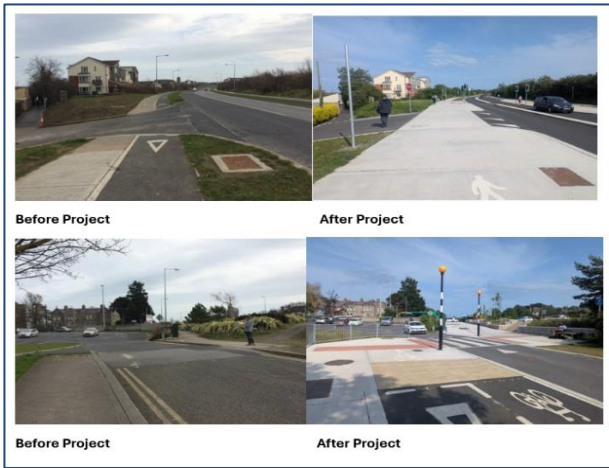
Monthly meetings with Uisce Éireann are being held monthly to discuss and align the details of a State Body Agreement for the foul water sewer across the Estuary Roundabout to be incorporated into the project. Coordination/Progress meetings with NTA and TII/Metrolink which are being held monthly and is continuing through 2025.

PSI-005 Harry Reynolds Road Pedestrian and Cyclist Route

The Harry Reynolds Road Pedestrian and Cyclist Route for this key infrastructure project for Balbriggan consisting of 3km fully segregated Pedestrian and Cyclist Route connecting 6 schools in Balbriggan. This Project is now at substantial completion. Snagging is almost complete. The permanent commemorative plaque has been installed at the civic space beside the public car park at the Dublin Roundabout.

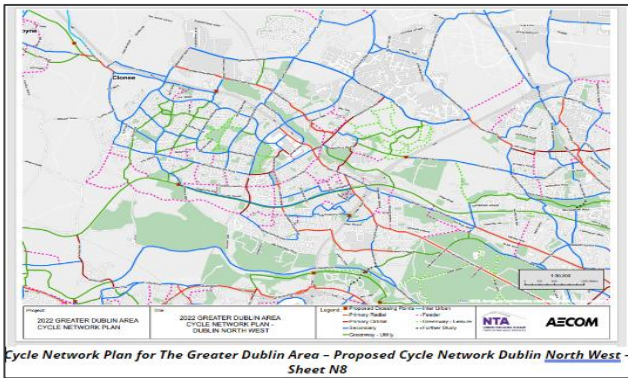


Comparison Photos of before and after Harry Reynolds Road Pedestrian and Cyclist Route Project



Consultancy Framework for Dublin 15 Walking and Cycling Projects

The Planning & Strategic Infrastructure Department recently signed a Single Party Framework for Engineering Consultancy Services for Pedestrian and Cycling Route Projects in the Dublin 15 Area.



RPS Engineers Consulting Ltd was appointed Fingal County Council Consultants for the Framework for Dublin 15 Walking and Cycling Projects.

PSI 063 - Pedestrian & Cycling Scheme at Granard Bridge

The first contract as part of this framework will be to undertake phases 2 to 4 for a new Pedestrian and Cycling Bridge at Granard Bridge Castleknock Road which will cross the Dublin Maynooth railway and Royal Canal, parallel to the existing road bridges over the canal and railway, with access for pedestrians and cyclists only. This will form an integral part of the walking and cycling route for Blanchardstown to Phoenix Park which is a proposed route in the NTA's Greater Dublin Area Cycle Network Plan. This will also improve pedestrian and cycle safety at Granard Bridge and further promote the use of more sustainable travel patterns, in line with Government Policy and the cycle network plan for the greater Dublin area.

Meetings and Reports

Monthly meetings are being held to progress the project and discuss key points, such as route options and possible constraints to be overcome. In addition, an ecological inspection in the Castleknock area was carried out to gather valuable data and a better understanding of the local ecosystem ensuring that any future developments or environmental strategies are informed by the best available ecological information.

Regular meetings continue to be held with Irish Rail / Dart+ West team and Waterways Ireland to discuss the projects and ensure that the design and planning proposals are well-integrated.

A non-statutory public consultation meeting took place in October. Prior to this, a briefing meeting was held with the Councillors of the Dublin 15 area to present the project and facilitate an open discussion.

The design team will now prepare a non-statutory public consultation report which will be provided to Councillors.

Project Programme

The project programme has begun by the Project Design Team with the Concept Development and Options Selection phase 2 now underway. Next phase will be moving onto phase 3 preliminary design before to phase 4 the statutory processes to obtain planning for the project. Throughout these phases there will be the requirement for regular consultation with all stakeholders including public representatives.

This project design will allow for a much-needed Pedestrian and Cycling link from the new Bridge north to the Roselawn Road/Castleknock Road junction and south to the Laurel Lodge Road/Castleknock Road junction.

PSI -036 Clonsilla-Damastown Cycle Route

Fingal County Council have been working on the Clonsilla-Damastown Cycle Route project brief and the tender documentation are now finalised for tender publication under the Single Party Framework for Engineering Consultancy Services for Pedestrian and Cycling Route Projects in the Dublin 15 Area.

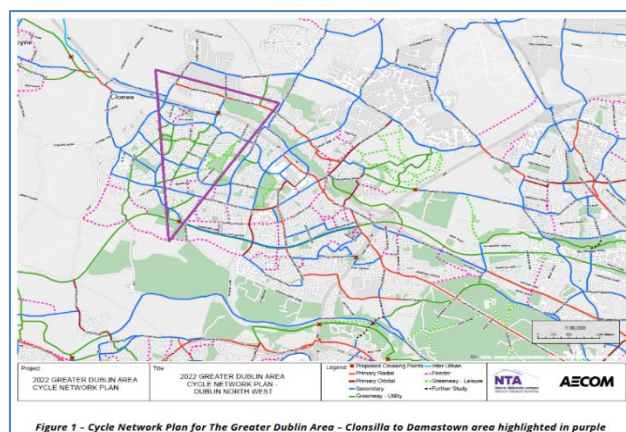


Figure 1 – Cycle Network Plan for The Greater Dublin Area – Clonsilla to Damastown area highlighted in purple

PSI – 004 Royal Canal Urban Greenway

The project team from the Planning & Strategic Infrastructure Department is continuing to finalise the preliminary design in consultation with all the key stakeholders, the National Transport Authority, Irish Rail and Waterways Ireland along the route of the greenway to ensure a coordinated, high quality final design is achieved at interfaces between existing facilities and the proposed scheme.

In November 2024 Fingal County Council requested consent from Waterways Ireland and Irish Rail to make a planning application for the Royal Canal Urban Greenway on their Lands to An Coimisiún Pleanála. Fingal County Council received consent from Irish Rail in July 2025 to proceed with making an application on their Lands to An Coimisiún Pleanála. Waterways Ireland informed Fingal County Council in September that they will issue a letter of support for Fingal County Council to make an application to An Coimisiún Pleanála for the project on their lands.

Alterations to the preliminary design from Hansfields to KCC Boundary on widths was agreed following further discussion with Waterways Ireland in September.

The project is currently at preliminary design stage, and following further discussion with Waterways Ireland throughout 2025 the project team reached agreement with Waterways Ireland on the design for the Greenway widths and level in the area between the Kildare border and Collins Bridge in September 2025.

This now requires a body of work to be undertaken to update the EIAR, RSA & EAA, Prelim Business Case, photomontages and do more up to date habitat and ecology surveys which is now been undertaken. Current Landowner checks and land referencing are being maintained and kept up to date for the project.

Following completion of the preliminary design, all the required documents which includes the Environmental Impact Assessment Report will be prepared prior to making the planning application to An Coimisiún Pleanála. The Environmental Impact Assessment Report is currently being review by internal departments and their feedback will be incorporated into the final report prior to undergoing a legal review in advance of a formal application to An Coimisiún Pleanála.

PSI – 065 Seamount Road Footpath Connectivity Project

Seamount Road Footpath Connectivity Project will provide for improved accessibility for all road users, in particular pedestrian users as there were no pedestrian footpaths along the eastern end of Seamount Road on the approach to the new development's entrance.

The route also forms one of the local health walks (Sli Na Slainte), the coastal walk between Malahide and Portmarnock. The route also connects to the park lands at Robswall and Paddy's Hill and forms a direct link to and from the only local secondary school, Malahide Community School (MCS) - reducing a 4km route by bike or car to a c. 1.5km walk/cycle and helping to reduce traffic volumes through the centre of the town.

The outcome of the Options Report has been accepted, and the project will now progress to phase 3 – preliminary design. The Council continues to liaise with the Key Stakeholders. Discussions are progressing well.



S2M Pedestrian and Cycle Scheme –

The preliminary design drawings have largely been completed. The Phase 3, Preliminary Design Phase, gateway documents have been completed and have been submitted to the NTA for review and approval.

Detailed preliminary design drawings for pavements, utilities, drainage, traffic junction layouts, Landscape Plans, Public Lighting pole locations and lining drawings have been received are under review. The project will liaise with utilities to discuss any required diversion works.

The latest revision of the Cycle Design Manual has led to some improvements being incorporated into the overall scheme design including revised layouts for crossings and bus stops to comply with the new standards. Design for structures along the route is progressing using the findings from the Ground Investigations. This includes design of the Malahide Tennis Promenade, promenade extension at Baldoye, Sluice River Bridge, Station Road culvert and Burrow Court retaining wall.

Wintering bird surveys have been completed which are required to feed into the planning application. An updated scoping report has been completed and will be circulated to prescribed bodies. Documents are being prepared for a planning application to An Coimisiún Pleanála. This includes preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement, Natura Impact Statement and Compulsory Purchase Order documentation. Initial draft chapters for the EIAR have been received and are under review. NIS and CPO documentation is currently being prepared.

Engagement with potentially impacted property owners, businesses and stakeholders is ongoing. The project team has begun to contact affected landowners to discuss the compulsory purchase order process and the scheme and land acquisition requirements. A number of meetings with individual landowners have taken place and further meetings will be scheduled as requested. Remaining affected landowners will be contacted in the coming weeks.

Updated drawings will be supplied to landowners during these discussions, which outline the land requirements and show the scheme design at their property. Meetings have been held with Uisce Éireann to ensure coordination of the scheme with planned and existing assets. A search of unregistered lands is ongoing for production of the deposit maps for the land acquisition for CPO.

Swords Cultural Quarter Public Realm

The new proposed Public Realm is a key feature of the overall Swords Cultural Project. The pedestrian priority public spaces framed between the Castle, the SCC Building and Fingal offices (County Hall) will serve as a civic amenity space providing a place for festivals, events, markets as well as an everyday meeting place for the local community.

The Planning & Strategic Infrastructure Department has procured a Multi-Disciplinary Consultancy team for the detailed design and construction supervision of the public realm at Swords Cultural Quarter. Consultants are now progressing with the detailed design phase for the Swords Cultural Quarter Public Realm. Discussions are ongoing with the National Monument Services and an application for Ministerial Consent will be made for the public realm works as the design progresses. The tender pack and contract documents for the public realm works are being developed alongside the detailed design.

Enabling Works to facilitate site clearance and archaeological investigations will be progressed in advance of the Main Works Contract. An application for ministerial consent for the works has been approved to National Monuments Service. A method statement for the archaeological investigations will be agreed prior to the enabling works advancing.

Tender process to appoint the contractor to complete the enabling works in Town Park and surrounding Swords Castle is progressing. The main works contract tender documents are under review. Procurement for the main works contract will follow.

In advance of works, consultation has begun with councillors, Fingal Chamber of commerce, the NTA and bus providers to agree and communicate traffic restrictions, access and bus diversions for North Street during the Main Works Contract.

PSI-041 Kinsealy Walking and Cycling Routes

The Kinsealy Walking and Cycling scheme aims to provide high-quality walking and cycling routes between Kinsealy and Portmarnock train station, and between Kinsealy and Malahide Castle and gardens. These two walking and cycling routes will form a link from Kinsealy to sustainable transport at Portmarnock and Malahide train stations.

Following a non-statutory public consultation in January 2025, the options report and the preferred route drawings were published on the Fingal website in September 2025. The Kinsealy to Portmarnock part of the project is now progressing to Phase 3 (Preliminary Design & Environmental Screening) with a view to preparing a planning application.

The Malahide to Kinsealy part of the project will be brought forward at a later date.

PSI-023 Swords Western Distributor Road Extension

The Swords Western Distributor Road (SWDR) is within the Oldtown and Mooretown development site, providing access to the Rathbeale Road from the lands to its north and south respectively. The SWDR has cycle tracks in both directions. The SWDR Extension is proposed to extend east to the R132 and the proposed Estuary Park and Ride facility (Metro North) as an extension of the existing carriageway and active travel facilities at Millers Avenue.

Egis (formerly Barry's Transportation) has been appointed to further develop this project to Phase 2 (Options Selection). The Options Report (closing out Phase 2) is expected by the end of 2026.

