



ROADS ACT 1993 TO 2023 – SECTION 75

PROPOSED TEMPORARY CLOSURE OF STATION ROAD, LUSK, CO. DUBLIN

An application has been received from Fajon Construction for permission to temporarily close **Station Road, Lusk, Co. Dublin** to facilitate the installation of a storm water line. It is proposed that the road will be **closed from the 15th of June 2026 to the 3rd of July 2026 for 24 hours.**

Permitted working hours shall be between **08:00hrs and 19:00hrs.**

No works shall take place on weekends and Bank Holidays.

Alternative routes available for vehicular traffic are as follows:

Traffic Traveling from Dublin Road North – Diverted traffic to L1401 Main Street / Skerries Road, turn right onto R127 (Skerries Road roundabout) and keep straight on to Raheny roundabout to reach Remount roundabout (closure point).

Traffic traveling from Dublin Road South – Keep straight onto Dublin Road, turn left onto Dublin Road roundabout to R127 Rathmore Road, keep straight up to Remount Roundabout (closure point).

Traffic traveling from R127 Rathmore Road North – Diverted traffic straight onto Remount roundabout, keep straight onto R127 Raheny roundabout, turn left onto R127 (Skerries Road roundabout), keep straight onto L1401 Skerries Road / Main Street to reach Station Road (closure point).

Advance signage will inform traffic of the diversion route and road closure.

Local access will be maintained at all times. Emergency services access will also be made available in the event of an emergency.