PSI-009 Fingal Coastal Way

The Fingal Coastal Way is a proposed coastal greenway linking Donabate with Balbriggan via the coastal towns of Rush, Loughshinny and Skerries. The scheme is being developed in conjunction with Transport Infrastructure Ireland (TII) and forms part of TII's proposed National Cycle Network (NCN).

The scheme is a long-standing objective of Fingal County Council and is reflected in the current development plan, which outlines numerous policies and objectives to plan and develop a route that integrates a coastal pedestrian and cycle route with sensitive natural and built heritage sites whilst achieving a balance between conservation of such sites and public uses such as leisure, recreation and tourism. This scheme is also identified within the Greater Dublin Area Cycle Network Plan and furthermore aligns with the objectives of the "Strategy for the Future Development of National and Regional Greenways" published by the Department of Transport.

Upon completion of the Emerging Preferred Route, non-statutory public consultations and further consultations with landowners and other stakeholders, the proposed overall strategy for the scheme has been updated along with a revised Emerging Preferred Route.

These revisions reflect the need to balance landowner and stakeholder concerns with the overall progression of the scheme and to take account of interactions with various other proposed projects being developed by Fingal County Council. In summary the proposed changes include the Fingal Coastal Way to be progressed in multiple stages with multiple planning applications:

- The routes through the towns of Donabate, Rush and Skerries will be delivered as part of overall town wide active travel network plans separately being developed by Fingal County Council's Active Travel Team and will be subject to their own planning applications.

- The Fingal Coastal Way routes between these towns will be delivered by the Planning and Infrastructure department in three separate planning applications:

- Section 1: Skerries to Balbriggan
- Section 2: Donabate to Rush
- Section 3: Rush to Skerries

PSI-007 Rush to Lusk Walking & Cycling Route

The aim of this scheme is to deliver a high quality, safe and attractive pedestrian and cycle network of approximately 3km between the towns of Rush and Lusk and to improve connectivity to the local Rush/Lusk train station and to several schools and tourist attractions in the area. The anticipated primary user groups for the network will be local commuters and school children walking and cycling between Lusk and Rush and the train station.

RPS Consulting Engineers has been appointed to further develop this project to Phase 2 (Options Selection). The Options Report (closing out Phase 2) is expected by the end of 2026.

Broadmeadow Way Greenway

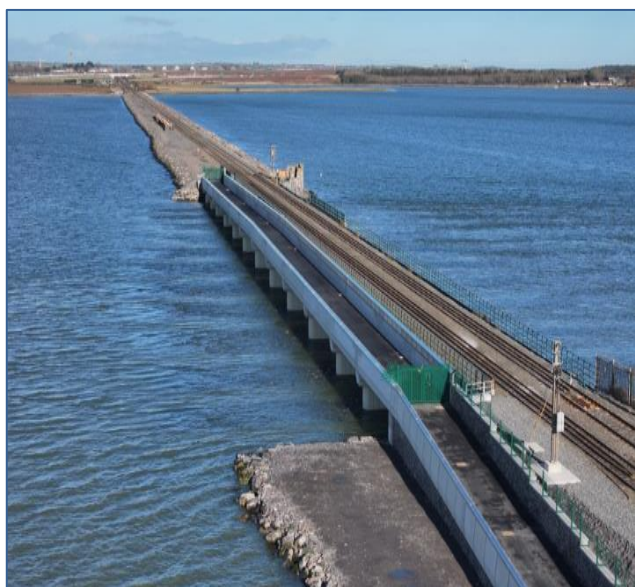
Progress on the detailed design phases of the other elements of this project is continuing. Engagement with Irish Rail and with the National Transport Authority is ongoing for the causeway works.

A stage 1 Tender assessment has been completed in advance of a 2-stage tender process to establish a framework for works contractors for the various landward works contracts. The landward elements of the Broadmeadow Way in Donabate i.e. from Newbridge Demesne, through Kilcrea lands to the east side of Corballis railway underpass will be delivered through this framework.

Construction of this environmentally and technically challenging project has been divided into different works packages which will be delivered in stages:

- Construction of the Broadmeadow Estuary Bridge took place in 2024. Works are complete.

- The tender for the construction of the greenway along the Northern Causeway is being finalised. It is expected that construction of the Northern Causeway will not be completed until 2027
- Construction of the greenway along the Southern Causeways will commence during the summer months of 2026.
- Construction of the Donabate landward works and the Malahide landward works will take place during 2026 and 2027.
- Due to the seasonal constraints of working within the estuary, along with the technical challenges of building on the Northern Causeway, it is expected that the opening of the Broadmeadow Way will be in 2027.

PSI-026 Portrane Road, Donabate

The Portrane Road Enhancement Project involves works to widen the existing narrow footpath on the northern side of the road in order to provide a suitably wide and safe footpath for pedestrians to use in the vicinity of two national schools (St. Patrick's Boys National School and Scoil Phádraic Cailíní). The project also involves works to provide safe pedestrian crossings and appropriate traffic calming facilities.



Third-party lands are required to widen the path, and in this regard the Council is using a Compulsory Purchase Order (CPO) to acquire the necessary lands. Notices to Treat were issued to affected landowners in July. Tender documents, for the appointment of a contractor, are expected to be issued to the market in December with commencement of construction anticipated for March 2026.

PSI-027 Donabate Pedestrian and Cycle Bridge

The Donabate Pedestrian Bridge was officially opened to the public on 10th October 2025. Final account has been settled with the contractor.

PSI-042 Donabate Transport Projects

The Donabate Transport Projects comprise a number of projects with the objective of improving transport infrastructure and road safety on the Donabate-Portrane peninsula.

The projects include:

- Phase 2 of the Donabate Distributor Road project, to improve access to Donabate and Portrane from the M1-Lissenhall Interchange for all road users, particularly vulnerable road users such as pedestrians and cyclists, and;
- Blakes Cross Junction Upgrade, to provide a safer junction layout that caters for both motorised traffic and active travel modes of transport such as walking and cycling.

A number of potential options have been identified for both Phase 2 of the Donabate Distributor Road and the Blakes Cross Junction Upgrade.

The emerging preferred route option for the second phase of the Donabate Distributor Road went on public display at the Donabate-Portrane Community Centre and was available to view online on the Fingal County Council consultation portal. Preliminary design for Phase 2 of the Donabate Distributor Road is expected to follow on in 2026.

The emerging preferred option for Blakes Cross is expected to be determined in early 2026.

Tender submissions have been evaluated for the appointment of a consultant to progress the next phases of the project. Work relating to environmental assessment, planning consent and detailed design is expected to be carried out throughout 2026, and in subsequent years, as appropriate.

PSI-071 Golf Links Road Upgrade

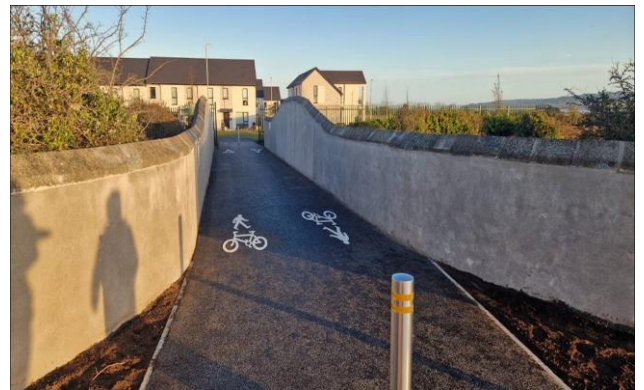
Fingal County Council has appointed Egis Engineering Ireland Ltd., to assist the Council in developing proposals for upgrading Golf Links Road in Portmarnock. Proposals will include facilities for people walking and cycling along Golf Links Road and will also include measures to improve the junction with Strand Road at one end of the road as well as the beach car park at the other end of the road. Topographical surveys and Wintering Birds surveys will be completed over the next number of months.

PSI-019 N3 M50 to Clonee

Aecom/ Roughan O'Donovan are appointed to assess bus priority measures on the N3 between the M50 and Clonee. This scheme is funded by Transport Infrastructure Ireland. They are also examining active travel links across the N3. The focus is between the Mulhuddart interchange and Clonee as the NTA bus connects project has already a scheme in development from Junction 3 into the city. Route options are being considered and when an emerging route option has been developed, a public engagement will be carried out. This is likely to be in Q2 2026.

PSI-068 Portmarnock Railway Bridge Pedestrian & Cycle Improvement Works

The works commenced on the 17th November 2025 and was completed on the 12th of December 2025.

The team will continue to update the Affordable Housing webpage with all information the developments well in advance of application portal launch date, keeping the public informed and engaged with upcoming opportunities.

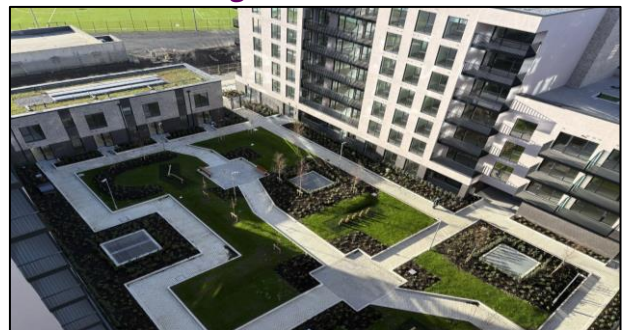

PARTXI/008/25 - Balbriggan

Fingal County Council has initiated the Part 8 public consultation for the Proposed Construction of a 13-unit Crisis Accommodation with associated staff and support accommodation (PARTXI/008/25) at Clonard St, Balbriggan. Members of the public are invited to submit their submissions or observations with respect to the proposed development through the Fingal County Council Consultation Portal <https://consult.fingal.ie>

The plans and particulars will be on display and available for inspection for a period of four weeks until Monday, 19th January 2026. The deadline for receipt of submissions and observations is Monday, 2nd February 2026.

Completed Construction Schemes

Church Fields 3A, Dublin 15

Work on Phase 3A at Churchfields has been completed, this phase saw the delivery of **40** new social homes as part of a mixed tenure scheme of 300 new homes comprising of 40 social, 180 affordable and 80 cost rental new homes. Construction was carried out by Gem Construction on behalf of Fingal County Council.



Construction Schemes on Site

Balmoston Phase 1, Ballymastone, Donabate

Construction work is continuing on Phase 1 of Balmoston. This is a mixed tenure development, which is being constructed by Glenveagh on behalf of Fingal County Council. This phase will deliver 87 social and 86 affordable new homes. The first **44** new social homes have been delivered.



Ballisk Park, Donabate

On behalf of Fingal County Council, Glenveagh are constructing 175 new homes comprising of 123 houses and 52 apartments at "Ballisk Park", New Road, Donabate following the granting of planning permission under the S179A process. The development will be a mixed tenure scheme of 63 social and 112 affordable homes. The first **8** new social homes have been delivered.



Church Fields 3B, Dublin 15

Works are progressing on Phase 3B of Church Fields, a mixed tenure scheme which will see the delivery of a further 217 homes in Church Fields, comprising of 121 houses and 96 apartments. Construction is being carried out by Gem Construction on behalf of Fingal County Council.

The first new social home has been delivered.



Seatown Road, Swords

Works for the delivery of 36 new, 2 bedroomed social homes at Seatown Road, Swords continue on site and are progressing well. This work is being delivered in tandem with the delivery of the civic and cultural building for the Swords Cultural Quarter.



Baile na Móna Phase 1, Mooretown, Swords

Construction work is progressing well on the delivery of 274 new homes on Phase 1 of Baile na Móna, Mooretown, Swords. Glenveagh are constructing the new homes on behalf of Fingal County Council. This will be a mixed tenure scheme of 123 social and 151 affordable homes. Planning for this development was granted under the S179A process.



Holywell, Swords

Construction is progressing well on the delivery of 57 new social homes at Holywell, Swords. Planning for this development of 1, 2 and 3 bedroomed homes was granted under the S179A process.



Mourne View, Skerries

Construction work is progressing on the delivery of 14 new social homes at Mourne View, Skerries. Planning for this development of 2, 3 and 4 bedroomed new homes was granted under the S179A process.



Remount Court, Lusk

Construction work is progressing on the delivery of 18 new social homes at Remount Court, Rathmore Road, Lusk. Planning for this development of 1, 2 and 3 bedroomed homes was granted under the S179A process.



North Court, Swords

Construction work has commenced on the delivery of 13 new social homes comprising of 1 and 2 bedroomed apartments at North Court, North Street, Swords which is being constructed by Broomfield Construction on behalf of Fingal County Council.



Balmoston Phase 2, Ballymastone, Donabate

Construction work has commenced on Phase 2 Balmoston, Donabate. This is a mixed tenure development. Phase 2, Balmoston will deliver 72 new social and 75 affordable homes over several hand-over phases through 2026 and 2027.



Asset Management

Energy Efficiency Retrofitting Programme

The 2025 Energy Retrofit Programme is complete. Fingal County Council were allocated €3,196,000 by the Department of Housing, Local Government and Heritage, targeting 94 housing units. The team have exceeded the 2025 target, retrofitting 119 properties to a B2 BER rating.

Vacant Homes

The vacant homes officer and team continue engagement with property owners to return vacant homes to use. The team also works in conjunction with the derelict sites section.

Compulsory Purchase Orders (CPOs):

Private Dwelling Grants

Croí Cónaithe Vacant Homes Refurbishment Grant

This scheme was launched in July 2022 and was expanded in May 2023. Grants are available up to €50k for vacant properties and €70k if derelict. We have received **255** applications since the scheme commenced in 2022.

Housing Assistance Payment (HAP)

HAP continues to be the primary source of rent support for those in private rented accommodation. Fingal County Council has set up **288 new HAP tenancies** in 2025 to date with approximately 4502 HAP tenancies established since HAP commenced in 2017.

The HAP team is on hand to deal with any queries from applicants and landlords in person at the Housing Department in the Fingal County Council Blanchardstown Office, by phone at 01 8905000 via the CCU or through email at hap@fingal.ie. The HAP Amendments Portal is also available as a secure platform for tenants and landlords to submit requests to update the circumstances of their HAP tenancies

Rents

The Pay My Rent Online system was launched in early October 2025 to facilitate more convenient online rent payments for tenants. This payment method has continued to gain traction month on month since its launch.



Tenants can also access their rent charge and balance via the Housing Online portal.

Following the introduction in 2024 of new debt management processes and procedures, **rent arrears have reduced by €1.8m from 01/01/2025 - 20/12/2025**. New processes initiated include bi-annual statements and letters to all tenants and quarterly statements and letters to tenants in arrears.

The Rents team continue to engage with tenants who experience challenges paying their rent. The team issued **156** Tenancy Warnings and **109** Demand letters during 2025.

The Rents **collection rate at 21/12/2025 shows an increase of €2.9m** on the same period in 2024.

Housing Loans & Tenant Purchase

Local Authority Home Loan (LAHL)

The Local Authority Home Loan (LAHL) remains a popular option for first-time buyers and certain other applicants who are unable to obtain home loan financing from a commercial lender.

Local Authority Purchase & Renovation Loan (LAPRL)

The Local Authority Purchase and Renovation Loan (LAPRL) is a government-backed mortgage for the purchase and renovation of derelict and non-habitable homes. The property must be eligible for the Vacant Property Refurbishment Grant, whether derelict, non-habitable or simply vacant.

Housing Loan Arrears

Borrowers who are struggling to repay their housing loan are encouraged to contact the Mortgage Support Team at the earliest opportunity to examine and agree the best solution for them.

The Mortgage Support team continued to engage with borrowers in arrears on a regular basis this year. This engagement has resulted in the cumulative Loan Arrears figure decreasing from **€2.13m at the start of 2024 to €1.95m as at 20/12/2024.**

Various options are available to borrowers in mortgage arrears under the Mortgage Arrears Resolution Process (MARP). Failure to contact the Team will leave the Council with no option but to progress the matter further. The Mortgage Support team can be contacted by email loans@fingal.ie

Tenant Purchase

The Tenant Purchase Scheme is available for eligible Tenants who wish to purchase their Council home under the Tenant Purchase Scheme. Some restrictions with regard the Council property type that can be sold apply. Tenants looking for further information on the scheme and the eligibility criteria should contact the Tenant Purchase Section. Private Rented Inspections

The inspections team were tasked with inspecting 25% of the registered tenancies which is approximately 21,000 tenancies. The target of 5,169 Dwellings for 2025 was received from the Department of Housing. Up to the close of business on Monday the 22nd of December 5,890 inspections have been conducted in 2025, with 5124 of them qualifying towards the Dwellings target.

The team will continue to work this year with the contractor improving and streamlining the process and utilising all avenues to ensure that compliance improves, and the target is reached. The first batch of letters were sent in December in preparation for the January 2026 inspections.

The 2026 target will be sent by the DHLGH in the first quarter of 2026 and will inform the Inspections program for the year.

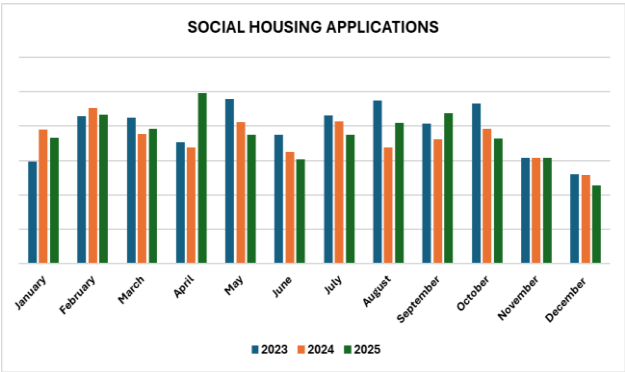

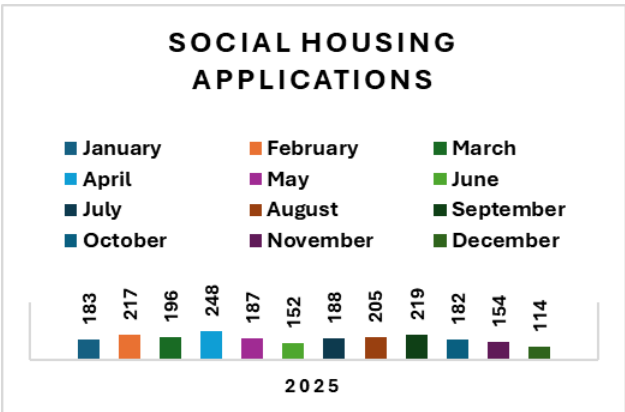

Year on year comparison by month

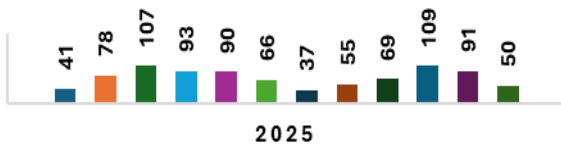

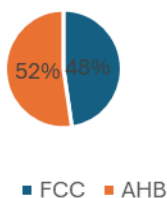

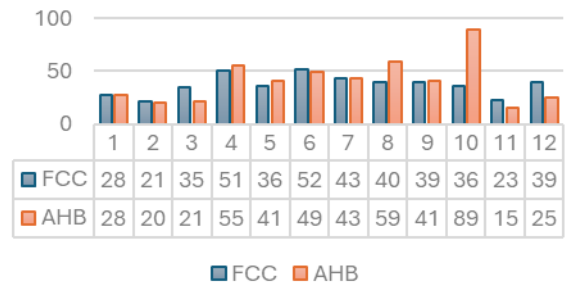

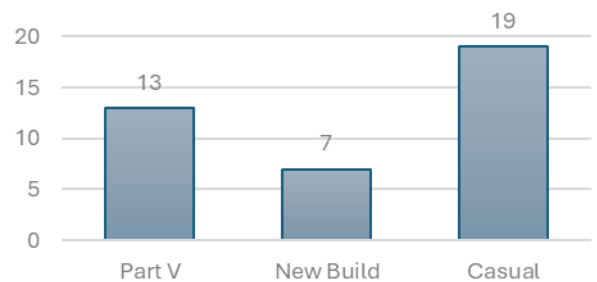
The above chart depicts the total number of properties allocated since the beginning of 2025.

Monthly allocations

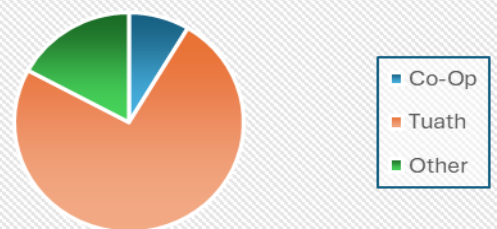

Homeless Services.

Homeless Exits 2025

During December 2025, 54 households exited homeless circumstances into various forms of social housing support - including privately rented tenancies under the Homeless HAP Scheme.

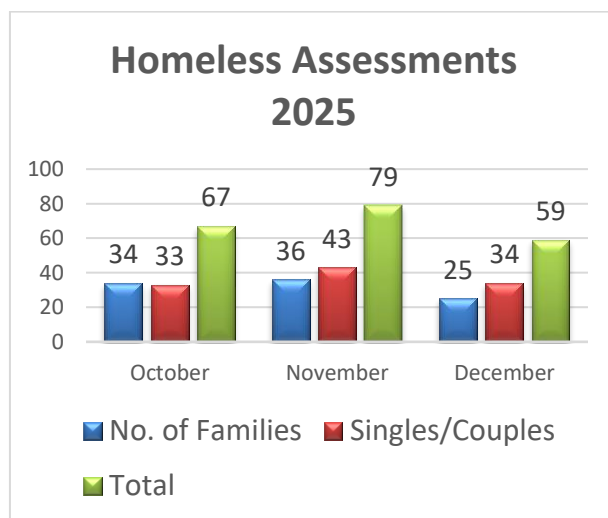

Homeless Assessments

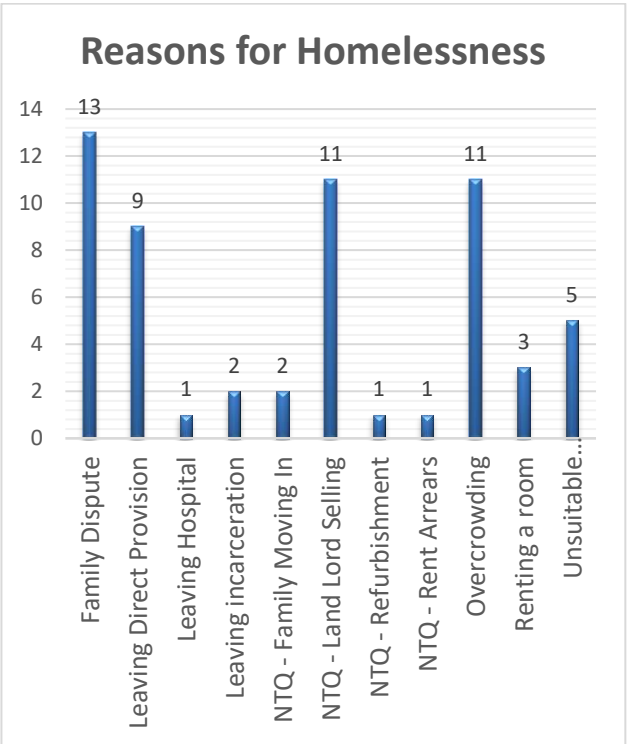
Fingal's Homeless Team continues to engage with those experiencing homelessness to offer advice and support. Homeless Assessments continue to be carried out.

In December 2025, there were a total of 59 full homeless assessments completed – comprising 25 families and 34 singles/couples.



During December 2025, of the 59 Homeless Assessments carried out, 25% of cases resulted from Notice to Termination (NOT) having been served, 22% cases resulted from family/relationship breakdown and 19% were from Overcrowding. Most of the other presentations to the Homeless Section are from Renting a room (5%) and were from leaving direct provision (15%).

The remaining 14% comprise various reasons outlined in the next chart.



Emergency Accommodation (including Fingal County Council Family Hubs)

There continues to be a high demand for Emergency Accommodation across the region for both families and individuals.

Rough Sleepers

The Homeless Services Team continues to liaise with the DRHE Outreach Team regarding any reports of rough sleeping, to establish their names and circumstances and to offer support.

Regrettably, some rough sleepers are reluctant to engage with service providers and may refuse offers to access emergency accommodation. Any rough sleeper who is willing to engage with the Outreach Team and/ or the Council will be assisted. The Council will carry out homeless assessments, and every effort is made to encourage them to avail of homeless services.

A weekly Rough Sleepers Coordination Group monitors the reports of rough sleepers. The reports come from various outlets, including the DRHE Outreach Team, Elected Representatives, the FCC Operations Department, and the public.

There have been 136 reported rough sleeping cases 2025. 40 of the clients have taken up Emergency Accommodation and we continue to work with 7 others to provide a suitable solution.

There are 8 registered long term entrenched rough sleepers (2 couples, and 6 males) from the Fingal Area. We will continue to work with them to provide suitable supports. Members of the homeless team recently worked in collaboration with the operations team to resolve an issue with a rough sleeper site in North Dublin.

Dublin Street Outreach Service Tel: 01 872 0185 from 7 am to 1 am

The DRHE in partnership with Dublin Simon. Outreach and the PMVT Intake team are assertively working on the streets offering accommodation to all rough sleepers. The teams are very familiar with the locations of people sleeping rough across the Dublin Region and persistently work with individuals to support them into emergency accommodation. This process can take time and multiple contacts, as some people do not want to engage but the teams persevere with every person working to achieve a successful outcome.

The service operates 365 days a year, until 1 am. The Outreach Teams also ensure that people sleeping rough are linked with other appropriate health services such as addiction and mental health services to prevent further rough sleeping.

PMVT's Housing First Intake team links rough sleepers to permanent accommodation with long-term support. All emergency accommodation is now 24-hour, with food and shower facilities provided.

National Housing Strategy for Disabled People 2022-2027 Implementation Plan

Action 1.2.2 of the National Housing Strategy for Disabled People 2022-2027 Implementation Plan states that Local authorities and the HSE must work together to plan and deliver on housing targets for disabled people in the community (including de-congregation) in line with the forthcoming Disability Services Action Plan.

The HSE Mental Health Housing Coordinator from Parkgate Hall liaises with the Homeless Services Team on a monthly basis. Currently 18 Fingal County Council clients have been identified, 7 have been housed in 2025.

A second sub-group has been created between Fingal County Council and an Interim Disability Case Manager. The HSE have identified 5 new clients, all of whom have Medical Priority and are currently being reviewed for long term allocations.

A third sub-group has been created with St. Michaels House, the first meetings has been held and a list of clients is being collated by their team.

Homeless Action Plan 2025- 2027

The Homeless Action Plan 2025-2027 was adopted at the Council Meeting in July. It has also been adopted by DCC and SDCC and it will go before the next Council meeting in Dun Laoghaire Rathdown.

Preventing Homelessness, Notices to Quit and Tenant In-situ Acquisitions

Fingal County Council is aware that households in the Fingal area who may have received a notice to quit, which is also referred to as a notice of termination, from their landlord may be worried or unsure of what to do.

Fingal County Council and the Dublin Regional Homeless Executive (DRHE) would like to advise anyone affected of the services that are available to them in these circumstances.

We strongly encourage tenants residing in the Fingal area, who have been issued with a notice of termination, to contact Fingal County Council as soon as they receive a notice from their landlord.

The contact details for Fingal County Council are provided at the bottom of this page.

When the tenants contact Fingal County Council, staff in the Housing Department will take note of the termination date.

The Council advises the tenant to refer the notice to Threshold, a service funded by the DRHE to provide a Tenancy Protection Service for private renters in the Dublin Region, including Fingal. Threshold can also be contacted directly on Freephone 1800 454 454 or via their website www.threshold.ie which contains more information and advice on the validity of your notice.

The Council's first response will be to try to prevent homelessness. This includes assessing the person's position on the social housing list, providing advice on applying for Choice Based Lettings, and advising the person on the level of Housing Assistance Payment (HAP) they may be eligible to receive.

Placement in emergency accommodation will be a last resort if no other alternative can be identified.

Fingal County Council continues to liaise with other Dublin and neighboring local authorities to deal with tenancy issues that may require an inter-authority approach.

In particular, we are working closely with our colleagues in the other Dublin Local Authorities on the implementation of the Government policy and guidance, with a focus on the needs of tenants.

Whilst the Council will, in the context of current circumstances, adopt flexibility in dealing with potential acquisitions of properties with tenants in situ, any acquisition is subject to appropriate due diligence and checks before any commitment is made to acquire, including, for example, determining that a valid notice of termination is in place, the tenant has a social housing need, and the condition and valuation of the property.

The Government has put forward options to allow tenants who are not eligible for social housing to remain in their homes, including schemes to support the purchase of homes and a Cost Rental in-situ Scheme. The Cost Rental Tenant-in-Situ Scheme is available for tenants who are not eligible for social housing and are at risk of homelessness.

The DHLGH has advised that local authorities are to be the first point of contact for this scheme, but it is managed by the Housing Agency. Under the scheme, the Housing Agency can purchase a property and rent it to the tenant. Fingal County Council will undertake an initial assessment of the tenant's circumstances and refer details to the Housing Agency for consideration, where the tenant is at risk of homelessness and the Cost Rental Tenant-in-Situ scheme applies. The Housing Agency will then contact the landlord about the purchase of the property.

Where a tenant wishes to purchase their home from the landlord, local authorities can provide advice about the Local Authority Home Loan scheme. The Government is examining implementing a 'right of first refusal' for tenants to purchase their homes, as well as expanding the First Home shared equity scheme. The Council will be able to provide more information on these when available.

Works around preventing homelessness, assessing notices of termination, and responding to tenant and landlord in-situ queries are being led on by the Council's Homelessness section, taking a tenant-centred approach, supported by staff dedicated to dealing with tenant in-situ housing acquisitions.

Traveller Accommodation Programme

The Council remains committed to fulfilling its responsibilities under the Traveller Accommodation Programme 2025–2029 by providing sustainable, culturally appropriate Traveller-specific accommodation and supports.

Council officials continue to actively engage with the Traveller Community, Traveller advocacy groups, and relevant support services, including welfare, child protection, and mental health services, as well as other agencies, to address and resolve issues wherever possible. The Housing Department and the Architects Department are working in close collaboration on upcoming projects as outlined in the Traveller Accommodation Programme 2025–2029

LTACC

The final meeting of the LTACC was held on 17th November 2025 at the Blanchardstown Offices. This was the last meeting for 2025 with meeting dates for 2026 to be confirmed with stakeholders.

To date in 2025, meetings have been well attended and considered highly productive. Estate Management remains committed to working collaboratively with all stakeholders to support the delivery and ongoing maintenance of Traveller-specific accommodation throughout the county.

Caravan Loan Scheme

The Council continues to implement the National Caravan Loan Scheme in accordance with Department of Local Government and Heritage Guidelines.

Annual Traveller Census

The Annual Traveller Census has been successfully completed, encompassing all Group Housing and Halting Sites. The data collected will enable effective planning and development, to ensure the needs of Traveller Families in the Fingal area are thoroughly represented and considered in all accommodation strategies.

Dumping on sites

Illegal dumping on halting sites remains an ongoing issue. Council contractors frequently clear dumped waste from these sites, incurring significant costs to the Council. Letters continue to be sent to residents reminding them that household waste collection is available on-site and urging them to refrain from illegal dumping.

Following consultation with the residents of Moyne Park, residents arranged a skip and removal of burned refuse at the entrance to Moyne Park, in order to enable delivery onsite of a new mobile unit. This engagement was very positive and Estate Management hope to continue engaging with residents on other halting sites.

Fire Safety

Fire safety remains a top priority for the protection of all tenants on our Halting Sites and Group Housing Schemes. The annual service and maintenance of portable fire equipment on Fingal County Council Traveller Accommodation Sites has been completed, with additional fire safety equipment installed at several halting sites. Furthermore, a fire safety audit of caravans has been carried out, accompanied by a leaflet distribution to all halting sites.

The Estate Management section in conjunction with Dublin Fire Brigade organized a successful Fire Safety Training Day which took place on 2nd December in Dublin 15. The session was attended with members of the Traveller community and the Blanchardstown Traveller Development Group in attendance. A further session for the D15 area is planned with the Estate Management section committed to promoting and supporting the training.

In addition, new notices have been placed on all powerhouse doors to advise that there is no entry permitted to the powerhouse by unauthorised persons.



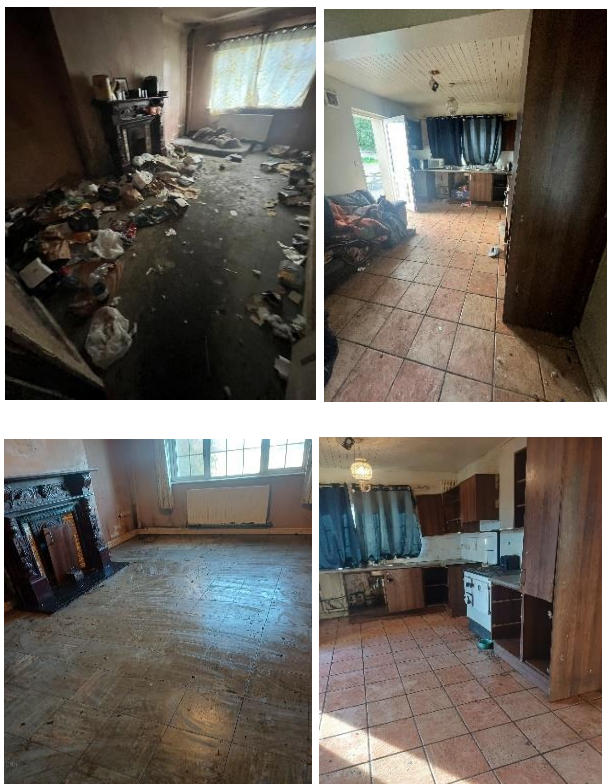

Anti-Social Behaviour / Inspectorate Unit

The Council conducts impartial and thorough investigations on all reports of anti-social behaviour and implements appropriate preventative measures when necessary. All complaints are treated in strict confidence by the Anti-Social Behaviour Unit, which works in close partnership with An Garda Síochána to address and manage such issues effectively.

In 2025, 152 households attended 12 Tenant Induction Courses. The ASB Unit is currently liaising with the Lettings team to prepare the schedule for 2026.

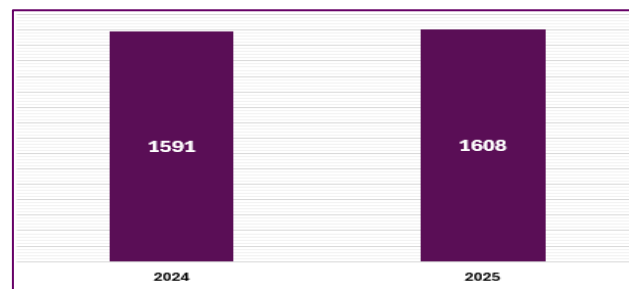

Community Development

Community development is a process where community members come together to take collective action and generate solutions to common problems. Community wellbeing, economic, social, environmental and cultural challenges are often solved through collective action being taken at a grassroots level. Community development ranges from small initiatives within a local group to large initiatives that involve the broader community.

Building community capacity, strengthening community participation, and involving people in decisions that affect their lives is a complex process and can only be achieved by working with local communities and agencies who have responsibility to the people in those communities. This month the Community Development Office worked in partnership with a number of community groups and partners to support many projects/Initiatives including;

Malahide Senior Citizen's

The Malahide Senior Citizen's Social Group promotes monthly activities where older people from across Malahide can pop into St Sylvester's Parish centre where a group of dedicated local volunteers and the centre manager accommodate the monthly meet ups. Thematic and dementia friendly, this monthly activity is a social lifeline for many and provides local people with the opportunity to get out and about, meet old friends and perhaps make some new ones. In December we were delighted to attend a fantastic Christmas event for afternoon tea with entertainment including Christmas floral arranging enjoyed by over 60 participants.

Congratulations to everyone who received their certificates of attendance including tutors who participate in the Failte Isteach – Conversational English classes in Holywell in 2025. The classes were well attended with up to 20+ students taking part on a weekly basis to develop and practice their English-speaking skills.

10th Annual Community Conference to Address Domestic Violence and Foster Community Solidarity



On 9th December, The Community Department were delighted to support the 10th Annual Community Conference to Address Domestic and Gender Based Violence and Foster Community Solidarity

This year's theme, **"Trending Topics in Domestic Violence,"** brought together community leaders, advocates, and professionals to explore emerging issues and innovative approaches in tackling domestic abuse and gender-based violence. The conference aimed to strengthen local networks, share best practices, and promote solidarity in creating safer communities.

The event featured keynote speaker **Lily O'Farrell**, a feminist writer and cartoonist renowned for her impactful work under the name *VulgaDrawings*. Lily has collaborated with organisations such as Refuge, the End Violence Against Women Coalition, and the Centre for Countering Digital Hate, making her a leading voice in the fight against gender-based violence. Standing together against domestic violence builds a stronger, safer community.

Failte Isteach Donabate and Lusk Celebrations

Failte Isteach Donabate and Failte Isteach Lusk both held community celebrations to mark another successful year for both projects last month. Failte Isteach Donabate marked the last conversational English class with a social event for tutors, students and local councillors at DPCC.

Among highlights for Failte Donabate in 2025 was volunteer tutor Helen and student Serhii representing Failte Isteach nationally at the AONTAS STAR life-long learning awards back in February. Serhii went on to get a position with Crosscare supporting the needs of international protection applicants under 25 years of age in Fingal while Helen brought the Failte Isteach message and materials to Africa over the summer. Meanwhile Failte Isteach Lusk marked the end of their second successful year with a Festive event after the final classes at Lusk Cultural Centre last month. The group continues to go from strength to strength, supported by the North County Team and the staff of Lusk Cultural Centre and Lusk Community Council.



Fingal Rural Community Network

The Fingal Rural Community Network (FRCN) was addressed by the Local Authorities Waterways Programme (LAWPRO) at its last meeting held in Oldtown Community Hall. The FRCN comprise nine communities across the north county stretching from Garristown and the Naul in the north-west to Ballyboughal and Rolestown in the south, with five more villages in the middle. Information on how Fingal's rural communities can develop initiatives to connect communities across a wide network of water bodies and catchments areas was outlined, with further follow up planned for early 2026. Community Facilities Management Support

The Building Facilities Unit provides financial and management support to 38 community facilities across Fingal. The Unit also managed the Capital Works programme for the Community Development Office.

The Fingal Community Facilities Network hosted their final Network meeting of the year on 17th December. Representatives from 25 Community facilities across the county met in the Bracken Court in Balbriggan, and there was a festive feel for the event, with Christmas jumpers strongly encouraged!



A feedback session was facilitated by the Community Development Office, discussing the positives and challenges across the Community Centres in 2026, with a view to developing activities and training for 2026. The second half of the session took a lighter note, with comedian Eric Lawlor entertaining the Managers and Board members, followed by a quiz organised by Huntstown CC Manager Chris Sullivan. The Network are now developing their plans for 2026, delivering supports for the centres.



Interagency

The Community Development Office actively seek to work in collaboration with agencies to maximise service delivery and resources to communities across Fingal.

Age Friendly Fingal

Age Friendly Fingal is committed to driving a collaborative, multi-sectoral approach to supporting interventions that will significantly help to improve the quality of life of the current population of older people in Fingal and future generations.

Fingal Older People's Council



The OPC held nine productive meetings during 2025, alongside active representation on national committees and participation in consultations covering transport, community safety, and health. It was a busy year with meetings, information sessions, an afternoon tea dance, and Vintage Picnic, all culminating in the OPC Conference. At the conference, the OPC welcomed EU partners from the Korale project, which addresses loneliness among both older and younger people. They shared examples of good practices from their countries, generating strong enthusiasm among participants.

Those in attendance greatly valued the chance to explore how such initiatives could help tackle loneliness in Fingal. As a result, the OPC have agreed to explore the possibility of piloting two projects in 2026 to combat loneliness among older people in Fingal.

Fingal Age Friendly Strategy (2026-2030)



The launch of the Fingal Age Friendly Strategy (2026–2033), initially planned for December 2025, was postponed due to unforeseen circumstances and will now take place on 16 January 2026. The Strategy was shaped through a robust consultation process with older people and stakeholders, as well as numerous meetings of the Age Friendly Alliance, ensuring that the voices of older people were central to identifying challenges and agreeing actions.

The Action Plan provides a clear framework of actions, lead organisations, implementation timeframes, and reporting mechanisms. Importantly, it also recognises the need for flexibility, acknowledging that new challenges may arise over the course of the Strategy and must be addressed as part of its delivery.

Fingal Public Participation Network (FPPN)

Fingal Public Participation Network (PPN) is a network of community, voluntary, social inclusion and environmental organisations, working to build a better county for the community of Fingal.

In 2025, Fingal PPN recruited four new Secretariat members. A small induction meeting was held for new reps on 10th December in Blanchardstown to build capacity of reps.

The PPN also rolled out information sessions in each LEA, to support the new PPN members. 73 new groups join the PPN in 2025 bringing the total of registered groups to 927.

The staff of Fingal PPN attended the annual in-person staff meeting in Portlaoise with all 31 national PPNs on 16th December. At this meeting, we review the progress of PPNs over the year and each forum and sub-committee reports to the attendees.

Comhairle na nÓg



Fingal Comhairle Na nÓg held two meetings with the new members who have joined since their AGM. The group will begin to work on their new project for 2026 which will focus on anti-social behaviour and safety. This topic emerged as a key issue for young people in Fingal at the Comhairle's 2025 Annual Youth Conference. One young person will represent Fingal Comhairle na nÓg at the Ireland-UK Youth Forum this month. An End of Year review has been carried out between FCC Community Development Office and Foróige, youth organisation, who were tendered to co-ordinate the Fingal Comhairle na nÓg for 2025.

Fingal Integration Office

The role of the Fingal Integration Office is to provide clinic support to International Protection (IP) applicants, Programme Refugees and Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection (BOTP) to enable them to live independently in the community. Our Integration Team also supports connection within our communities and the promotion of intercultural understanding. We support the delivery of actions from the Migrant Integration and Social Cohesion Strategy, facilitate the Community Integration Forum and Ukraine Supports

LAIT (Local Authority Integration Team)

The LAIT continued to host integration clinics across the three geographical areas of North County, Mid-East and Dublin 15 in IPAS Accommodation centres and BOTP Accommodation centres.

The latest accommodation statistics as of 2nd November 2025 have been provided by the LGMA (Local Government Management Agency) and UCTAT (Ukrainian Crisis Temporary Accommodation Team).

Integration

Mediterranean Day

The Integration Office supported Children 4 World Children to mark Mediterranean Day with a vibrant cultural performance at Draíocht Arts Centre Dublin 15.

This concert of Mediterranean-inspired music was aimed at uniting communities across borders and providing opportunities for cultural exchange and dialogue.



CIF (Community Integration Forum)

The Community Integration Forum (CIF) continues to meet regularly. This forum creates a co-ordinated response from the various statutory agencies and voluntary groups in the county to assist the Ukraine community and other new arrivals. The forum was originally tasked with assisting Ukrainian Beneficiaries of Temporary Protection (BOTPs). However, in line with the evolving work and role of the CIF, work has expanded to include:

1. Applicants for International Protection (IP Applicants)
2. Those with Refugee, Subsidiary Protection, or Permission to Remain status
3. Programme Refugees
4. Beneficiaries of Temporary Accommodation (BOTPs).

The final meeting of the year was held on 2nd December, 2025. The first meeting of 2026 will be held on February 10th. In 2026 we will be adding a new element to the meetings by providing a series of presentations from partner agencies which we hope will provide awareness to members of the remit of services and their supports across Fingal.

Ukraine Supports

A Christmas Market Stall for the Fingal Ukrainian Support Group

The Integration Office provided support to the Fingal Ukrainian Support group to run a stall in the Swords Christmas Market. Through an exhibition of Ukrainian art on the stall the group continued their work, raising awareness about the ongoing conflict in Ukraine and further promoting the integration of displaced Ukrainian people within Ireland.



Our Christmas Story: "My Irish Santa"

Fingal Integration Office supported Ukrainian Volunteers of Ireland to organise a Christmas drawing competition "My Irish Santa" as part of a festive children's event "Our Christmas Story", culminating with a Christmas party for the children.

Throughout the whole month of November, children were creating their drawings and sharing their own beautiful and imaginative visions of Irish Santa



Funding

Community Activities funding is to support community and voluntary groups to develop initiatives that support, community group development, social inclusion initiatives, community events, climate action/environmental enhancement, integration or intercultural Initiatives.

Community Activities Funding was awarded to 153 projects in the amount of €336,304.87 in 2025.

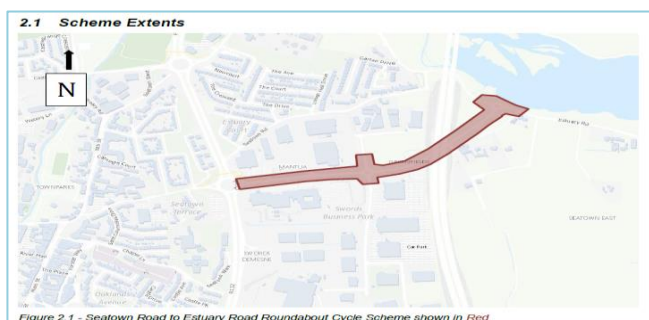

Active Travel

BLRS Area:

Seatown Road Swords:

The contractor was appointed in late December 2025. Works are anticipated to commence on site in January 2026



These works are expected to take close to 12 months to complete, and local traffic and pedestrian management will be in place during the works. Updates will be provided during the course of the works through the weekly Councillor Updates issued by Active Travel.

Donabate Portrane R126 cycle paths:

An additional survey is required to inform and finalise the options report. Once completed and gateway approvals are received from the NTA, the project will proceed to the preliminary design phase. Further details will be presented to Councillors at ACM in due course.



Junction of the R132 and Flemington Lane Balbriggan:

The Contractor has completed tactile paving and works on the footpath on the eastern side of the R132.



Tactile paving and works on the footpath on the western side of the R132 have also progressed.



Due to supply chain issues it was not possible to have the junction fully signalised before the Christmas period. Works will continue throughout January to complete the works and make the junction fully signalised and operational.

Howth-Malahide Area:

Baldoyle Circle Active Travel Project

The extent of the scheme has been considered, and a brief and tender documents are being prepared. Depending on funding allocation, a design team may be appointed with a view to setting up public consultation at the earliest stage to the Concept Development and Option Selection.

Feltrim Road Active Travel Project

This project is currently in the preliminary design phase. The design team is continuing to progress the preferred option drawings into a preliminary design. Drawings outlining the extent of potential land acquisition have now been completed, and further engagement with stakeholders is scheduled for Q1 2026. Work on various aspects of the preliminary design are ongoing and progressing well.

BMCO Area:

Snugborough Road - NAC to Ongar

The preliminary design phase is ongoing. The consultant has received the stage 1 road safety audit on the emerging preferred option. The latest drawings have been updated taking into account the various bus stops along the route which will be upgraded as part of the project. The latest draft preliminary design report is being updated taking this into account. An NTA workshop was held in December 2025. Further updates will be provided over the coming months, through this report and at ACM level.

Clonee to Blanchardstown Shopping Centre

The preliminary design phase is ongoing. Initial discussions have taken place with local landowners with site meetings held. Further site investigations have taken place at pinch points along the R147 with drawings updated accordingly in agreement with the NTA following a workshop. A stage 1 road safety audit has been completed, and draft environmental & appropriate screening report comments have been issued from the Active Travel team to the design team for discussion. A non-statutory public consultation is being prepared and will take place in Q1 2026.

Castleknock to Dunsink Lane

A tender competition to procure a contractor to carry out the works commenced on the 14th August 2025 and is now closed. Tenders are being evaluated by the Project Team.

It is anticipated the works will commence on site in Q1 2026.



Hartstown/Huntstown/Mountview Road

Fingal County Council is progressing on finalising the design for roundabout and junction upgrades. Improvements to 2 signalised junctions at Hartstown Road/Hartstown Link Road and at Hartstown Road/Mountview Road with Blakestown Road/Shelerin Road are planned along with 2 roundabouts at the junction of Huntstown Way with Ashfield Way/Huntstown Park and at the junction of Huntstown Way with Castlewood. A non-statutory public consultation has closed and a public consultation report is now published. Detailed design has now commenced.



Castleknock to Blanchardstown via Farmleigh

The feasibility study has started, and traffic and drone surveys have taken place. A topographical survey has been completed and has been issued to the designers to inform the study. Feasibility and route options are currently being discussed between the design team and Active Travel.

Towns & Villages

Works are continuing in the development of an Active Travel Plan for several of our Towns & Villages. Details are outlined below.

New Street, Malahide

Stakeholder engagement is continuing on the Street. Stage 1 of the construction tender process (suitability assessment questionnaire) is due to be published in January 2026, with shortlisting and initiation of Stage 2 of the tender process thereafter.



Balrothery Active Travel Project

The Strategic Environmental Assessment screening is in the process of being determined by the Council. The plan will be published pending the outcome of this determination.

The preferred option is being developed, and progress is being made on the deliverables for the Options Selection phase of the project, in order to close out this phase.

Skerries Active Travel Plan.

Non-statutory public consultation is currently ongoing.

Extensive engagement with stakeholders has taken place before the Christmas break, including workshops, in-person meetings and a drop-in session.

The online consultation portal is open, and submissions can be made through the portal until the 9th January.

All feedback received from the workshops and portal submissions will be analysed and considered in the final plan.

Skerries Harbour Road & Red Island Loop:

The Part 8 Planning Process concluded in 2025.

The project is now in the detailed design phase. FCC has continued to engage with the ESB and other utilities on the requirements to underground services on Harbour Road.

Consultation with the local stakeholders will be facilitated in advance of the construction phases in 2026.

These works have been split into two phases for construction, with the works to the Red Island Loop, the car parks, link along South Beach to Dorn Lane, forming the initial phase. This will be followed by the works to Harbour Road as a separate contract and phase.

Connectivity/Permeability

We are continuing to receive various requests for Permeability and Connectivity improvements from various stakeholders across the county. These requests are being recorded in detail for evaluation through a multi-criteria analysis.

The projects are then reviewed across the departments to identify if an appropriate means of delivery can be established on the ground.

Several projects identified through this process are being developed through the design phases for execution on the ground.

Other projects are being progressed in the areas at either the design or construction stage. These Connectivity and Permeability improvements are being delivered in cooperation with our Operations Department. These projects will enhance local communities and provide improved walking and cycling infrastructure within the county.

Greenway connectivity support teams have been convened to review, design, and deliver active travel infrastructure that will enhance accessibility between the proposed strategic greenways and residential, educational, amenity and commercial zones. These support projects have been set up for Fingal Coastal Way, Broadmeadow Way/Sutton to Malahide Greenway and Royal Canal Greenway. This will help to optimise the use of the proposed greenway by both leisure and commuter users.

Newtown Bridge, Balheary Road:

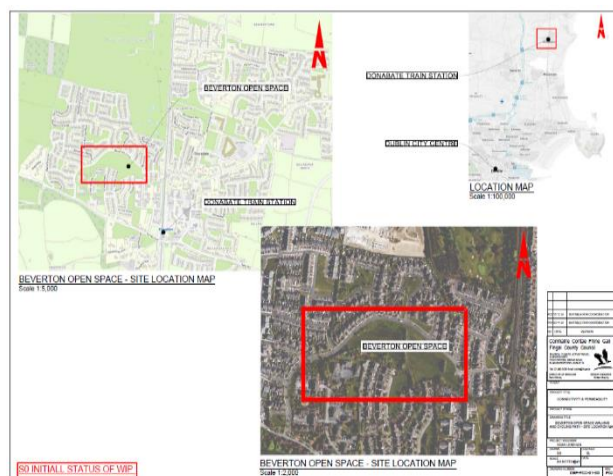
Snag items along the route have been reviewed and will be addressed by the appropriate contractor in Q1 2026.



Donabate Permeability - Phase 1:

This project involved the provision of a walking and cycling path in Beverton Open Space. The footpaths from the end of the cul de sacs in Turvey Green, Turvey Drive and Turvey Woods will be extended into the Beverton open space to join the new pathway being provided in the green open space.

Works have been substantially completed in 2025 with some minor snagging works outstanding. These will be completed early 2026. The pathways are open to the public and the initial usage of the facilities has been very high.



Seapark Hill Active Travel Project

The project is currently in the detailed design phase. Final design elements from disciplines within the integrated design team are being incorporated into the design and the design team will begin drafting the tender documents in early 2026.

Broomfield to Paddy's Hill

The extent of the scheme and various other constraints are under consideration at present by Fingal County Council.



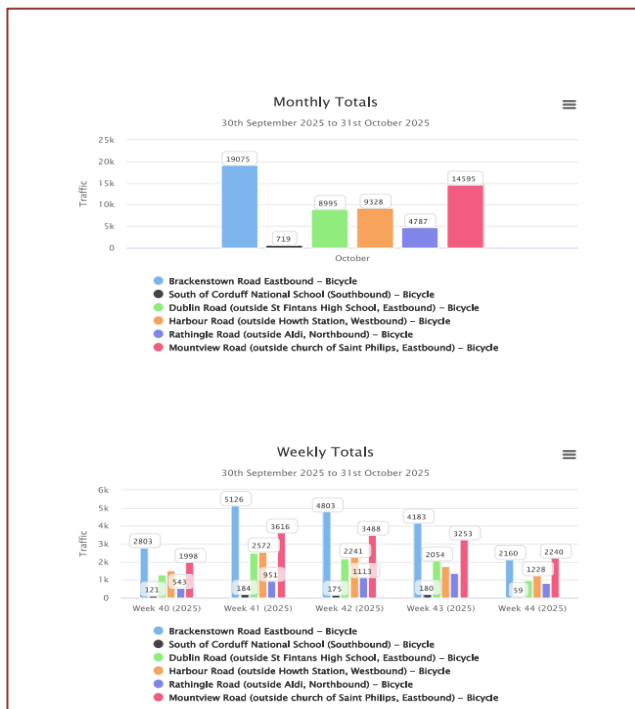
Secure Bicycle Parking Infrastructure

A number of locations across the Dublin 15 area have been identified for the provision of bicycle parking infrastructure. The project team have appointed a contractor and will progress to the Construction Stage in Q1 2026.

Data Collection:

The Active Travel unit carries out Data Collection as part of the design process on all our projects. This helps inform the project teams about what is required in terms of the needs of all road users when introducing Active Travel infrastructure.

Separately from this, we conduct further Data Collection to inform us about how the new infrastructure is being used and the number of people using it. Here we can see some positive feedback from the data we have collected and collated to date on some of our schemes.



Safe Routes to School Round 3

Round 3 of the Fingal Safe Routes to School programme includes the following seven schools:

- Broadmeadow Community National School (CNS)
- Donabate Portrane Educate Together National School (ETNS)
- Holywell Educate Together National School (ETNS)
- Malahide/Portmarnock Educate Together National School (ETNS)
- Scoil Mhuire Junior
- Scoil Thomáis
- St Nicholas of Myra National School, Kinsealy

The programme is currently in the early engagement phase, with An Taisce working closely with each school to develop outline delivery plans tailored to local needs. All delivery plans have been received and the tender for a design consultant should be live in January.

Road Safety:

Safe Routes to School Round 2

The included schools are:

- St Helen's SNS, Limetree Avenue, Portmarnock, Co. Dublin
- Scoil Bhríde, Cailíní & Buachaillí, Church Avenue, Blanchardstown, Dublin 15
- St Colmcille's Girls NS, Chapel Lane, Swords, Co. Dublin
- Holy Family JNS, Forest Fields, Swords, Co. Dublin

Preliminary designs for all schools have been completed, and online consultations closed on 29th November. We are currently reviewing the section 38 Non-Statutory Public Consultation Reports. Once the Section 38 reports are finalised, the detailed design phase will commence immediately, marking a significant step toward delivering safer and more sustainable travel routes for students across Fingal.

School Wardens:

Our school wardens continue to work across the county on a daily basis.

Fingal Road Safety Working Together group

The Fingal Road Safety Working Together group is now well established and meets on a quarterly basis. The group has members from An Garda Síochána, Elected members, The National Transport Authority, Transport Infrastructure Ireland, Dublin Airport Authority and Dublin Fire Service. The meet aims to give an opportunity for all stakeholders to coordinate on road safety within Fingal.

Fingal Road Safety Action Plan 2025 to 2027

Fingal Road Safety Action Plan 2025 to 2027 has now been fully drafted and reviewed by the Fingal Road Safety Working Together Group and was brought to SPC in December. The next step is to bring it to the Area Committee meetings in January and full council early in February for ahead of publication.

Mobility & Behavioural Change

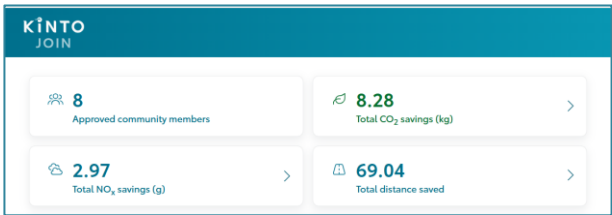
Learn2Cycle with a Disability

In 2025 we completed over 40 Learn2Cycle with a Disability courses across the County. The feedback and progress from the lessons has been amazing to see. A full list of courses for 2026 will be published in early January 2026.



Kinto Join – Sustainable Transport App

The Active Travel Unit in partnership with Corporate Services, People Services and Climate Action launched the Kinto Join Sustainable Travel App for Staff in County Hall and Civic Offices in November. There are currently 25 members across both communities. A webinar will be planned for the middle of January to help staff navigate the app and answer any questions they may have. The Communities are only available for staff who sign up using their Fingal email address and will help our organisation become a greener, more sustainable and healthier one as we rollout the app to staff. Below is a summary from The Civic Offices Community in week 1 of the app going live. As the communities build, we will be able to see our monthly CO2, NO2 and KM travelled savings across the two buildings.



Healthy Steps Projects

Working in partnership with our colleagues in Healthy Fingal, the Healthy Steps Walking Groups ran very successfully in 2026, with walks in Balbriggan, Millennium Park and Donabate. The walks are led by trained walk leaders, and participants can be GP-referred or self-referred to use exercise as a way of combating illness. The Castleknock Ramblers Walking Group

The Castleknock Ramblers Group meet every Tuesday morning at the Castleknock Gate in the Phoenix Park. The group is a mix of men and women of all ages and they walk for approx. 45min – 60mins per week. Everyone can go at their own pace and complete as long a walk as they like. The walks are a great chance to meet people, get some exercise and enjoy the fresh air and chats. The January Walk Dates are as follows:

The Fingal Second Spin Project

Since launching last month, The Second Spin scheme has delivered 8 bikes to teens who have been the victim of bike theft. The project is being run in conjunction with the Rediscovery Centre in Ballymun and as part of the project we provide teens who have experienced bike theft with an upcycled second hand bike free of charge. The scheme promotes the continuation of Active Travel for victims of bike theft while also helping to promote the circular economy by given older bikes a new lease of life.

The 'Second Spin' project recognises the emotional and practical impact that being a victim of bike theft places on a teenager and aims to give them back their independence while also giving older bikes a chance to be restored to their former glory.



The pilot project aims to repair and renew bikes that have been abandoned or donated and while they may not be a new bike, they will give Teenagers an opportunity to continue cycling. Participants will also have the option to re-donate their bike back to the scheme should they ever decide to purchase a new bike again.

Cycling Without Age

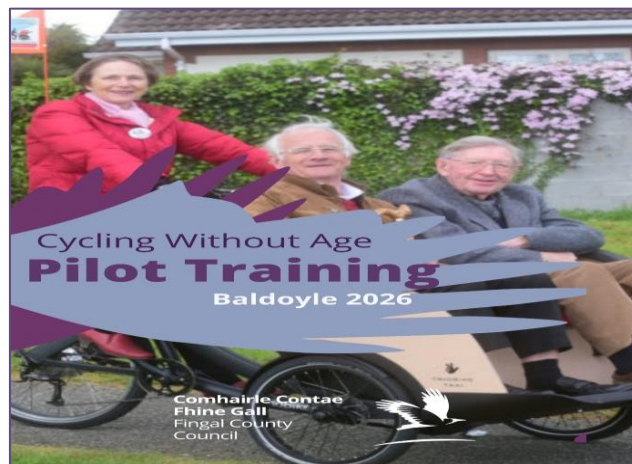

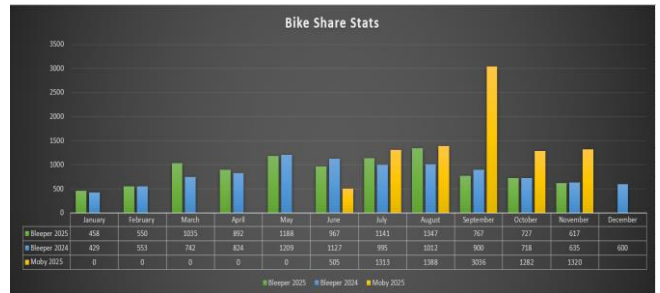

Bike Share Schemes



We will have completed over 20,000 bike share journeys in Fingal in 2025. While this may appear like a decrease compared to previous years, it is important to remember, we didn't have an eBike Operator for the first 6 months of the year and we drastically reduced the pedal bike service in Dublin 15 from April due to vandalism. We would expect Bike Share trips to increase with a full year of operating in 2026.

Moby Bikes in Fingal

Moby had another good month in Dublin 15 for October, completing 1,282 Bike Share journeys. There were no reports of vandalism on Moby Bikes in November.

Bleeper Bike

The Bleeper Bike Scheme continued to provide a valuable form of public transport throughout November. The Fingal Pass continues to grow in usage. Our new Explore Fingal advertising campaign was launched in early December 2025.



The service around the Dublin 15 operating zone has continued to grow since being reintroduced over the last number of months. Prior to the suspending of services, we were on track to have our most popular year of Bleeper Bike usage in the County. We are looking forward to growing further in 2026.



The Fingal Pass gives residents of Fingal their first 30 minutes of every Bleeper trip for free and continues to have a positive impact both in Fingal and the wider operating area. By providing Fingal residents with free bike share across the city, we are encouraging a long-lasting modal shift away from the private car.

Bleeper Bike Monthly Report

342 Bleeper bike journeys started within Fingal operating zone in November

4th Year TUD Geospatial Science SDG Project

The Climate Action Team are working in collaboration with 4th year TUD Geospatial Science students. Students are tasked with reviewing data available on the Fingal Climate Action Story Map and developing a new way to display the Councils work on the Sustainable Development Goals. The Climate Action team will be hearing student’s proposals in mid-December. The CAT attend presentations from the UED student on final project report.

Home Energy Savings Clinics

Two Home Energy Savings Clinics were held for staff in Blanchardstown and Swords. Home Energy Savings Kits have been made available to staff.



Balbriggan Decarbonisation Zone

Planning work is progressing the development of the methodology and scope of works for the preparation of the Balbriggan DZ Implementation Plan. Work will commence in early 2026.

The Climate Action Team has promoted and attended Local Authority Climate Action Webinar series provided by LASNTG.



Our Balbriggan- Sustainability, Climate Action and Biodiversity Pillar

On 3rd Dec the Climate Team presented to the Our Balbriggan Leadership and Pillar Members Plenary Session on the development of the Decarbonisation Zone Plan for Balbriggan. The Climate Team continue to support the implementation of the Sustainability, Climate Action and Biodiversity Pillar Action Plan.



CARO

The Climate Team continue to liaise with Dublin Metropolitan CARO and four Dublin Local Authorities to implement and monitor the actions contained in the Climate Action Plans.

Community Climate Action Fingal Grant

Round 2 call for applications of the Community Climate Action Grant closed on 22nd December. Over 70 community groups/ organisations and clubs submitted applications.

Eligible projects will be assessed in the coming weeks. Projects must reduce carbon emissions such as upgrading building insulation, doors and windows, heating, fitting solar panels/ heat pump, composting food waste, new recycling bins, planting trees and increasing biodiversity. The maximum grant for any individual application is €100k.

Applicants from Round 1 grant continue to deliver climate measures in the community setting. These include a new pool cover for Portmarnock Sports and Leisure Club, which will lead to significant energy savings and lower emissions.

Climate Action Awareness



**Let's make Fingal
Disposable Cup Free!**

The 6-month pilot 'Fingal Reusable Cup Project' concluded in Malahide and Rush on 17th November. The aim of the project is to significantly reduce and potentially eliminate single use cups within these locations with the anticipation of rolling this out across Fingal in the future. A total of 18 businesses signed up to participate in the project – 12 in Malahide and 6 in Rush.

There was a relatively poor uptake on the 'tap to borrow' reusable cup system with only 338 cups borrowed over the duration of the pilot.

In positive news, some businesses reported an increase of over 60% of customers choosing to bring their own reusable cups.

The pilot is currently being reviewed with the intention of continuing the Fingal Reusable Cup Project in 2026 by adapting alternative approaches to ensure success.

ENVIRONMENT

Environmental Awareness:

Environmental Awareness and Climate Action Newsletter

A December edition of the newsletter was circulated to schools, community groups and elected officials. This issue showcased recent highlights from the Environmental Awareness and Climate Action team and provided practical advice for celebrating a Green Christmas including tips on reducing waste, sustainable gift ideas, and energy-saving practices during the festive season. It also featured resources on waste management for the Christmas period, helping households manage packaging, food waste, and decorations responsibly. These tips have been shared widely on the Environmental Awareness webpage to ensure maximum reach.

Recycled Christmas Decoration Competition – Winners Announced

Our first Recycled Christmas Tree Decoration Competition was a huge success, highlighting the creativity and environmental awareness of local primary school students. The winners for 2025 were: St. Francis Xavier Senior School, Old Borough National School, St. Helen's Senior National School, and Burrow National School. From toilet rolls to lightbulbs, the students turned everyday items into festive masterpieces which adorned the Christmas tree in County Hall, Swords. Prizes included biodiversity book bundles, colouring books, GIY grow boxes & more. Huge congratulations to every student who took part and who have proven that creativity and sustainability go hand in hand.



Replay Instruments Project

This month the Replay Instruments Project successfully rehomed a variety of musical instruments (2 bodhrans, 4 keyboards, 2 cellos, 3 violins, 5 guitars and 1 ukelele) to 5 different groups. This initiative continues to support the circular economy and promotes access to music education while reducing waste.

Tenant Induction Course

The Environmental Awareness Officer delivered an informative segment on domestic waste management, with a particular focus on food waste reduction in the lead-up to Christmas. Kitchen caddies were distributed to attendees to encourage food waste composting, reinforcing Fingal's commitment to sustainability at home.

Social Media Campaign

December's social media campaigns promoted in-house sustainable Christmas tips, encouraging residents to reduce waste and energy use during the festive season. Messaging also included ERP guidance on managing Christmas WEEE waste, reminding the public to recycle electrical items and batteries responsibly.



Litter Management

The Litter Wardens continue to deal with large amounts of littering and dumping throughout the county.



- Bring banks in the Fingal area are inspected daily to ensure that there is no dumping, and any evidence found is dealt with under the Litter Pollution Act



- The litter wardens link in with Operations to see if any issues have arisen for their crews regarding illegal dumping/littering in their areas, carry out inspections and follow up with fines/warning notices where evidence is found.

- The litter management section reports any dumping and littering to Operations division for removal and follow up on witness statements submitted by Fingal citizens.

- Site inspections are carried out following reports of muck on the roads from building developments and farming activities. Site/Farm owners are advised of their responsibilities to ensure the roads are kept clean of muck and that the building sites have a road sweeper/wheel wash facility in operation.



- The litter wardens continue to raise awareness on the issue of dog fouling on beaches, pathways, parks and roads and target hot spots for dog fouling. Anti dog fouling signs are erected at various locations on foot of requests made and where complaints are received.
- They Investigate and report on reports of abandoned cars, photographing and updating the litter app and the D365 system.
- They conduct walking patrols and engage with business owners regarding their responsibilities in keeping outside their premises clean and free of litter.
- The Litter Management Section have commenced preparation for an ongoing Litter Awareness Campaign to continue over the 3-year period of the Litter Management Plan and will look at addressing ongoing issues such as illegal dumping/fly-tipping, dog fouling, unauthorised signage, cigarette butts/disposable vapes, muck on the road etc. The Campaign will focus on increasing litter awareness with the public through the various platforms to include the Councils Social Media Platforms, Bus Shelters, Libraries, Community Centres, schools and any other viable sources.

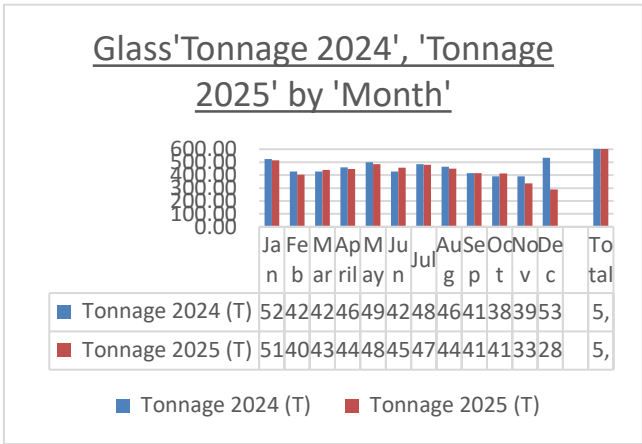

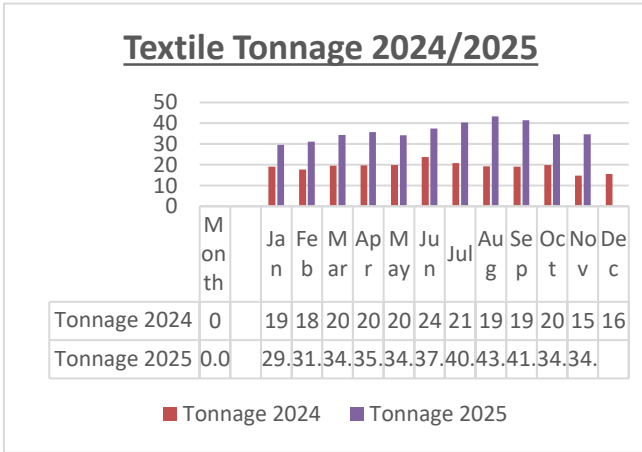

Animal Welfare

Dog Warden Service

The dog wardens continue to carry out enforcement in relation to breaches of the Control of Dogs Act 1986, Control of Dog Regulations 1998, Parks and Open Spaces byelaws and Beach and Foreshore byelaws. They also educate dog owners on the responsibilities of keeping a dog and remind owners to pick up after their pets when in public places. Dog owners should ensure that they hold a valid licence for their dog and if issued with a 10-day notice by the dog wardens, should present their licence to controlofdogs@fingal.ie within the 10 days provided on the notice. Failure to do so may result in a fine being issued for failing to produce a dog licence when requested to do so by a dog warden and keeping a dog without a valid licence. Over the summer months the dog wardens will increase their patrols on the beaches and in the parks.

There were 81 x 10 Day Notices and 4 Fines issued by the dog wardens to the up to the 18th of December 2025.

Dog Licences

An annual dog licence fee is €20, and a lifetime dog licence fee is €140. We will continue to promote the requirement for a dog licence on social media platforms. It is a legal requirement to hold a valid licence for any dog you own or are responsible for under the Control of Dogs Act 1986. Failing to hold a valid licence for a dog that you are own or are responsible for can incur a fine.

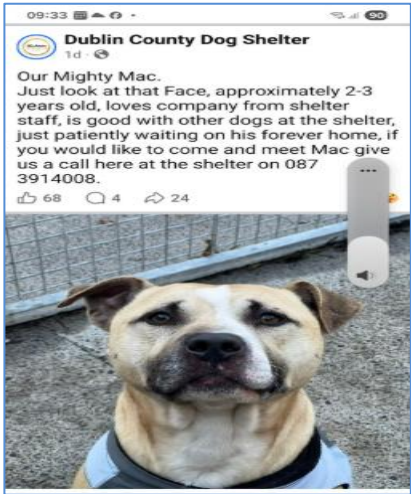
We will continue to advertise the requirement for dog owners to hold a licence for their dogs on social media platforms.

Dog Shelter Service

Dublin County Dog Shelter holds “Meet and Greet” visits for anyone looking to rehome a dog. Visits can be arranged by calling the shelter and arranging an appointment.

These visits can be arranged from Monday – Friday from 11am to 1pm and from 2pm to 3.30pm. The shelter is also open on Saturday from 11am – 1pm. The shelter is closed to the public on Sundays. The dog shelter holds stray dogs picked up by the dog warden and dogs who have been surrendered by their owners either to the dog wardens or directly to the shelter. At the beginning of November there were 14 dogs in the shelter. Up to 17th December, 4 dogs were brought to the shelter by the dog wardens as stray or surrenders and 1 was surrendered by members of the public. Of these 19 dogs 0 were reclaimed, 5 were rehomed to Rescue, 1 was rehomed to members of the public and 1 was PTS. As of 17th of December 2025 there were 12 dogs remaining in the shelter. The shelter has a Facebook page Dublin County Dog Shelter and Instagram Account @dublincountydogshelter which they actively update with strays and dogs wishing to be rehomed.

Waste Presentation Bye-Laws Project

Following 4000 households suspected of not being compliant with Fingal County Councils Waste Presentation Bye-Laws asked to prove compliance, follow-up work has begun. To date, approximately 3,700 households have responded to the project. The remaining households will be inspected in the new year. There are a number of follow-up activities as follows:

- A minimum of 433 households that did not engage with the project, which will be subject to enforcement action such as a Fixed Payment Notice or prosecution.
- There were 528 households declared as vacant which will be inspected to verify the accuracy of this figure.
- Households that make use of authorised facilities but did not provide sufficient information (e.g. all waste streams brought to Coolmine/Estuary centres which do not accept Brown/Black bin waste) will be requested to outline where each waste stream is disposed of.

Hazardous waste:

All sectors in Ireland generate Hazardous waste. Hazardous Waste is classified as having the potential to cause harm to human health or the environment. because it is explosive, oxidising, flammable, irritant, toxic, carcinogenic, corrosive, infectious, mutagenic, sensitising, or eco-toxic.

The legislation is implemented in Ireland by the Waste Management Act 1996 as amended, with the local authorities having a role in enforcing this. Inspections are carried out at premises that produce hazardous waste in order to validate that this waste is disposed of in a legally compliant manner.



During the year, 18 Hazardous waste inspections were undertaken, with only 2 non - compliant premises. These premises targeted for inspection were based on local knowledge and complaints such as oil spills/dumping

Construction & Demolition

Site inspections are carried out at developments in Fingal to ensure Construction and Demolition waste is handled in a legally compliant manner. This includes developments such as Major Public Projects (MPP) and Strategic Housing Developments (SHD) as well as smaller developments. As part of the planning application stages of the development, a Resource Waste Management Plan (RWMP) is submitted and reviewed prior to works starting. This sets out how the developer will manage C&D waste streams throughout the project. By carrying out C&D inspections, we can verify that they are following their RWMP. The inspections assess the following:

- Various waste types generated
- How they are segregated, stored and transported
- The destination facility for waste
- If soil & stone is handled under Article 27 as a National By-Product



Two inspections were completed this month, one Large Residential Development (LRD), found compliant and one smaller residential site containing 57 units which was found non-compliant. Throughout the year, 4 out of 14 sites inspected were deemed non-compliant, one for crushing concrete on-site without valid waste authorisation and the other three for poor segregation of C&D waste &/or for failing to provide a three-bin system to allow for segregation of canteen/office waste. Recommendations were forwarded on to the developer, post-inspection, to allow for improvements to be made.



Water Quality

National Agriculture Inspection Plan (NAIP)

Fingal County Council has achieved its NAIP inspection target of inspecting 74 farms in 2025. NAIP required that each farm was to be inspected to determine whether it is in compliance with the Good Agricultural Practice Regulations (GAP).

Of the 74 farms inspected, 56 farms were found to be compliant with the regs, 13 farms were classified as been non-compliant and afforded an a further opportunity to rectify the non-compliance, while 5 farms were classified as non-compliant and will be cross reported to the department who will determine whether or not the non-complaint operator is to be penalised.

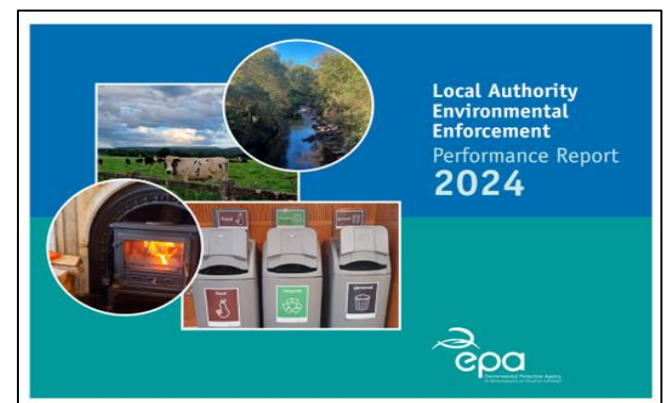
Fingal County Council also recently met with the Irish Farmers Association (IFA) who wished to meet and discuss Fingal's current approach to NAIP inspections. The IFA later submitted a proposed farm inspection protocol to FCC which FCC has considered and noted.

Air & Noise

EPA Local Authority Performance Report



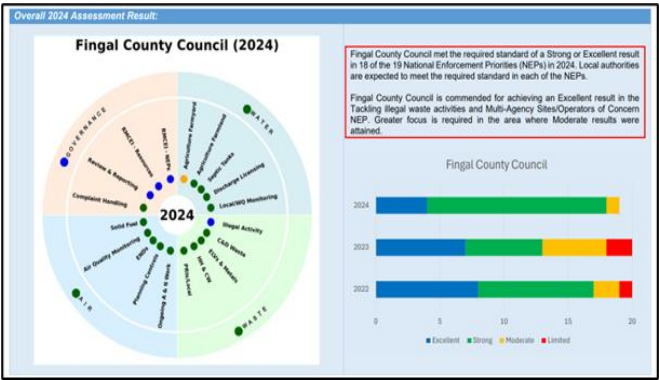
The EPA recently published the Local Authority Environmental Enforcement Performance Report for 2024. The assessment is based on the EPA's Local Authority Performance Framework, where local authority performance is measured and reported against the National Enforcement Priorities (NEPs) which have been set by the EPA to improve environmental compliance for waste, water, air and noise.

Fingal met all of the Air and Noise performance indicator requirements for 2024 and were scored by the EPA as **‘Strong’** in all 5 of these categories. This represents a significant improvement on the previous year, as Fingal did not meet any of the standards for the 5 Air and Noise performance indicators in 2023 due to significant resource issues.

Fingal County Council were 1 of only 6 local authorities who met the High Performance standard set by the EPA for 2024. Link below:

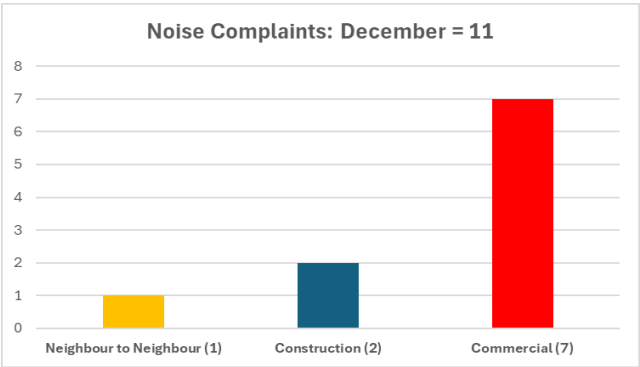

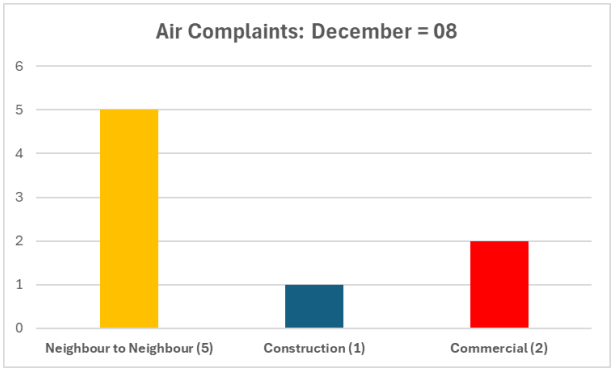


Air & Noise Complaints

A total of no. **11 noise complaints** were received and investigated during December. Complaints were received regarding neighbour-to-neighbour noise, construction site noise and noise associated with commercial activities.



A total of **8 no. air complaints** were received and investigated during December and these included complaints regarding construction dust, neighbour-to-neighbour air pollution issues and complaints about emissions from commercial and industrial units.



The majority of these complaints have been resolved, with investigations ongoing to resolve the remaining open complaints.

Planning Files

The Air and Noise Section have reviewed **182 no. Planning Applications** referred by the Planning Department for the year to date. Applications are assessed against the latest Strategic Noise Maps for Fingal to ensure that any proposed developments, and particularly residential developments, will not be adversely affected by road, rail, industrial or aircraft noise.



A total of **101 no. Planning Compliance Submissions** have been reviewed for compliance with air and noise related planning conditions for the year to date. These submissions typically outline the mitigation measures that will be used to minimise the dust and noise impacts during the construction phase of a development.



Solvent Regulations (Dry Cleaner) Inspections

The Air and Noise team undertook 10 no. compliance inspections of dry cleaners/laundries this year, under the Solvent Regulations. All premises inspected were found to be compliant or were exempt from the legislation. The Air and Noise team continue to maintain the dry cleaner register, ensuring all relevant operators remain compliant.

Deco Paints Regulations (Vehicle Refinisher) Inspections

11 no. businesses carrying out vehicle refinishing (paint spraying) were inspected this year. Information regarding the registration requirements, process and obligations was shared with relevant operators. Of the 11 businesses inspected, 7 were confirmed to require registration. The Air and Noise team are continuing to engage with operators to ensure compliance. Most businesses requiring registration have engaged with third-party assessors to carry out technical/operational audits to progress their registration. The team is actively pursuing other non-compliant, unregistered businesses to ensure progress is made.



Solid Fuel Regulations – Retailer Inspections

Its solid fuel burning season. Inspections of solid fuel retailers were conducted across November and December. 18 no. premises have been inspected to date to determine compliance with the Solid Fuel Regulations. Follow-up letters regarding the outcome of the inspections have been issued to relevant retailers to inform them of any non-compliances and improve awareness. The team have also issued letters to other retailers (yet to be inspected) to improve awareness of the regulations and retailer obligations. We are sharing DECC'S 'Let's Clear the Air' campaign on Fingal County Councils social media for the month of December to highlight the health impacts of solid fuel burning and promote compliance with the 2022 Solid Fuel Regulations during the 2025/2026 heating season. In November, an online review was carried out to identify potential instances of unapproved fuel sales & unregistered operators.



The team intends on continuing solid fuels work into Q1 2026.

SPORTS OFFICE

Ice-skating

Our Active Cities Dublin Coordinator engaged with our operations department to secure six complimentary 1-hour slots for us to engage with various community stakeholders. To organise 6 events the Sports Office and Community office collaborated to identify community groups and linked in with primary schools, secondary schools, disability services, IPAS centres and Youth Services.



Weekly Programme wrap up

The Fingal Sport Office core programmes wrapped up this month on a high note, with over 20 weekly sessions bringing thousands together across the year. From parent and toddler to Active for Life, every age and ability was included — a true celebration of community, connection, and wellbeing



Disability in Sport Week

We proudly took part in the first National Disability in Sport Week, showcasing the inclusive work happening across the county. During the week, we announced our commitment to achieving the Active Disability Ireland Bronze Award, further strengthening our dedication to accessibility in sport and physical activity. Staff also represented Fingal at a National Conference, joining the wider celebration of inclusivity in sport.



First Programmes in New Community Centre

We hosted our first programmes in the brand-new Baldoyle Racecourse Park Community Centre, giving local residents the chance to attend free sessions and explore the impressive new venue. The community response was overwhelmingly positive, with participants delighted by the opportunity and eager for many more programmes in the year ahead.



Interservice Fingal FAI Blitz

December saw the final Fingal Interservice FAI Football for All blitz in conjunction with Dublin City Council for 2025. There were 12 teams across three pitches in DCU with participants playing several games across the morning.

This programme has grown over the last year and has become a staple part of the services calendar.



Boccia Blitz

The Fingal Interservice Boccia Blitz came to a close for 2026, each month, disability services came together for a Boccia Blitz in Alsaa, three services were presented with awards in December for their outstanding commitment and dedication to the programme.



Fingal Sports Awards 2026 – 3rd December 2025

Fingal County Council, through the Fingal Sports Office, officially launched the **Sports Club Volunteer Awards 2026** and **the Sports Clubs of the Year Awards 2026**, recognising and celebrating outstanding commitment, contribution, and achievement across the sporting community in Fingal.

The awards ceremony will take place on **Monday, 26th January 2026 at the Carlton Hotel, Dublin Airport**, where volunteers and clubs will gather for a special evening dedicated to acknowledging their invaluable role in supporting and advancing local sport.

Sports Equipment Grants 2025

2025 was the first year for the Fingal Sports Office to offer dedicated Sports Equipment Grants for local clubs. Over local 44 clubs applied and were successful in being awarded a total of €188807.

These grants were offered as two specific fund strands. An Essential Sports Equipment Grant which covered day-to-day equipment, such as balls, bibs and rackets, items were not eligible under previous funding schemes. The maximum amount allowed under the Essential Sports Grant was €1500 and can be applied for every year. The second strand, the Large Sports Equipment Grant allowed for major purchases of €4000, clubs could apply for this funding every second year. Both grants are aimed at supporting enhanced training and participation.

FAI Football Development Officers

The Football Association of Ireland (FAI) has formally notified Fingal County Council that:

- There will be **no funding for Football Development Officers in Fingal for 2026.**
- The **FAI x FCC Transition Year (TY) Programme will cease upon completion in May 2026.**

These changes will significantly impact football development initiatives across the county, including grassroots participation, coach education, and school engagement.

Current Situation

Fingal currently benefits from dedicated Football Development Officers funded through FAI resources. The TY Programme has provided structured football education and engagement for secondary school students.

Both initiatives have contributed to increased participation and community engagement in football.

Implications

Loss of dedicated development officers may reduce: Support for local clubs and schools & delivery of coaching courses and player development pathways.

Discontinuation of TY Programme removes a key engagement tool for youth football.

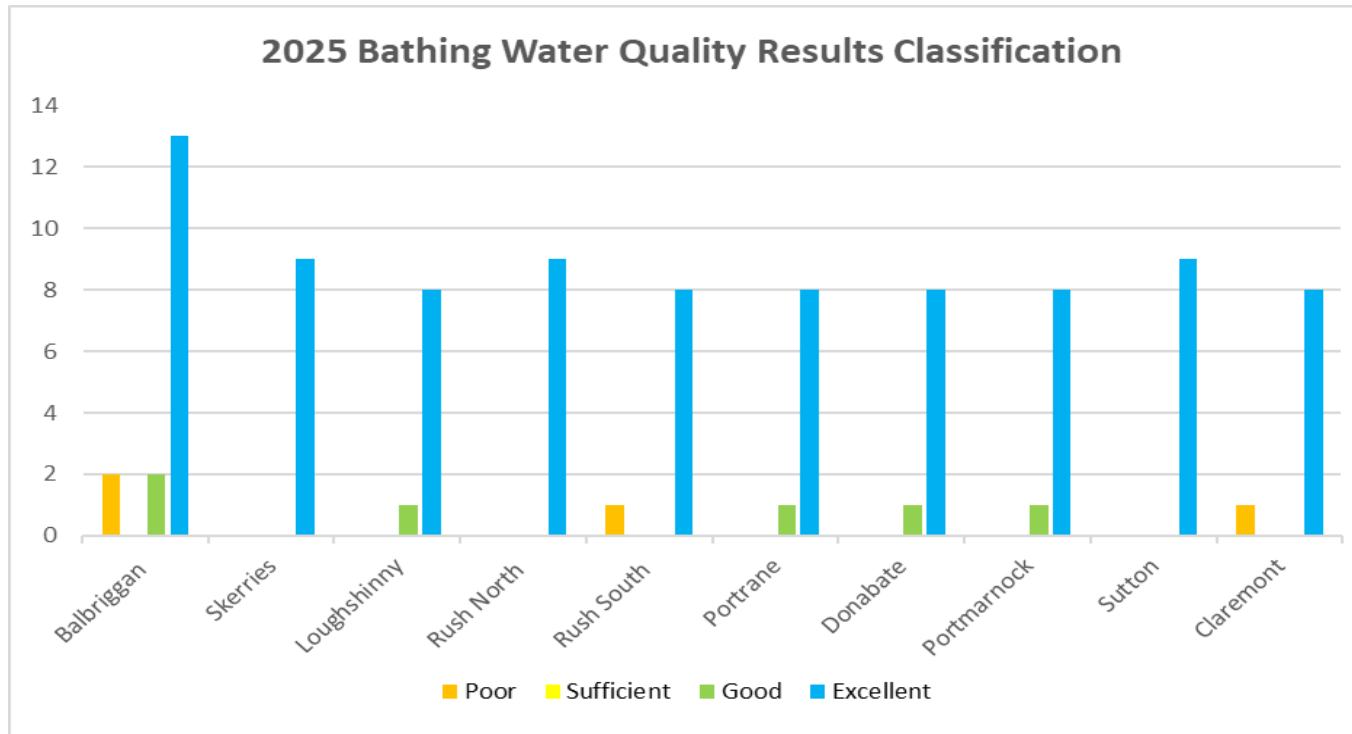
